Alumnus Wins Political Plum

In a contest regarded as a major upset in Wisconsin Democratic Party circles, alumnus Gunnar N. Mengers, Class of 1955, has been elected secretary of the Kenosha County unit of the party.

He ousted Harold (Red) Newton, described in a Kenosha newspaper as a power in Wisconsin Democratic politics for a quarter of a century.

Gunnar is an English instructor at Carthage College in Kenosha. Following his graduation from Dana he served in the Air Force for three years, then joined the editorial staff of The Omaha World-Herald. He left the newspaper to take his master's degree at the University of Nebraska.

Chicagoans Give Through Dana Club

The Chicago Dana Club has contributed a total of 493 dollars to the college to be used in furnishing a room in one of the new buildings.

Robert Steffensen, in a letter to Development Director Bo Weismann, said 50 persons were represented in the contribution total.

"I think we are all kind of surprised that we were able to obtain our first project goal in such a short time," Mr. Steffensen said.

"Much of the credit must go to Mr. M. P. Madsen, who put the challenge before a small group of Dana alumni," he continued. "If it were not for his inspiration I am positive that we would never have had the courage to start this project."

Seventy-five persons attended the fall banquet of the Chicago club October 17. The Dana Folk Dancers entertained.

Prof Arranging Vacation Tour

Dr. Allan Hauck, associate professor of Christianity and philosophy at Midland College, is arranging a 1966 summer vacation tour of the Middle East.

The two-week trip will include visits to Rome, Egypt, Lebanon, Syria, Jordan, Israel and Greece.

The tour leaves New York by jet June 9. The total cost including air transportation, hotel accommodations, meals and sight-seeing expenses is 875 dollars.

It will be Dr. Hauck's third trip to the Middle East. He spent the summer of 1960 studying there as a member of the New York University Biblical Workshop. Last year he served as a tour host. He may be reached for further information at 1640 North Monroe Street, Fremont 68025.

Viking Guard 'Star of Week'

Dana senior Ken Kemmish has been named a Nebraska college "Star of the Week" by The Omaha World-Herald.

The honor came after he scored 123 points in four consecutive games for an average of 53 per cent.

He opened the season with 37 points against Wayne State in a game Dana lost, 107 to 94. In Lincoln he scored 31 against Hastings, 27 against Nebraska Wesleyan and 28 against Chubbyville in the Midwest tournament. Dana lost the opener to Hastings, 76 to 71, then beat Wesleyan, 80 to 76, and dropped the final game against Chubbyville, a Lincoln AAU team, 98 to 87.

The win over Wesleyan was the first for Dana since the 1934-35 season.

Kemmish, a 5-10 guard from Persia, Ia., needs 445 points this year to top a school record of 444 set by Bill Davis in 1957. He scored 394 for a 17.1 average last year. A total near that this winter would boost him past the school career scoring record of 1,206, also held by Davis.

Although Kemmish is near two scoring records, his performance on the court is rivaled by other Vikings this year. Coach Dale Lemon noted that in Dana's 89-to-56 thrashing of Tarkio, Dean Krueger led the offense with 21 points. Kemmish shared the second highest mark of 17 points with Marv Enger.

Coach Lemon said the team is strong on rebounding and has more depth than last year.
