PT2-17-69 Snow-Packed Highway

An Oakland lady was killed and three other persons injured in a two - car accident during the Thursday night snow storm, February 13th. The lady killed was Bessy Nelson of Oakland, Nebraska.

The Blair Volunteer Rescue Squad was called to the accident scene one and one-half miles north of the Blair Airport near the Don Lippincott farm home on Highway 73. The Squad was called about 11 p.m.

Autos driven by Pat Duffey, of Blair, and Vivian Frey, of Pender collided nearly head-on. Pat Duffey and hispassenger, Roger Johnson of Blair, received multiple cuts and bruises in the accident. Vivian Frey was driving the auto in which Mrs. Nelson was riding. Mrs. Frey was seriously injured.

The accident apparently took place with the Frey auto heading north and the Duffey auto heading

south. After the impact the Frey auto remained north-bound. The Duffey auto spun around on the west lane and came to a stop heading north.

Mrs. Nelson, 57, was the wife of Albert Nelson, freight agent for the Chicago Northwestern Railroad. She is survived by her husband and three grown children. They are Mrs. Dale Drien, of Lincoln, Nebr., Bernard Nelson of Seattle, Washington and Miss Janice Nelson who is an Army Nurse stationed in Germany. Mrs. Nelson and Mrs. Frey

Mrs. Nelson and Mrs. Frey were sisters. They had been in St. Joseph, Missouri since Sunday where they were visiting a new niece and granddaughter and had started their return trip about 7 o'clock Thursday evening.
