1st White Girl Born at Blair Was 95

Funeral services for Mrs. George Rohwer, Sr., will be held Wednesday at 2 p. m. at the Fort Calhoun Presbyterian Church, with the Sievers Mortuary of Fort Calhoun in charge. Burial will be in the Fort Calhoun Cemetery.

Mrs. Rohwer, the first white girl born in Blair, would have been 96 years old on November 15. She was the

daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Carl H. Beekmann, pioneers of Washington County. She had lived all her life in that county.

Married in 1888, she and her husband moved to a farm one mile north of Fort Calhoun which has been a possession of the Rohwer family for 110 years.

Several years ago, Mrs. Rohwer received the Ak-Sar-Ben Farm Family Award. She was a longtime member of the Fort Calhoun Woman's Club, and she maintained an interest in the community's schools throughout most of her life. Her husband died in 1928. Three sons preceded her in death.

She is survived by one son, George, Jr., Fort Calhoun; three daughters, Mrs. E. S. B. (Clara) Geesaman and Miss Celia Rohwer, both of Fort Calhoun, and Mrs. E. T. Jipp of Blair; 12 grandchildren and 28 great-grandchildren.
