**Other specific training:** He learned carpenter trade in Denmark and then went to Copenhagen for employment. Here came in contact with Inner Mission workers, Clausen and Wright and leading pastors who made use of his ability and willingness to assist in Sunday Schools and other Christian efforts. At this time the impulse to enter full time mission work entered his heart possibly on the foreign mission field. Then he heard of the mission group that sponsored church work among emigrated countrymen in America and con-

Additional comment on above: tacted members of same, offering his service. Realizing it a divine call he was encouraged to commence preparation under the directing of their board. He attended a school where candidates for the American mission were trained a while and then learned that the Danish Church in America had started a Seminary for training pastors at West Denmark, near Luck, W. s. he decided to emigrate and study over there. Having also found a fair lady in the capital city ~~XIII~~ and became engaged to her, she agreed with his plan and they travelled together across the ocean. She secured jobs and assisted him in continuing his education at the Seminary 1887-88. Attending the annual meeting of the synod, that established the institution, held in Elk Horn, Ia. (1888), the spirit of the assembly did not appeal to him and his fiancee. Then they applied for membership in the Blair Association and they were married next January each at Milltown where he had started a mission.

Anders Kirkegaard blev født den 4. Oktober 1860 i Harboøre, Vestjylland, hvor han ogsaa blev døbt, fik sin Undervisning i Almueskolen og blev konfirmeret i Sognekirken. I sin Ungdom lærte han Tømrerhaandværket, og paa samme Tid kom han under Paavirkning af den bekendte Pastor Carl Moe, der da var Præst i Harboøre, og ved hvis Virksamhed en stærk aandelig Vækelse i Indre Missions Retning brød frem der paa Egnen.

Siden kom Kirkegaard til København at arbejde

som Tømrersvend. Der kom han tillige i Forbindelse med Midnatsmissionærerne Clausen og Wright, samt forskellige Sognepræster, der var virksomme i Missionsarbejdet og gjorde Brug af ham baade i Søndagsskoler og som Missionær. Paa denne Tid begyndte Tanken om at blive Hedningemissionær at vaagne hos ham; men imidlertid blev han bekendt med, at der var en dansk Kirke i Amerika, og den havde et Udvalg blandt Præster der hjemme, som bl. a. hjalp dem til at faa Præster der over, som de trængte haardt til. Efter at have seet dette som et Kald fra Gud, samt være opmuntret af nogle Medlemmer af Udvælget, besluttede han sig til i København at begynde sin Uddannelse til Præst i Amerika under Udvalgets Vejledning.

I København var Kirkegaard bleven kendt med Jomfru Anine Johanne Christensen fra Langeland, med hvem han blev forlovet. Efter at have fuldendt sit Studium i København, rejste de begge med hinanden til Amerika i Aaret 1887. Her fortsatte han en kort Tid sit Studium paa „Den danske Kirkes“ Præsteskole i West Denmark, Wis. Næste Aar overværede baade han og hans Forlovede Kirkens Aarsmøde, men den Aand, der raadede der, tiltalte dem ikke, saa de bestemte sig til at slutte sig til „Det danske ev.-luth. Kirkesamfund.“

Den 23. Jan. 1889 fejrede de deres Bryllupsfest i Milltown, Wis., og ved Samfundets næste Aarsmøde i Hutchinson, Minn. blev Kirkegaard ordineret den 2. Juni 1889 af Formanden, Pastor G. B. Christiansen paa et Kald fra en Missionsmenighed i Milltown, Wis. som han havde oparbejdet i sin Studentertid. Her var han en kort Tid og modtog saa Kald fra

Hutchinson, Minn., hvor han var til 1891, da han flyttede til en Menighed ved Minden, Neb. Næste Aar blev han ved Kredsmødet i Hampton valgt til Kredsformand, og i de følgende Aar fik han snart flere Menigheder stiftet samt endnu flere Missionspladser begyndt paa disse aandeligt øde Egne i Vest-Nebraska. Da han havde poetiske Evner og var en dygtig Sanger, var han straks bleven valgt som Medlem af Komiteen til at samle og sørge for Udgivelsen af „Sangeren.“ Det var ikke altid saa lyse Tider derude i disse Dage, da Vejene ofte var lange og trænge, og Køretøjerne var tarvelige; Lønnen var kun lille, og Børneflokken voksede op til ni, hvoraf dog to døde i den spæde Alder, og siden mistede Sønnen Gerhard Livet i Frankrig under Verdenskrigen.

I 1894 flyttede Kirkegaards til Fremont, Nebr. Det var da jeg var Student paa vor Skole i Blair, og der mødte jeg ham første Gang ved et Studentermøde, hvor han holdt et Foredrag for os, som jeg ikke har glemt endnu. Han havde en sjælden Evne til at vække nye, friske Tanker ikke mindst hos os unge. Hans Forkyndelse var som Indre Missions i Danmark klar og tydelig Guds Ord til Omvendelse og Syndernes Forladelse uden Hensyn til Menneskers Behag, saa hans Prædikener syntes nogle forstrænge, medens de blev andre en Vejledning til et nyt Liv i Herrens Samfund.

Kirkegaards næste Arbejdsmark blev i Iowa, hvor han Aar 1898 begyndte i Latimer og flere omliggende Steder. Det havde sine Vanskeligheder at virke som Præst der, da den forenede Kirke var blevet stiftet, men ikke alle Medlemmer var af Hjertet forenede, saa delte Meninger kunde næppe undgaaes.

Efter nogle Aars Forløb (1907) flyttede Kirkegaard til Scranton, hvor han virkede i Herrens Tjeneste, til han i 1914 besluttede at rejse til Laurens, N. Y., hvor en dansk Koloni havde begyndt at danne sig. Der købte han sig et Hjem og begyndte straks at missionere blandt sine Landsmænd med det Resultat, at han næste Aar fik en Menighed stiftet, som han betjente til 1921, da han nedlagde sin Præstegering, men blev fremdeles boende i sit Hjem som emeritus. I Aaret 1934 fristede han den tunge Sorg, at Herren kaldte hans elskelige Hustru hjem til sig. Hun er omtalt her i Dansk Almanak 1935. Der blev saa tomt i Hjemmet, da hun var borte. Ofte var han en Tur nede at dvæle ved hendes Hvilested, ved Siden af hvilket han havde sit eget beredt. De sidste Aar var hans Helbred skrøbeligt, og de kolde Vintermaaneder tilbragte han i Reglen hos en af Børnene; men om Sommeren vilde han helst være hjemme i sit gamle Hjem ved Siden af sin elskede Hustrues Grav. Sidste Sommer (1939) fejrede vi hans 50 aarige Ordinationsdag med ham til hans store Glæde; men sidste Vinter mistede han sit Hus ved Ildebrand, medens han selv var borte, og det trykkede ham haardt.

Selv om hans legemlige Kræfter gennem flere Aar svækkesedes mere og mere, blev hans Dødsleje dog kun ganske kort; men han var rejsefærdig og talte ofte med os derom. Sidste Gang, han var i vort Hjem, sagde han: „Nu har jeg været ovre at se mit Sovekammer.“ Faa Dage efter fik han en Lam melse i den højre Side, saa han vanskeligt kunde tale eller bruge den højre Haand. Kort efter samledes Familien for at fejre hans 80 aarige Fødselsdag med

ham d. 4. Okt., hvorved han syntes at glæde sig; men Søndag Morgen d. 13. Okt. kaldte Herren ham hjem til sig. Onsdag d. 16. Okt. blev han begravet under Pastor Kloths Ledelse. Først samledes Familién og enkelte flere om Baaren i Datterens og Svigersønnens Hjem ved Siden af hans nedbrændte Hjem, og hvor han døde. Der holdt Pastor C. Christensen en kort Andagt, og saa samledes vi i den fyldte Kirke, hvor vor Kredsformand, Pastor Videbeck, Brooklyn, samt vor egen Pastor Kloth, begge talte hjerteligt til Minde om hans lange Tjeneste i Herrens Vingaard, der er den skønneste Gerning, Herren betroer sine. Derefter blev hans Legeme stedt til Hvile ved Hustruens Side, hvor en Mindesten med deres Navne viser os Stedet.

Foruden en Søster i Danmark efterlader Pastor A. Kirkegaard sig 3 Sønner og 3 Døtre, der alle er bosatte i de østlige Stater. Den ældste Søn, Christian Scriver, blev ordineret ved vort Aarsmøde 1922, men er nu Præst i United Lutheran Church, hvor han betjener en Menighed i Lynbrook, Long Island. Den ældste Datter, Agnes, er gift med Pastor Wagshall, Utica, der studerede sammen med Scriver og er Præst i samme Kirkesamfund. Desuden er der Ingeborg, Ellen, Richard og Ansgar, samt 14 Børnebørn.

#### PASTOR J. K. JENSEN

Den sidste Dag i Oktober 1940 tog Herren nok een af vore ældre Præster hjem til sig. Det var Pastor Jens Kristian Jensen, der paa Grund af Sygdom, Kræft i højre Nyre, var flyttet til Sleepy Eye, Minn.

sidste Sommer og her henlevede sine sidste Dage. Han blev begravet Mandag d. 4. Nov. fra St. Johns Kirke dersteds under Ledelse af Pastor H. S. Madsen og Pastor H. A. Svendsen, assisteret af Kredsformand Cornelius Hansen og et Dusin andre Præstebrodre fra Omegnen. Pastor Sherman Bondo repræ-



senterede Formand Carlsen paa Samfundets Vegne. Jordfæstelsen fandt Sted paa „Home“ Gravgaard der ved Byen. Hans to Sønner, Peter, Buffalo, Wyo. og Walter, Upton, Wyo. var tilstede, men Datteren Dagmar (Mrs. Victor Kohl, Medford, Ore.) var ikke i stand til at komme.

Pastor Jensen er Søn af Væver Mads Jensen og Hustru, Ane Kathrine (f. Rasmussen), og blev født d. 13. Maj, 1866, paa Urup Mark i Rynkeby Sogn paa Fyn. Han opvoksede under tarvelige Kaar dog

uden at prøve Armod eller Sult. Moderen havde tjent syv Aar i Rynkeby Præstegaard og var der bleven grebet af Guds Ord. Hun fortalte bibelske Historier for ham og lærte ham boglig Syssel. Hans Faders kærlige Omhu men korrekte Opdragelse i Lydighed mindedes Sønnen altid med stor Taknemlighed. Han modtog kristelig Børneundervisning i en grundtvigsk Friskole. Ogsaa der var Lærerne grebne af Guds Kærlighed i Kristus og indpræntede denne i Børnene. Jensen opvoksede i grundtvigske Kredse og bevidner i sin Vita, „at der var Paalidelighed og Ærlighed i alle menneskelige Forhold i disse Kredse, som jeg aldrig har fundet Mage til i Kredse, der gør Krav paa et bedre Navn og Rygte.“

Han havde stor Læselyst, saa hans Moder sagde, at han burde være Præst. Men Midlerne havde de ikke. Tidlig kom han ud at tjene og blev saaledes konfirmeret i Annexet Revninge af Pastor F. Trojel. Trods den naturlige Ungdomstrang til Verdens Glæder, deltog han dog aldrig i nogen Last; derimod vandt Ordets Sæd stadig Vækst i hans Hjerte, og Troen paa Jesus som sin Frelser vandt gradvis Sejr, saa han var ligesaa vis derpaa, som de er der beraaber sig paa pludselig Omvendelse, sagde han. Han blev kendt med baade Syndens Beskhed og Naadens Sødme, takket være alene Guds Naade.

Vinteren 1888-89 tilbragtes paa Vejstrup Folkehøjskole. Samme Foraar rejste han til Amerika (ankom d. 20. April 1889) og fandt Arbejde ved Vermillion, S. Dakota. Hans Formaal var at studere videre for at kunne faa Anledning til at virke i Herrrens Gerning. Den følgende Vinter er han paa den danske Højskole i Elk Horn, Iowa, hvor han fortsætter i fem Aar, og virkede i Mellemtidens som Sko-

lelærer, Missionær m.m. for at tjene til sit Ophold. I 1896—97 frekventerede han Lake View Theologiske Seminar i Chicago og fik saa Kald fra Menigheden i Webster Groves, Mo. til en Præstegerning, hvorfor han ansøgte den nylig organiserede Forenede danske luth. Kirke om Ordination. Denne fandt Sted under Aarsmødet i Blair, Neb. d. 30. Maj 1897. Hans Kollegaer ved den Lejlighed var N. P. Lang og Hans Nielsen, der begge overlever ham.

Pastor Jensens Virksomhed som Præst, Lærer og Skribent er ret omfattende. Han var i sit første Kald to Aar, hvorefter han atter tog paa Seminariet i Chicago godt et Aarstid. Saa modtog han Kald fra Sleepy Eye, Minn. som han betjente 1899—02, var i Hartland, Wis. 1902—05, i Exira, Iowa, 1905—08, hvor han under stor personlig Opofrelse fik bygget en Kirke. Blev saa kaldet til Bestyrer for Luther College i Racine, Wis., hvor han var et Aarstid og tog derpaa en Danmarksrejse. Betjente saa Denmark Kaldet, Wis. i 1909—12 og Standard Kolonien i Alberta 1912—20. Var i Moorhead, Iowa, 1921, hvorpaas han flyttede til den danske Nybyggermenighed ved Buffalo, Wyo. og var Præst der til 1934. Her døde hans Hustru d. 19. Maj 1932. Hun hed Sophia Glesen, en Datterdatter af gamle Jonas Petersen i St. Mortens Mgh. ved Hutchinson. De blev gift d. 2. Juni, 1903 dersteds. Af deres 6 Børn er to Døtre og en Søn døde. Pastor Jensens sidste Virksomhed var i Nybyggermissionen ved Pass Lake, Ontario. Med Undtagelse af et Aarstid i Danmark (1936) var han der til Helbredet gav efter sidste Sommer. Den 2. Sept. 1937 indgik han atter Ægteskab med Frk. Ida Clausen fra Sleepy Eye, der hjalp ham trolig til det sidste.

Pastor Jensen var en alsidig Mand. Han hørte nærmest til hvad blandt os kaldes den orthodoxe Retning. Han bevarede altid sin Sympati for den grundtvigske Menneskeforstaelse, men bekæmpe de dens Skriftteori. Som Tænker og Skribent var han en flittig Mand, i det praktiske Arbejde fandt han sin bedste Opgave paa Yderkanterne, hvor modige og selvopofrende Mænd mest traenges. Hans mange og ofte lange Indlæg over Tankens og Tidens Problemer i vore Samfundsblade er hans eneste litterære Efterladenskaber, men de er værd at studere. En tro Discipel af Luther og en hjertensgod Medarbejder i vor Kirke er gaaet ind til sin Herres Glæde.

Desværre blev min oprindelige biografiske Samling om vores Præster ødelagt i en Brand paa Luth.Publ.House her i Blair d.15.Febr.1953, og jeg har ikke formaget at faa en ny Samling udarbejdet, hvilket i mange Tilfælder bliver umuligt.

Først tillad mig at sige, at det er mig noget af en Overraskelse at Pastor A.Kirkegaard har udgivet noget bogligt, der kunde berette ham til at blive omtalt i det af Dem nævnte Storværk. Selv har jeg samlet i mange Aar paa dansk-amerikansk Litteratur, særlig vedrørende kirkelige Forhold, men aldrig har jeg set eller hørt om noget fra hans Haand uddover Bladartikler. Om det Værk, De nævnte, skulde være blevet udgivet i Danmark, er vel muligt uden at jeg har opsporet det. Jeg kendte Pastor Kirkegaard temmelig godt i min Ungdom; han var til Tider i mit Hjem og jeg i hans. XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX

Her er imidlertid de Oplysninger Jeg har ved Haanden:  
Ifølge sin Vita(se "Kirke-Bladet" 1889, Side 213-214, Organ for Den danske ev. luth. Kirkesamfund i Am., trykt i Blair, Nebr. er han født d.4.Okt.1860 i Harboøre Sogn, Ringkøbing Amt, Danmark, Søn af Laurits Nielsen og Sidsel Marie f. Kristensen; blev hjemmedøbt 22.Okt.s.A.; konfirmeret 4.Apr.1875 i Harboøre Kirke af Pastor J.Johnson. Lærte Tømmerhaandværket og fulgte samme som oarejsende Svend. I sit 18.Aar vaktes hans ~~xxxxxx~~ døngsel efter Fred med Gud og derpaa efter at virke som Missionær. Hans Tanke blev henvendt paa Amerika og hans ansøgte 6 Aar senere ~~xxxx~~ hos den "Dansk-amerikanske Missions Bestyrelse" om Antagelse. Parents of ~~Skriver~~ Skriver K. were pioneers in the Lutheran mission among Danish settlers in America. Father immigrated from Denmark in 1887 and was ordained June 2, 1889 by Pres. G.B. Christiansen of the Danish Luth. Church Conference, org. 1884 at Blair, Nebr. When this merged into the United Danish Ev. Luth. Church in 1896 he became a charter member of this synod, and served churches several places in ~~the~~ Nebr. and Iowa, and last at Laurens, N.Y. where he and his wife retired and died. Two survive Scriven, Mrs. Ellen Nielsen and Mrs. Ingeborg Gramp, formerly at Denver. They were cousins to Martin L. Kirkegaard, former secretary of UDELCA. Rev. A. Kirkgaard died in 1940.

Freda's parents were also pioneers in the Danish Luth. Mission over here; Her father Rev. Chr. Falck immigrated from Denmark in 1884 and was ordained in 1855 and served the Danish Ev/Luth. Church until 1894, when he with 19 other pastors seceded and organized the Danish Luth. Church in North Am. which joined the Blair Church to found the United Danish Church in 1896. Rev. Falck died 1938 at Cordova, Nebr.



Dr. Christian Scriver Kirkegaard. Son of  
Pastor A. Kirkegaard was born at Frederickborg  
Nebraska June 2, 1892. (This was near Minden, Neb.)

He attended Elk Horn College 1908-1909  
and 1910-1911

In 1913 his folks bought a farm at  
Lamoni New York. Scriver accompanied  
them and operated the farm for several  
years. (as I recall it) He received his pre-  
Seminary & Seminary training at Hartwick  
College. He was a veteran of World War I.

He was ordained at the N.E.S.C. convention  
at ~~Fremont, Neb.~~<sup>Receiving this</sup> in 192~~4~~<sup>2</sup> (Check this for  
date of Fremont convention.) He received a  
call from Plainfield New Jersey in 192~~4~~<sup>2</sup>  
and served this congregation until 19~~32~~<sup>25</sup>.

In <sup>Sept</sup> 1925 he was married to Freda  
Falek, daughter of Pastor Christian Falek  
who at that time was retired and  
resided at Cordova, Neb.

He moved to Lynbrook, Long Island  
in 1932 and served as pastor of St. Johns  
Lutheran Church for 25 years and was

named Pastor Emeritus of that church upon his retirement in 1957.

Shortly after his retirement he became part time Chaplain at Meadowbrook Hospital Long Island. In 1962 he became full time Chaplain of that institution and served until his death.

He served for many years on the board of directors of the Nassau Council of Churches. He was also active in the American Legion serving as chaplain. At one time he was Chaplain for the State of New York.

He died as a result of a two car accident at Wantagh Long Island on Dec. 27 '62.

Religious services for Pastor Kirkegaard and wife, who died as a result of same accident were held in St. Johns Lutheran Church Lynbrook L. I. on Dec 30 '62. Interment was at Long Island National Cemetery Pine Lawn, New York.

He is survived by one daughter Mrs. Edw. Edler 237 Downhill Lane Wantagh New York, and

Two sisters Ellen Nielsen and Ingeborg Gramp. (addresses unknown to me)

Mrs C. S. Kirkegaard, nee Freda Falek, was born near Cordova, Neb. Oct. 25 1894.

She was the daughter of Pastor Christian Falek

She attended Luther College at Jewell Iowa 1909-10. Elk Horn College 1910-11.

She taught Vacation school for the Elk Horn congregation in the summer of 1911. She returned to Elk Horn College in 1912 and graduated from the Academic Dept. in the spring of 1913. There were 3 in this Class Ingeborg Olsen, <sup>na. Tony Aagaard,</sup> C. A. Stub <sup>Path: Disc</sup> and Freda Falek. (It is my understanding that this was the first and only class to graduate from a full academic course at Elk Horn college.)

In the fall of 1913 Freda enrolled in the Normal dept. of Dana College. She received a certificate to teach in the spring of 1914

1914+15 she taught in the Public schools at Royal, Iowa. (Peter Romer was Superintendent that year)

In the fall of 1915 she returned to Dana College

Completed the Normal Course and graduated from the Normal Dept in the spring of 1916. That summer she taught the Vacation school for the congregation at Blair. During the Period 1916 to 1925 she taught in the Public schools at the following places: Patten, Neb., Dalton, Neb., Oshkosh, Neb., and Laramie, Wyo. She also took summer work at the Universities of Neb & Wyo.

She was married to Pastor Kirkegaard in Sept 1925 at Cordova, Neb. She died Dec 28, 1962 as a result of the same accident that took the life of her husband.

Religious services were held as mentioned above.
