Clare Edward Thomas, a resident of Fort Calhoun for almost 33 years, passed away Tuesday, June 2 at his home, following a heart attack. He was 67 years of age, having been born on April 16, 1903 in Tekamah, to James Edward Thomas and Alma Schaffer Thomas.

Clare and his family moved to Fort Calhoun in 1937, where they have made their home since. He spent almost 30 years in the service station business and he retired in 1966 because of failing health.

He was united in marriage to Marie Kaer on February 14, 1923 at Tekamah and to this union was born 3 daughters, Lucille Stricklett of Omaha, Leora Jackson of Council Bluffs and Virginia Lanouette of Fort Calhoun.
