

Henry Giesselmann Services Were Held On Wednesday

Henry Giesselmann, life-long resident of the Arlington community died suddenly Sunday morning, on May 28th. He was born on a farm north of Arlington on February 25, 1891 and received his elementary schooling at the St. Pauls Lutheran School.

He was united in marriage to Henriette Kruger on October 18, 1916. The couple observed their Golden Wedding Anniversary with a service and open house at St. Pauls last fall.

Mr. and Mrs. Giesselmann were blessed with six children, all living: Glenn, Arlington, Lyle, Bennington, Rupert, Seward, Merle, Fremont, Larry, Snyder and Mrs. Gene Bloemker (Harriet) Arlington. Besides Mrs. Giesselmann and the 6 children, 19 grandchildren and 2 great grandchildren, one brother and 9 sisters also survive.
