

Services For Mrs. Lena Stork Were Held Sunday

Funeral services for Mrs. John (Lena) Stork, age 74, were held Sunday, Jan. 24, 1965, at St. Paul's Lutheran Church near Arlington, with Rev. Carl Hellmann officiating. Burial followed at St. Paul's Lutheran Cemetery.

Mrs. Stork died Thursday afternoon in her home after a short illness.

Mrs. Stork, the former Lena Kruger, was born near Arlington on February 6, 1890, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Frederick Kruger. She was baptized and confirmed in the Lutheran faith, and was a lifelong member of St. Paul's Lutheran Church. She was married February 3, 1909, to John W. Stork. They lived on a farm near Arlington until 1945, when they moved to Arlington.

The couple celebrated their golden wedding anniversary in 1959. Mr. Stork preceded her in death on August 11, 1961.

St. Paul's Lutheran Choir sang "Hear Our Prayer." The congregation sang "Oh How Blessed Are Ye Whose Toils Are Ended" and "Asleep in Jesus, Blessed Sleep." Mr. George Bluma was organist.

Survivors include two sons, Harold of Arlington, Allard of Baltimore, Md.; one daughter, Mrs. Rudolph (Edna) Fuchs of Arlington; one sister, Mrs. Amelia Dickmeyer of Arlington; two brothers, Henry and William Kruger, both of Arlington; eleven grandchildren and four great-grandchildren. Two sisters and a brother preceded her in death.

Mrs. Will Caldwell, a Blair resident for many years died Monday at Portland, Oregon following major surgery. She was 85 years old.
