Danians to Organize Local Chapters in March

Dana's Greatest Homecoming Is Now a Pleasant Memory 2000 at Dedication

An estimated 2000 people attended the dedication of the quarter-million-dollar Administration-Library Building on October 31 to climax a three-day Homecoming Celebration that broke all records for attendance.

Following the opening program by DCDC and the coronation of Queen Alice Romer, Winnipeg, Man., on Friday night, an informal coffee hour was held in the new Recreation Center. Here alumni became acquainted with the "other throng," Dana's present students. The wives from Vets' Village, most of them alumnae, planned the occasion and prepared the delicious lunch.

Saturday morning the student body of 1941-1942 presented a bronze plaque to the college as a memorial to Dr. C. X. Hansen. Present at the simple ceremony were members of the Hansen family, including P. V. Hansen, former registrar and director of the drive that made possible the completion of the new building. The plaque was placed on a boulder under the memorial birch on the lower campus.

A brilliant sun shone on the Saturday afternoon float parade to Veterans' Field, where even the 13-6 defeat at the hands of Norfolk could not dampen the Homecoming spirit. In the evening 700 people attended the banquet in the gymnasium. Guest speaker was former prexy, Dr. Erland Nelson, now president of Carthage College.

Rev. William Larsen preached the sermon at the morning worship service on Sunday. The dedication ceremony began at 3 o'clock. Mr. S. R. Knutson, as main speaker, answered the question, "Why Build at Dana?" Dr. N. C. Carlsen, president of the United Evangelical Lutheran Church dedicated the building to the glory of God. Guests from colleges throughout the Midwest were introduced.

March is the month! From Maine to California, from Montana to Oklahoma, we hope to see the organization or re-activation of local chapters of the Alumni Association of Dana College and Trinity Seminary. With this in mind, letters are being mailed to three individuals in each of 20 areas, with requests that they spearhead the plans for the initial meeting.

And the purpose of these chapters? First, to promote interest in and support of Christian higher education at Dana College. Second, to interest high school students and high school graduates in different parts of the nation in an education at Dana College. Third, to renew memories and acquaintances from days spent on College Hill.

In order not to become a burden to members, these clubs or chapters should plan only two to three meetings each year. Well-planned programs centered about a central theme and interspersed with good music by former students will do much to reawaken interest in Dana and Trinity. Certainly former college students now working in many different fields can share much with one another at such chapter meetings. Colored slides and motion picture films will be available at Dana College for showing at future meetings of the chapters.

Even the University of Nebraska suggests that local chapters should be organized in areas where alumni of that institution number ten or more. Where groups of former Dana students are small, meetings can be held in homes rather than in public buildings. No group is too small to do something to further interest in Christian higher education in these days of world confusion.

Local chapters can become important factors in the building of Dana, one of the colleges that presents the positive message of Christianity to a dark world. No member of the Association will want to miss attending one of these organizational meetings. Areas have been chosen on the basis of information available in the mailing list. For the third season Maynard Andersen was cast as Scrooge and Jack Krogh as Bob Cratchit. The play was directed by Robert M. Corl, professor of speech at Dana.

'Christmas in Denmark' is Banquet Theme

Drawing on Dana's Old World heritage, the annual Christmas banquet this year, held on December 13, featured "Christmas in Denmark." Dinner hour music was provided by the Dana String Ensemble. Favors were Denmark's Yuletide nisser or elves; Danish pebernodder (pepper nuts) filled the red and white nut cups.

Gifts of food were again brought for shipment overseas. Postage was secured through the sale of corsages of New England evergreens. Each corsage was bright with a miniature silk Dannebrog, flag of Europe's oldest Kingdom. This event rated international attention: Newspapers throughout Denmark carried an account of the evening.

Dana Ties for Second Place in NIAA

The 1948 Dana football squad tied for second place in the NIAA with McCook and Fairbury. Top position went to Norfolk. The season record of 5 wins and 2 defeats was the best since the 1932 when the Vikings were undefeated in five games.

Perhaps the most significant victory was the 12-6 score in the Midland game. This marked an end to the reign of the Warriors over the Vikings on the football field.

Six Viking Gridders on All-Star Team

When the NIAA all-conference football roster was announced, six Dana gridders found berths on the 27-man team. Bud Robinson, Paul Laursen, Earl Pace, Andrew Hansen, Maynard Andersen, and Art Sorensen were the Vikings chosen.

Undefeated Dana Team Rolls Ahead

In the next issue of THE ALUMNI QUARTERLY a complete story of the 1948-1949 basketball season will be featured. In the meantime these results should prove that this year's Viking basketball team is making college history. Dana has at this writing one of the nation's few remaining undefeated teams.

One of First Students Remembers Alma Mater

The Late Rev. N. Hansen Wills Library to Dana College and Trinity Seminary



Out in Los Angeles the first part of January I had one of the rich experiences of my life. It was my privilege to select books from the fine collection of the late Rev. Niels Hansen for the libraries of Dana College and Trinity Seminary. It was the will of the pioneer pastor that, following his death, books from his library were to be selected for shipment to his alma mater. More than 1200 volumes were packed and are now on their way to College Hill.

In the collection are rare old Bibles, books that are a study in the development of the art of printing, travel books describing the scores of nations visited by this Dana alumnus, books on the history of art, and books of fine steel etchings. Other volumes on the subjects of literature, theology, and Scandinavian history make this a fine addition to the campus libraries.

It was in 1885 that a 19-year-old Danish student, Niels Hansen, arrived at Trinity Seminary, at that time meeting in the Blair home of Dr. A. M. Andersen. That student was later to serve as a pioneer pastor among Danish immigrants on the West Coast. For several years he was a pastor in his native Denmark, spent some time in Italy, but later returned to America, where he is remembered for his eloquence, his alert mind and vivacious spirit.

A world traveller with an eye for the artistic, Pastor Hansen collected a library that reflected this interest as well as his major interest in the work of the Kingdom of God. He made mission study tours through the Orient, tours of the art galleries and museums of Europe, and visited the ruins and excavations of the Near East, there to study Biblical archeology at first hand.

He was graduated from Trinity Seminary in 1888, but remained a student until his death, enrolling for courses at the University of Minnesota and the British Museum and continuing his reading in many fields. He was the author of a number of published articles and edited several Danish periodicals. He wrote several volumes dealing with the development of the United Evangelical Lutheran Church.

Death came to the aged pastor on June 24, 1946, at Blair, Nebr., where he had attended the Jubilee Convention of the synod and had preached a stirring sermon in the Dana Auditorium the preceding day. Interment was in Los Angeles, to which city he had returned to make his home in 1933. This year of 1949 Dana and Trinity acknowledge a generous gift from a man whose life in America began and ended on College Hill.
