FUNERALS:

Robert J. Andreasen, son of Jakob Andreasen and Ana Else Juleusen, was born in Omaha on June 30 1886, was reared in the Kennard community, and was married to Miss Mary Hansen on December 19, 1906. The couple was engaged in farming for a great part of their married life, and lived in or near Blair for about 20 years. Mr. Andreasen was ill for several years, and passed away at his home on Center Street on December 27, 1956. The funeral service was held in the church on December 30, with burial in Blair Cemetery. Mr. and Mrs. Andreasen were the parents of three children, all of whom survive. They are: Orville of Walthill, Nebraska, Opal (Mrs. William Thurber) of Omaha; and Ruth (Mrs. Richard McKain) of Omaha. Eight grandchildren and three great grandchildren (a fourth has been born since Mr. Andreasen's passing) survive, as do three brothers, Fritz of Kennard, Arthur of Lyons, and Elmer of Kennard, and two sisters, Mrs. Emma Sorensen and Mrs. Elvina Kempcke of Blair. Mr. Andreasen was preceded in death by two sisters: Anna (Mrs. A. P. Sontum), Laura (Mrs. Martin Bertelsen) and one brother Charles. He and Mrs. Andreasen observed their 50th wedding anniversary on December 19, 8 days previous to his passing.

Albert Martin Jensen Schjodt was born on April 21, 1892, in Jutland, Denmark, came to America in 1915, and was married to Miss Marie Hansen of Blair on March 27, 1918. Their married life was spent on a farm west of Blair, except for about a year of residence at Fremont, Nebraska. Mrs. Schjodt passed away on March 20, 1956. Mr. Schjodt had been ill for about 10 years previous to his passing at Good Shepherd Home on January 1, 1957, where he had lived about a year. He is survived by a son, Harold, of Blair; four daughters, Veola (Mrs. Clifford K. Hansen) of Blair; Eulella (Mrs. Hubert Petersen) of Fremont; Rose Marie (Mrs. John De La Castro) of Omaha; and Carol Lynne, who lives with her brother. Mrs. I. M. Hansen, christened Helena Nissen Johnson, was born March 28, 1875, Clay County, near Gayville, South Dakota, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Calle Hansen. She was educated near her childhood home, and at 17 years of age earned her teaching certificate from the Fremont, Nebraska, Normal School. After several years of teaching she was united in marriage with Reverend I. M. Hansen on May 5, 1900. Reverend Hansen served Siloam Lutheran Church in Chicago from about 1890 until 1905, in which year he and his family moved to Staplehurst, Nebraska, to serve our church there until 1919, in which year they moved to Blair. Rev. and Mrs. Hansen lived in Blair until 1938, when they went to Farmington, Minnesota, to live with their daughter, Della. Rev. Hansen passed away in 1939. Mrs. Hansen passed away in the hospital at Farmington on January 11, 1957, having been admitted to the hospital on Christmas Day. Services were held in Farmington on January 13, followed by brief services and burial here on January 14. Mrs. Hansen is survived by three children, Della (Mrs. Herman Olson) of Farmington; Carl, of South Da-

kota; Philip, of Denver, Colorado. A son passed away during the Hansens' pastorate at Staplehurst. Surviving Mrs. Hansen are a brother, Hans Johnson, and a sister, Mrs. Christine Hvistendahl, and three grandchildren.

Mrs. Anna Truhlsen Jensen, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Nels Truhlsen was born at Ft. Calhoun, Nebraska, on August 26, 1876. The family moved to Blair, where Mrs. Jensen received her education in the Gardner and West schools. On November 3, 1897, she was united in marriage with Nels M. Jensen, and the couple went to Pisgah, Iowa, for two years, where they farmed, returning then to the Soren Jensen homestead west of Blair. Here they farmed until 1909, when they moved to Blair, living here 8 years, returning again to the Soren Jensen farm, and remaining there until 1929, when they moved to Omaha. In 1941 they returned to Blair, and have lived on West Street, where Mrs. Jensen passed away on January 27, after an illness of 18 months. The funeral service was held in the church on January 30, with burial in Blair Cemetery. Mrs. Jensen is survived by her husband, and by all of her six children. They are Myrtle (Mrs. C. K. Ross) of Omaha; Mildred (Mrs. John Loomis) of Brookville, Ohio; Harold, of Blair; Alton of Blair; Dr. Marshall Jensen of Winter Park, Florida; Enid (Mrs. Merle Wardell) of Kennard. Eleven grandchildren and six great-grandchildren survive, as do two brothers, Henry Truhlsen of Herman, and Peter Truhlsen of Blair, and one sister, Lena (Mrs. Frank Siert) of Blair.
