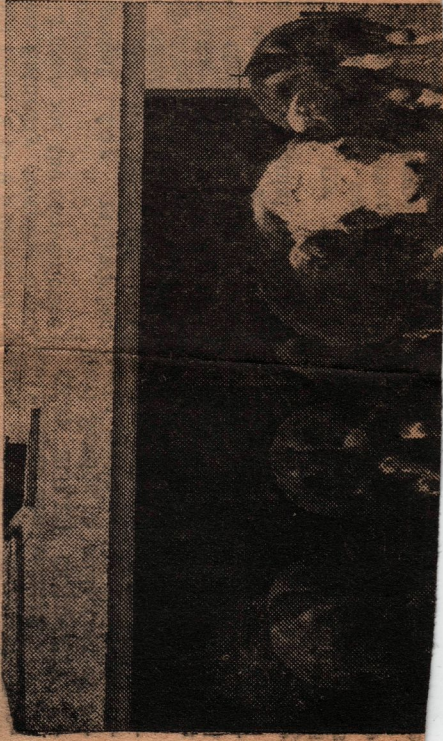
and Mrs. Carl Andersen of Burbank, Calif.
