D. W. Rutledge, 91 Buried In Herman

D. W. Rutledge was born at Oakdale, Antelope County, Nebr., June 8, 1873, and passed away April 5th, 1965 at Blair, Nebr., at the age of 91 years. When he was an infant, his parents moved to a farm east of Her-

man, where he later attended Homestead School. Here he grew to manhood and at the age of 22, married Catherine Cooper at Fremont, Nebraska, on March 30th, 1895. This pioneering young couple Homesteaded on one of the last claims in the area east of Herman and lived there for 6 years. Another 10 years was spent on two farms near there before they moved to their home in Herman.
