Services for 88 year old Carl Carlberg will be held on Friday, May 24, from the Bader Razanek-Lawson Funeral Home in Fremont. Mr. Carlberg passed away Tuesday, May 21, at his Fremont home. The death followed a three month illness.

Mr. Carlberg was born on August 1st, 1879 in Sweden. He came to the United States and farmed in the Arlington area until he and his wife moved to their Fremont home 32 years ago.

He was a member of the Arlington Odd Fellows Lodge and
