The Floyd Hilgenkamp farm, one of the three whose owners will be bonored at the Washington County Fair this fall, has been in the family 101 years.

The farm came into the Hilgenkamp family in March, 1867. when Herman Hilgenkamp bought it from Daniel Coyle. The land had been homesteaded by Huah Coil in 1860 and later sold to Daniel Coyle, in 1865,

Peter Hilgenkamp, Herman's son, secured the land in 1900, and it came to G. W. Hilgenkamp eral farming, milk about 20 cows,

in 1922. Floyd Hilgenkamp got the farm in 1964, establishing an unbroken line of possession in the

The original tract upon which this history is based consisted of 120 acres, but this has since been expanded to 200 acres. The farm lies three miles north of the Marshall Nurseries corner on Highway 30. It is now on the new black top road which is just being com-

The Hilgenkamps engage in gen-

and usually raise around 175 hogs. Last Monday, they were busy harvesting the wheat crops.
