Former Omahan Was Retired Diplomat

Services were to be held today in Washington, D. C., for Fred K. Nielsen, one time Omahan and a retired diplomat and authority on international law. Mr. Nielsen, 83, died Saturday at Washington.

A newsboy in his youth, Mr. Nielsen was graduated from Mason School and Omaha High School. He received his undergraduate and law degrees at the University of Nebraska, where he was a member of the football team. He subsequently went to Washington and from 1924 to 1953 was Professor of International Law at Georgetown Law School.

Mr. Nielsen was a delegate at the Paris Peace Conference in 1919, the Washington Conference on Limitations of Naval Armaments in 1921 and 1922, and the London Economic and Financial Conference of 1933.

He was a special consultant to the international military tribunal which tried Japanese war criminals after World War II. He served as counsel and United States delegate in the arbitration of claims involving Great Britain, The Netherlands, Mexico, Egypt and Turkey.

Both the University of Nebraska and Georgetown University awarded him honorary degrees.

Only local survivor is a niece, Margaret A. Nielsen, North High School teacher.
