Mrs. N. C. Carlsen Honored

A special chapel service was held on the Dana campus February 23 in honor of Mrs. N. C. Carlsen.

Mrs. Carlsen, who celebrated her 76th birthday February 22, was honored for the years of service she and her late husband, the Rev. Dr. N. C. Carlsen, and their children have given to Dana College and Trinity Seminary.

The N. C. Carlsen family attended Dana and Trinity a total of 47 years. Eight of the ten children found their husbands or wives on the Dana campus.

Dr. C. C. Madsen, Dana President, presented Mrs. Carlsen with a bouquet of flowers and a memorial book containing letters of greeting from her ten children, the college, and from Dr. Wm. Larsen, UELC President.

In his letter of greeting and gratitude, Dr. Madsen said: "We pay to you our tribute of thanksgiving for the leadership you and Dr. Carlsen gave to our church and to Dana College and Trinity Seminary during the quarter century he served as president of our United Evangelical Lutheran Church. Certainly among the finest fruits of that devotion are the ten homes of your sons and daughters who now serve their church and community as pastors, physicians, educators, business men and Christian parents across the land."

Dana Host to Largest Conference

Over 300 young men from Nebraska, Iowa, Kansas, Oklahoma and South Dakota were on the Dana campus March 7 for a Men for the Ministry Conference. The Dana conference was the largest of the 40 conferences held across the nation.

The conferences, sponsored by the A.L.C., E.L.C., L.F.C. and the U.E.L.C., were held to acquaint young men of the church with the needs and joys of the gospel ministry.

Danish Ambassador to Attend Homecoming

The Dana College Diamond Jubilee Committee has received word that the Danish Ambassador to the United States has accepted an invitation to attend the Jubilee Homecoming, October 10, 1959.

Ambassador Count K. Knuth-Winterfeldt stated in a letter to Dana President C. C. Madsen that he and the Countess would be happy to attend the Diamond Jubilee Homecoming celebrations, if no conflict in schedule prevents the visit.

The American Ambassador to Denmark, Mr. Val Peterson, will also be on hand for the 1959 Homecoming. Mr. Peterson, former Governor of Nebraska, will be the main speaker October 10.

The Jubilee observance will be held November 12 and 13. The first of the two-day celebration will be dedicated to Trinity Seminary, the second to the college. Plans for the observances are well underway and a definite program should be available for publication in the near future.

Dr. Wildrick to Peru

What is more painful than a toothache? Who can sleep at night or work much during the day when he has a toothache? A quick trip to the dentist is the surest way to abate the pain and restlessness that accompany the toothache, but a trip to the dentist is not so easy for our missionaries in the remote jungles of South America.

For this reason, Dr. Robert Wildrick (attended Dana '38-'39) is on his way to the Peruvian jungle, complete with portable dental equipment. Dr. Wildrick will spend six weeks as a dental missionary to the Summer Institute of Linguistics at Yarinacocha, Peru.

The visit of Dr. Wildrick to the jungle base will coincide with one of the busiest months of the year for our missionaries. Over two hundred hand picked natives from 18 different tribes will be gathered at the base for training as government teachers.

In addition to working on the dental problems of missionaries, their children and the Indians, Dr. Wildrick, together with Dr. Ralph Eichenberger of the Yarinacocha medical clinic, will provide a flying dental clinic for persons in the remote areas of the jungle.

Dr. Wildrick, who practices dentistry in Castro Valley, California, is making the trip at his own expense.

Have You?

Have you made your contribution to the Alumni Association this year? Why not do it today. Before July 1 nearly three thousand dollars will be needed to meet the current commitments of the Association. This is the final appeal for dues. A new Alumni-Foundation Annual Giving Effort program will go into effect at the start of the next fiscal period. Operating funds for the Association will come from the college budget, from funds made available through the new Annual Giving program.

Annual Giving Goal

It has been estimated that the subsidy to Dana College, based on the formula used for all colleges in the merged church, will be reduced from \$30,000 to \$40,000. This means that Dana will need to raise this amount annually from friends, alumni and former students.

The immediate goal for 1959-60 from the Alumni-Foundation Annual Giving program has been set at \$17,500. The second year the goal will be \$30,000.

These sums will be needed to supplant the loss in church subsidy to the college after merger.

Alumni and friends of Dana will be asked to make one contribution per year. You will receive further information on the Annual Giving Program as plans are completed.

Nielsen Builds Organ

Organs are gradually replacing the piano in some American homes, and it is a fair assumption to suggest that Alumni of Dana College and Trinity Seminary are going along with this trend.

Although there are many organs in homes these days, it is doubtful that many are hand built.

Dr. Arnold Nielsen of Ankeny, Iowa, "built" an organ in his spare time, as a hobby. The organ, built from a do-it-yourself kit, produces its notes by oscillating vacuum tube circuits, and its tones by electronic filters.

From start to finish, the project took between 300 and 400 sparetime hours. After completing the organ, Dr. Nielsen says he attempted to learn to play, but met with no success. His wife, Elaine, and his daughters do the playing.

Dr. Nielsen, who graduated from Dana in 1942, was Homecoming speaker in 1957.

Author Uses Library

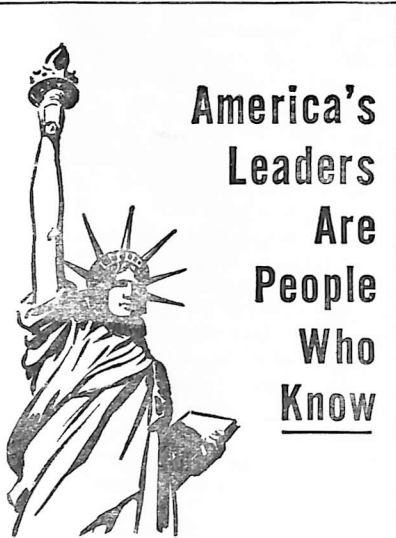
