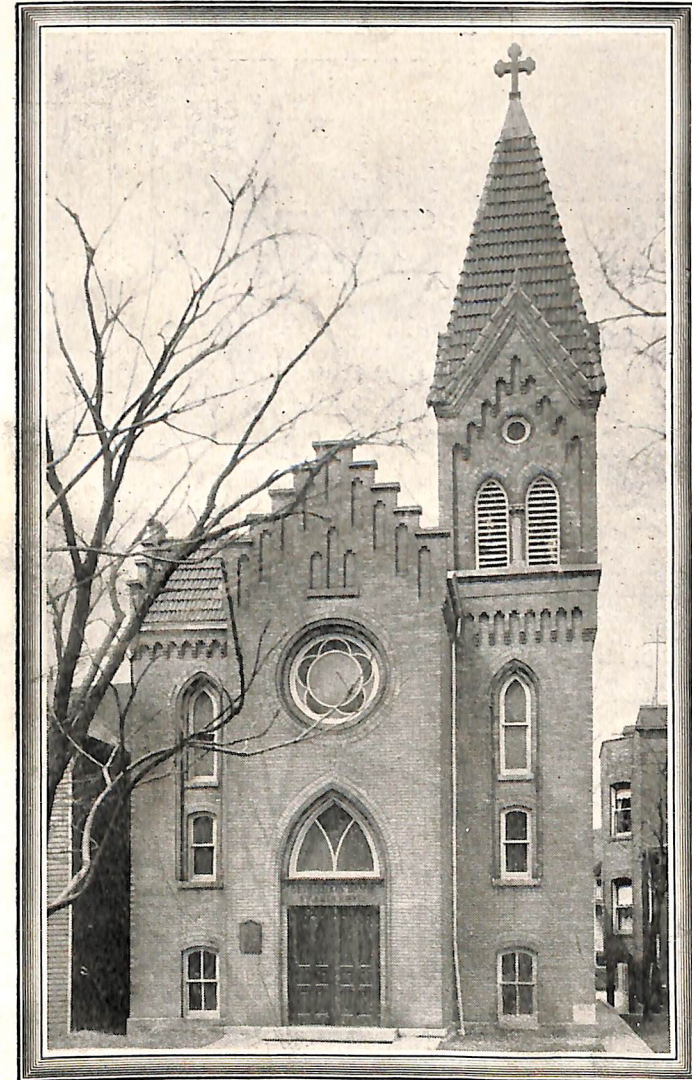

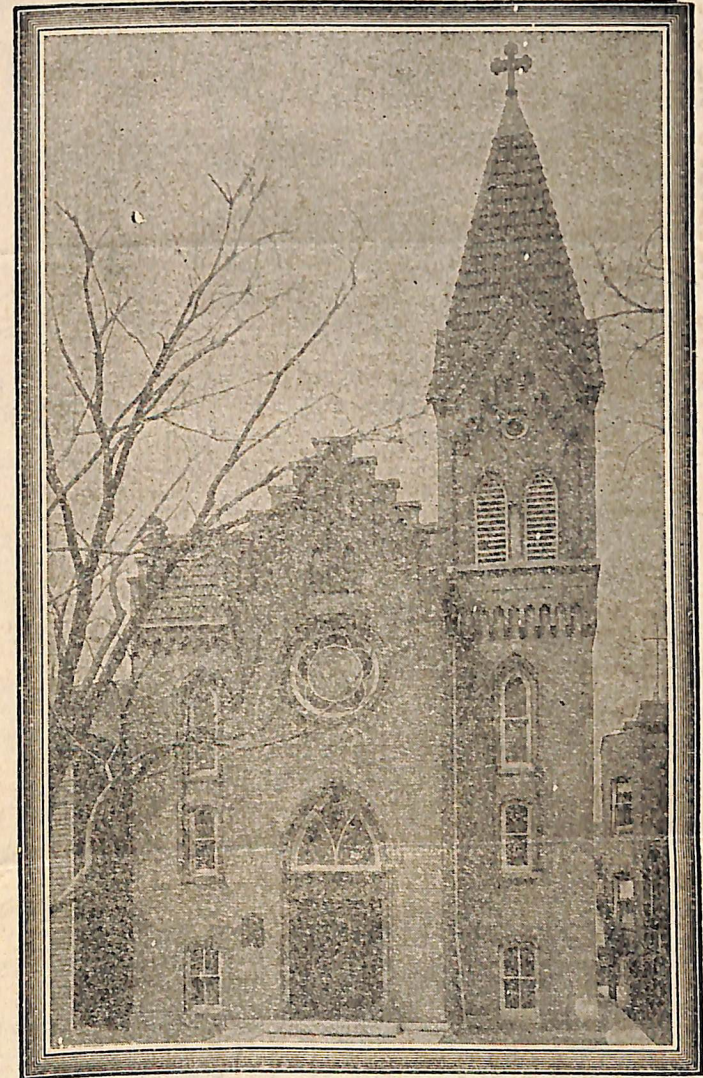

It is they who have made American education what it is, both in content and method; in content, an indoctrination of positivism and naturalism; in method, an exhibition of anarchic individualism masquerading as the democratic manner. Whether Hitler wins or not, the culture which is formed by such education cannot support what democracy we have against interior decay."

President W. O. Thompson, of Ohio State University, says:

"I am in no way untrue to state institutions when I say that in our day a boy might earn a bachelor's or master's degree in almost any one of the best of them and be as ignorant of the Bible, the moral and spiritual truth which it represents, and the fundamental principles of religion, their nature and value to society, as if he had been educated in a non-Christian country. Who is to supply this lack if not the Christian college?"

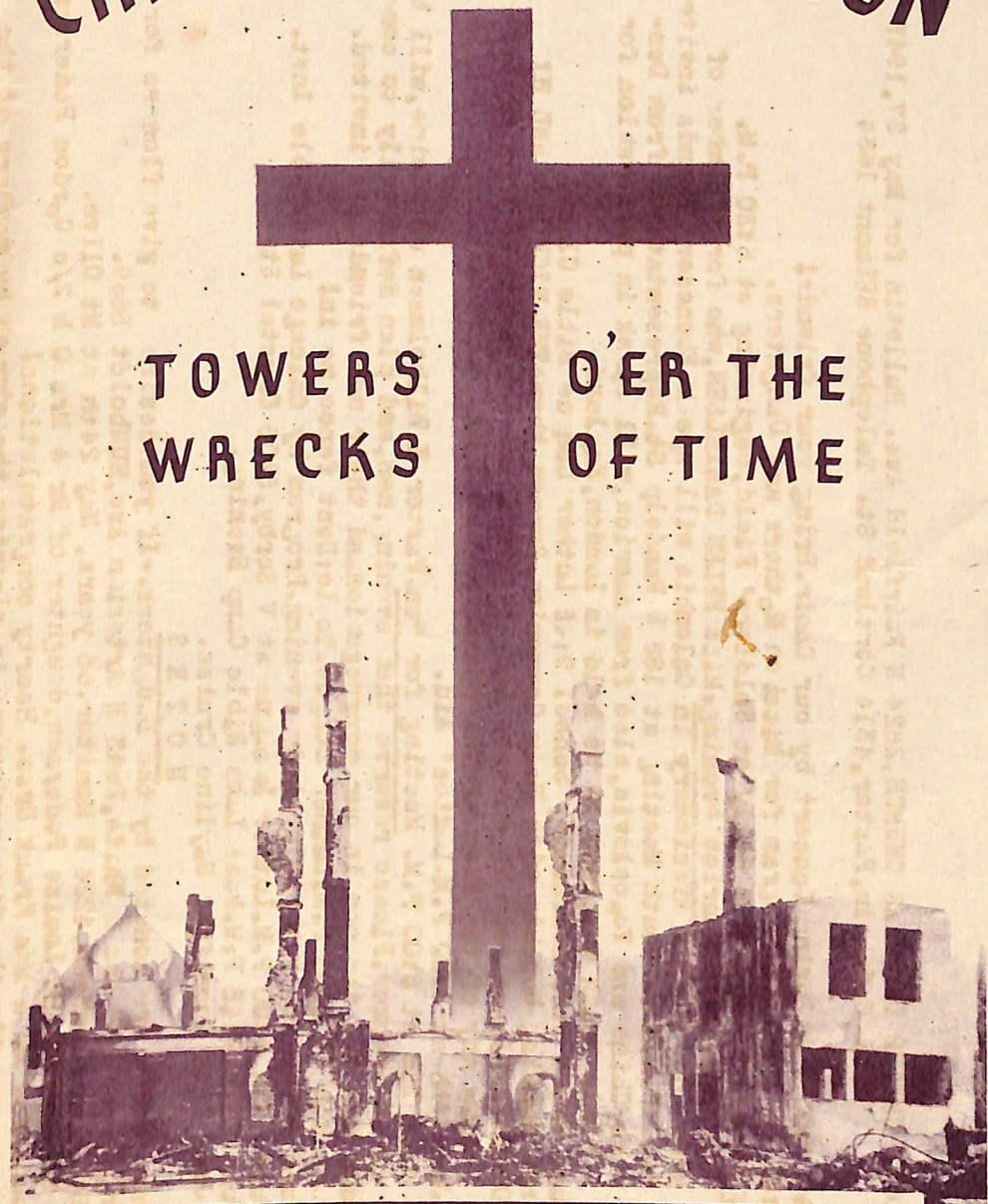

A THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK Worry comes through human interference with the divine plan.
