Mrs. Grabbe celebrated her birthday on January 30, while their wedding anniversary occurred on January 22. Both occasions were quiet affairs, with relatives and friends dropping in to the Grabbe home during the day.

Both Mr. and Mrs. Grabbe have lived in Washington county all of their lives. They were married at the home of the bride, Herman Hovendick, Sr., on a farm southwest of Blair, in 1902.

Soon afterward, they moved to the Spiker neighborhood, where they eventually acquired two farms, on which their sons now live.

Mrs. Grabbe recalls that when her father came to this county, their first home was a sod dugout which had been abandoned by its discouraged owner.

In 1893 and 1894, Mr. Grabbe carried the U.S. mail from Blair to the postoffices at Orum, Spiker, and Vacoma. There was no R F D then and patrons called at these post offices, and general stores, for their mail. Mr. Grabbe used a team of ponies on his route and made the trip three days per week. Although he was only 17 years old at the time, he took over the contract from an older man and he remarks "Nobody said anything about it".

The Blair post office was then in the building now occupied by Harold's Supermarket.
