



Dear Friends, far and near,

Again the old but ever new and blessed Season is upon us. The message is still the same, with its joyous refrain, "Behold I bring you good Tidings of great joy, for unto you is born this day a Saviour, which is Christ the Lord."

This year our greeting comes from Eugene, Oregon, in different circumstances. We are happy to still be engaged in the Lord's work though on a smaller scale. Our Lord has richly provided us with a fine little congregation to serve, namely, Good Shepherd Church. One year ago our future looked rather bleak, leaving our good Golgotha parish, not knowing where we would be going or what we would be doing. Our allsufficient God led us graciously one stop at a time, so that we did not lack a place to be or a task to do until He opened this opportunity for service in His Vineyard. We are also close to our daughters as well as our former congregation who have been most kind to us. Also we are back to the milder climate with which we were familiar. We app about 6 miles from Eugene, and hardly a day passes but we find some reason to go in there. Eugene has grown to nearly 70,000, and has much to offer of different things. We live out among scenic hills with fir, pine and oak trees, as well as ash trees. Church and parsonage are both quite new and very nice and adequate. Our members are not farmers, although some have sheep and horses on the place. The people work at different vocations. They are a dedicated group and have a fine spirit among them.

The Boss (?) man of the manse plugs along the best he can. He has difficulty moving about and rising from chairs etc. His voice isn't so strong but with a good public address system he can get the message across. We are confident that He Who called is able to supply the necessary strength and ability to perform the work that needs to be done in His Name. Anna keeps busy with S.S. class, choir. ALCW., and the many things that need doing, like secretary, butler, valet, chauffeur, maid-in-waiting, housekeeper etc. We do a little entertaining too. She got over her surgery in April in good style.

It is good being near our family again. Joyce's husband is an attorney and she is doing secrtarial work for him until he is more firmly estab-. lished. He is alone in his practice. Their children are getting big. Suzanne is 8, and Steve is 7. Carol's husband is Parole Officer for Lane County, and is kept quite busy, needless to say, with all the crime that exists here as well as everywhere. They have 3 tots. Leanne 5, Amy 4, and Tommy 3. She also takes care of 2 little girls while their parents work. She also does ironing, so has a busy life. You can imagine the noise and excitement when we are all together, but this we have missed by being away from them. Jim is at Waldorf College again and likes his work there as instructor in Art. He is planning to take a trip to Europe next summer. He isn't married yet, but we are led to believe he has some future plans in that area.

We are thinking of each of you, and pray that these lines find you and yours in good health and good spirits as you celebrate this blessed Season in heart, home and church. 

Paa Billedet, som medfølger, ser vi Pastor Olsen, til højre, og Fru Anna til venstre, sammen med Mr. og Mrs. Constantine Schaboklicky, der er Præstehjemmets Forøgelse. Deres straalende Aasyn antyder, at det godt kan være den lykkeligste Familie i Danebo, uagtet vi er alt andet end tilbøjelige til at hænge med Næbbet herude.

Pastor og Mrs. Ingward Olsen, har her gaaet meget eksemplarisk til Værks, idet de egenhændigt har paataget sig Ansvaret for et "displaced" russisk Ægtepar. Baade Constantine og Katherine Schaboklicky er fra Hvide Rusland. Han blev født 1905 i Vladikavkaz i et ortodoks-katolsk Hjem. Da Bolschevist Revolutionen udbrød, var han Student i Gymnasiet og flygtede til Yugoslavia, hvor han fortsatte Studiet ved Belgrads Universitet og graduerede som Forstmand. Derpaa blev han Chefassistent hos Prof. Dr. Ale Shenshin, der var Forstmand for Skovvæenet, og fore-

tog mange Undersøgelser af Træsorter og Trævækst sammen med ham. I 1939 blev han dennes Efterfølger som Skovopsynsmand og Ingeniør i Tuzla, Bosnia. Tre Aar senere evakueredes han af Tyskerne til Østrig og gennem Krigen havde han Ansættelse i sit Fag i Skovene. Han og Hustru udtog Borgerret i Jugoslavien. Efter Krigen blev de registreret som Flygtninge hos IRO i Salzburg og som saadan fik de Anledning til at blive indladt i USA.

#### 8. Februar, 1950

#### LUTHERSK UGEBLAD

Jeg gik ikke til Kirke idag, men sidder hjemme; har læst for min Kone og for mig selv en Prædiken af C. H. Spurgeon til Nytaarsdag, over Teksten om det ufrugtbare Figentræ. Den var holdt paa Sygesengen, og den bar Præg deraf. Hvor har han dog været en underlig og af Gud storlig benaadet Prædikant. Hvor har han været tænkende, veltalende og billedrig. I 38 Aar havde England den store Velsignelse at faa ham at høre. Men ogsaa ved Oversættelsen af hans Prædikener har han været og virket til stor Velsignelse. Ogsaa iblandt os Danskere. Det er mærkeligt, at en Mand som Vilhelm Beck, og ligeledes C. Moe, ikke kunde anerkende ham; førstnævnte kaldte ham "en fremmed Svend". Ja, maaske for Beck, men sandelig ikke for Gud. O, hvor vi taber meget ved vor Snæverhed, der ikke i visse Henseender tillader at man har et andet Syn og afskærer os selv Velsignelsen blot fordi "han følger ikke os"!

Vi er nu inde i 1930. Hvor mange Træer vil der falde dette Aar? Sidste Aar saa vi i den forenede Kirke flere af de gamle Træer falde, og hvem og hvormange vil dette Aar kræve? Vi ved det ikke, og det er godt. Ikke en Spurv falder til Jorden uden vor Faders Vilje. Hvor meget mindre et Menneske!

Den 7. Januar 1930. Den 2. Januar var jeg i Hellevad, hvor jeg holdt Møde sammen med Pastor Nic. Paulsen, Højrup, som talte over Ordene i Matth. 11: "Kommer hid til mig, alle I som arbejder og er besværede, jeg vil give eder Hvile." Den 3. Januar tog jeg over Thyregod til Vange (Thomas Jespersens By) for at tale ved de Gamles Juletræ. Der var ikke saa mange til Stede som for to Aar siden. Jeg spiste til Middag hos Gartner Jensen, som havde indbudt mig. Om Aftenen kom en hel Del af Vennerne ned til Berthel Madsen, min gamle Vært.
