Holling Hall, Residence For Men

The Board of Regents has approved construction plans for Holling Hall, a men's residence to be built southwest of the old women's dormitory and dining hall. Plans are complete and construction is

expected to begin this summer. The dormitory is expected to be ready for use at the opening of the 1964-65 school year. It will house approximately 140 students. Cost is estimated at about 425 thou-

sand dollars. The building is named for Marie and Emanuel Holling of Millard, Neb., whose gift of 200 thousand dollars makes construction possible.

Tour Plans Advancing In Racine Area

Two European Choices Given

Plans are progressing for the Dana-sponsored tour of Europe being planned for this summer.

Alumni and friends interested in the tour have been invited to ask the college public relations office for details.

Two different arrangements are possible. One tour will be from New York to Copenhagen and back only. The other will be an all-inclusive guided tour of Europe, reaching from Copenhagen to Cairo.

The tour leaves New York June 11 and returns from Copenhagen August 8. Deadline for registrations is in April.

Fehl Named President; Several Cities Included

A new Dana Club has been formed in the Racine, Wis., area.

At an organizational meeting held in February, Ken Fehl was elected president.

The first session was held at Emmaus Lutheran Church in Racine, where the Rev. Thorvald Hansen is pastor.

Projects discussed included a plan to charter a bus from the Racine area for the 1963 Homecoming.

Other objectives are to aid in reaching prospective students for Dana and to assist in publicizing the mission of the college.

It has been suggested to the club that it establish a music scholarship or similar memorial to the late Pastor Donald A. Olsen.

He died last July 5 at Deaconess Hospital in Milwaukee, at the age of 31.

Need 300 Helping Hands? Call For Viking Volunteers

Tom Allan, the Omaha World-Herald's traveling reporter in Nebraska, is a frequent Dana visitor. On his last trip he found students ready to undertake an ambitious project. His story follows.

Red Cross officials didn't have to look farther than the hill west of Blair in seeking help for the annual Washington County Red Cross drive. Those Vikings of Dana College volunteered en masse to take on the entire job of raising the county's goal of 26 hundred dollars.

"They asked if we were interested," said Herbert Knudsen of Lincoln, Student Council President. "The Council was interested so we put it to the student body and it was unanimously okayed."

Herb was named drive general chairman with Richard

Jorgensen of Des Moines and Christy Plan of Omaha his assistants.

With the aid of Ceva Hanson, Newman Grove, Council secretary, and Barry Tuttle, Sioux Falls, S. D., Council off-campus director, they put the enthusiasm of youth to work in mapping plans.

"We'll make it a one-day affair," Herb said. "We've already obtained approval for dismissal of classes that afternoon. Beginning at 3 p.m.

we'll blanket the county with 250 to three hundred student solicitors. We expect to be finished by 8 p.m."

Plans were to canvass business houses and residences in Arlington, Kennard, Herman and Fort Calhoun as well as Blair.

Why the enthusiasm in tackling a usually thankless job?

Herb shrugged:

"They said they needed our help so we are giving it."

Church Investment Program Has College Payment Plan

Part of the new Investment and Loan Fund plan of The American Lutheran Church is a college education savings plan.

Through a single investment, or through specified annual installment, a future college student can be guaranteed one thousand dollars on his birthday in each of his college years.

Dr. George S. Schultz, executive secretary of the Church's Board of Trustees and manager of the fund, gave this example of how the college plan would work:

Investment of \$1,697.52 at the time of birth would, through the compounding of interest, guarantee four one-thousand-dollar checks on successive birthdays beginning at age 18.

The same result would accrue through an annual installment of \$136.01 beginning at birth.

Varying pre-determined amounts have been calculated to enable the plan to begin at any age.

Pastor Bollesen, formerly assistant pastor at Nazareth Lutheran Church, was the subject of an item in the Iowa District Bulletin.

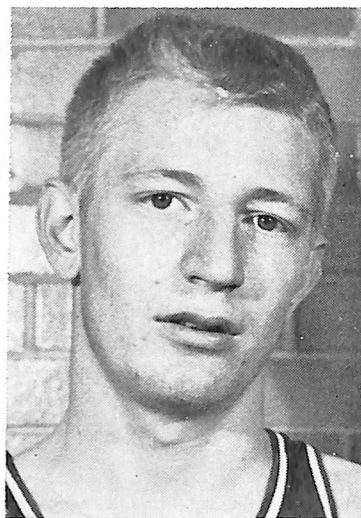
