

Death Takes Businessman Jacobberger

Omaha businessman Harry A. Jacobberger, father of City Council President H. F. Jacobberger, died Thursday in a local hospital.

The elder Jacobberger, 90, of 220 South Ninetieth Street, had suffered a heart condition the last two years.

Jacobberger was long-time owner and president of Kimball Laundry Co. He was also past president of the Associated Retailers of Omaha, the Omaha Automobile Association and the Omaha Manufacturers' Association.

Jacobberger served on the board of regents of the University of Omaha from 1935-40 and was active in other civic affairs.

Born in Alsace-Lorraine, he came to Omaha in 1887, went west for health reasons and became a cowpuncher and miner, then returned to Omaha and entered the laundry business.

He is also survived by another son, Francis, Omaha; daughter, Mrs. Virginia Procter, Palos Verdes, Calif.; brothers, Albert and Ernest, both of Omaha, and Charles, La Habra, Calif.; sister, Mrs. Anna Dohrse, Omaha; 17 grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.

Funeral services will be at 9 a.m. at Christ the King Church, with burial at Forest Lawn Cemetery. The rosary recitation will be at 8 p.m. Sunday at the Leo A. Hoffmann Mortuary.

Jack Barry, son of Mr. and Mrs. John Barry of Blair, died suddenly Monday in Omaha of a heart attack. He was a graduate of Blair High School and a native of Blair and was well known here.

He had lived in Omaha since leaving Blair and had been an employee of the Goodyear Rubber Co. for the past 22 years.

John J. "Jack" Barry was born in Blair, June 29, 1926. He attended school here and grew up in this community, graduating with the Blair High School Class of 1944. Following his graduation he attended Dana College and later attended Creighton University in Omaha.

In May, 1949, he was married to Miss Marion R. Case and to this union four children were born. All of the children and his wife survive his death. The survivors are his wife, Marion, daughter, Pamela; sons, Kevin, John and Timothy, all of whom are still at home.

His parents, Mr. and Mrs. John Barry also survive as well as two sisters, Margaret Gillen, of Omaha and Mary Martin of Denver. A brother, Robert, also resides at Denver.
