Rev. Anders Valdermar Neve
passed away December 7th at the
age of 79 years.

He was born at Ringsted, Iowa
on February 22, 1886. In 1914 he

anniversary in 1964.

Rev. Neve's first pastorate was
in Oshkosh, Wisconsin and after
four years there he served 24
