Services For Tena Wiese Were Mon.

Tena E. Wiese, pioneer Washington County lady, passed away

on Friday afternoon at the Blair Hospital after a long lingering illness. She was 86 years, 11 months, 21 days at the time of her death.

Mrs. Wiese was the former Tena E. Harder, daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Hardef, of Kennard, who were early settlers in this county. Mrs. Wiese was born March 17, 1880 on a farm near Kennard and made this county her home the rest of her life.

Mrs. Wiese was married to R. G. Wiese, Sr. on August 23, 1902. They celebrated their Golden Wedding in 1952. Mr. Wiese passed away in October of 1954.

Mrs. Wiese was the mother of eight children: August, of Iowa; Clarence and Asmus of Blair; Henry of Kennard and Arthur L. where she made her home. Daughters, Mrs. Christena English of Beemer, Nebraska; Dorothy of Kennard; step-daughter, Mrs. George (Bertha) Voss of DeSmet, South Dakota; two step sons, Claus of Denver, Colorado, Rudolph of Fort Calhoun, Nebraska. One son, Herman Wiese, of Omaha, passed away in 1961 and two step daughters, Mrs. Amanda Wulf of Pine Bluffs, Wyoming and Mrs. Meta Stender, preceded her in death.

Her twin brother, Henry Harder, survives and resides in Eventide Home in Dennison, Iowa. 21 grandchildren and 38 great grandchildren survive, as do many nieces and nephews.
