Mrs. Johanna Swanson passed away on October 7th at the Good Shepherd Home, which she had entered in July.

She was born in Skane, Sweden on March 19, 1872 and was 92 years of age at the time of her death. She was baptized and confirmed in Sweden. In 1891 she came to the United States and lived in Omaha until 1896 when she married Neis Swanson. They farmed in Washington County and lived near Kennard for 49 years. Mr. Swanson passed away May 13, 1940.
