Blair Woman Killed In Fall Down Stairs

Mrs. Stanley J. Bednar Found Dead In Her Home Late Monday Eve

Mrs. Stanley J. Bednar, well known Blair woman and lifetime resident of Blair, died Monday evening of injuries sustained when she apparently fell down the basement stairs at her home. She was alone in the house when the tragedy happened.

Mrs. Bednar is the wife of Stanley J. Bednar, Executive Vice President of the Washington County Bank. The Bednars live at 535

South 17th Street.

Mrs. Bednar was reported to have not been feeling well Monday evening. Her husband had been away from the house during the evening and returned about 10 P. M. to find her lying on the basement floor at the foot of the stairs. Her death was attributed to injuries sustained in the fall.

The Blair Rescue Squad was immediately called. Death had come some time prior to the arrival of the Rescue Squad.

Dorothea Marie was born to Mr. and Mrs. Oscar Gilbertson on February 13, 1914. She graduated from Blair High School and attended Dana College before becoming a teacher in the elementary grades.

On October 16, 1937 she was united in marriage to Stanley J. Bednar and they were the parents

of three children.

Mrs. Bednar was active in the St. Francis Borgia Catholic Church and was a past president of the Ladies Altar Society. One of her hobbies was rug weaving.

Survivors are her husband, Mr. Bednar, two daughters, Mrs. Henry Neef (Kay) of Blair; Mrs. Kent Coen (Jean) of Omaha and Capt. John Bednar of Knob Noster, Missouri. Also surviving are six grandsons; her mother, Mrs. Nellie Gilbertson; two sisters, Mrs. Agnes Maher of Blair and Mrs. B. G. Robertson (Jean) of Little Rock, Arkansas.

Funeral services will be held at 10 A. M. this morning, Thursday, March 21st at St. Francis Borgia Catholic Church. Rosary was recited at 8 P. M. Wednesday evening at the Campbell Mortuary. Father Patrick Nolan officiated.
