Mrs. Hansine Anderson, mother of Mrs. F. W. Thomsen, of the Dana College area, Blair, died at Memorial Community Hospital last Sunday, October 24th. She had made her home with Rev. and Mrs. Thomsen for the past eight years.

Hansine Anderson was born in Denmark March 23, 1881. In 1900 she came to America, settling at Ruskin, Nebraska.
