Several years ago, a district convention rejected a proposal to divide the Central District into two administrative units. Instead, it recommended the addition of a clergyman as assistant to the district president. Mr. Harry Bunge, Lincoln, Neb., continues as lay assistant. This year much of Mr. Bunge's time is being devoted to the LIFE Program.


Pastor Staby is a graduate of Dana College (1936) and Trinity Seminary
