## PASTOR'S LETTER OF RESIGNATION

August 21, 1960

Immanuel Lutheran Church Racine, Wisconsin

Dear Members of Immanuel Lutheran Church: Grace and peace through our Lord Jesus Christ!

After prayerful consideration and in following God's guidance, I hereby tender my resignation as pastor of Immanuel Lutheran Church in Racine. Since the constitution of Immanuel Lutheran Congregation requires that the pastor shall not leave until three months after his resignation, this resignation shall be effective after Sunday, November 13th, 1960, and I shall plan to move from the parish on November 14th or 15th.

I am tendering my resignation in accordance with the agreement that the present pastors of Immanuel and Bethesda Lutheran churches leave the parishes since the two congregations have voted to enter a merger to form one congregation. My resignation is being submitted at this time in order that I may accept a call to become the pastor of the Vernon Evangelical Lutheran Church, which is in the process of relocating to a new site just outside Mukwonago, Wisconsin, as a new home mission under the sponsorship of the Home Mission Board of the Evangelical Lutheran Church.

I am grateful to Almighty God for His many blessings throughout the years of my ministry in your midst and pray that God in His grace through Christ will lead you in the days and years ahead that His will may be accomplished.
