

**ALBERT SORENSEN
DIED AT FREMONT
TUESDAY, MAY 26**

Albert Sorensen, long time resident and farmer in the Kennard area, died Tuesday, May 26th at the Dodge County Hospital in Fremont. He was 74 years of age, having been born September 14th, 1895 near Kennard.

He had spent his entire life in the Kennard vicinity and was known by many there. For the past 27 years a brother, Andrew Sorensen and his wife, Faye, had lived with Albert and cared for him. He spent his entire life on the same farm and his interests were in his home, the farm and the raising of livestock.

His parents, the late Mr. and Mrs. Peter C. Sorensen, preceded him in death as did four brothers, Sorn, Niels, Clarence and Frank, and one sister, Mrs. Elmer Lund (Alma).

He is survived by three brothers, Andrew, Ola and Lester, all of Kennard and one sister, Mrs. Carl Lund (May) who resides in Fremont. A sister-in-law, Mrs. Clarence Sorensen lives in Wayne, Nebraska and there are several nieces and nephews.

ne was baptized in the Lutheran faith when an infant and continued his association with this church throughout his life.

Funeral services were held Friday, May 29th at the Emmaus Lutheran Church in Kennard, with the Rev. Arden Dorn conducting the service. Burial, under the direction of the Bendorf Funeral Home was made in the Kennard Cemetery.

**THOMLINSONS WERE
BURIED IN MISSOURI
WEDNESDAY 5-28-70**

Three members of the Delmar Thomlinson family, all of whom were killed in an automobile accident south of Blair on Thursday, May 21st, were buried at Ironton, Missouri Wednesday afternoon of this week.

Four persons met their death in the crash which occurred during a driving rainstorm. Details and pictures of the accident appeared in Monday's Pilot-Tribune.

Delmar Thomlinson, age 45, had lived in Blair for a number of years and he had been a member of the Blair police force. He suffered permanent injuries in a fall several years ago and had been incapacitated.

Mrs. Thomlinson was also 45 years of age. She was born in Arcadia, Missouri, and had come to Blair with her husband. Since her husband's injury, she had been working in Omaha.

Patricia Lorene, 17-year-old daughter of the Thomlinsons, was born at North Platte, Nebraska. She was a member of the graduating class of Blair High School

of 1970 and would have received her diploma tonight.

There are three surviving members of the family. A son, Delmar Lawrence Thomlinson, resides at Beaver Crossing, Nebraska. Another son, Wilford Eugene Thomlinson, lives at Springfield, Missouri. A third son is Cecil Wayne Thomlinson who is stationed at Scott Air Force Base, Belleville, Illinois.

Martin C. Sorensen, a native Washington County man who has been away from this area for many years, died recently at Cheyenne, Wyoming Hospital following a long illness. Mr. Sorensen was a brother of the late Anna King, wife of former Blair businessman Clarence King.

Mr. Sorensen, 76 years of age, was a long-time civic leader in Sedgwick County at Julesburg, Colorado where he lived. He was born at Herman, Nebraska but had lived at Julesburg for the past 49 years.

He was a one-time County Commissioner, was a member of the first Wheat Board and a one-time member of the Julesburg hospital board. He was a former World War I veteran. He was buried with American Legion honors.

Mr. Sorensen is survived by his wife, a son and five grandchildren.
