## Douglas Veterinarian Native of Denmark

Funeral services will be held at 2 p. m. Tuesday at the Hadan Mortuary in Bennington for Dr. P. J. Christiansen, 70, retired Bennington veterinarian.

Dr. Christiansen, who died Sunday at the Good Shepherd Home in Blair, ended a 43-year practice in Douglas County with his 1960 retirement.

In 1950 he installed a mobile telephone unit in his auto. He was believed to be the first veterinarian in Nebraska to do so.

Dr. Christiansen was born in Denmark, leaving that country in 1917.

He made the first of several trips back in 1947 to see his parents, then in their eighties. He spent several months in his native country after his retirement.

Survivors: son Charles, Cupertino, Cal.; daughter, Mrs. Albert Nischke, North Brook, Ill., and six grandchildren. Burial will be in the Arlington, Neb. Cemetery.
