Henry A. Petersen was born to Frederick and Anna Petersen on October 15, 1885, near Spiker, Nebraska. All of his early life was spent in that community. *10-10-63*

Following a long decline, Henry Petersen succumbed to death last Thursday, October 3, at the age of 77 years.
