"The next 10 years are Dana's golden years of opportunity."

That prediction was made in 1956 by Luther Lincoln, Dana alumnus and former Speaker of the California Assembly, in a Homecoming talk.

Next November Mr. Lincoln will speak at another Dana Homecoming—and see that his prediction of golden years has come true.

He will speak the Saturday night of the Homecoming week end of November 4-6 at a recognition banquet for Dr. C. C. Madsen, who is marking his tenth year as president of Dana.

The dinner will be in the new campus center. Fittingly, the center, plus a new dormitory, will be dedicated that week end in a Friday afternoon ceremony.

The Homecoming accent this year is on teachers. All former students now in the teaching field are urged to return for the special observance.

A highlight will be an appearance, now being arranged, by Sam Levenson, teacher turned comedian.

Also of special interest to returning teachers—and to all Danians—will be a luncheon sponsored by the Alumni Association Saturday noon to honor two of the college's best-known personalities—Miss Elja McCullough and Miss Aagot Hoidahl.

Both are retiring.

Miss McCullough—or Miss Mac—has been in education since 1909. She began teaching in rural schools in Ewing, Neb., and has at various times been a county superintendent, high school principal and college teacher.

She came to Dana in 1951 as dean of women and served until 1953, when she assumed fulltime teaching duties in the elementary education department.

Miss Hoidahl completes 18 years of service as head librarian.

She is a graduate of Stevens Point State College, Wis., and the University of Minnesota. She began teaching in 1921 and served in several high school and colleges before coming to Dana in 1948.

After this last issue of the Review for the 1965-66 school year Mr. Andersen will become editor.

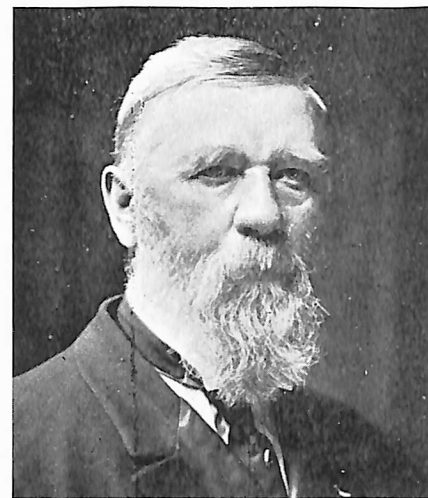

The Presidents' Room on the south side of the second floor will serve as a conference-seminar room and general reception area for campus visitors.

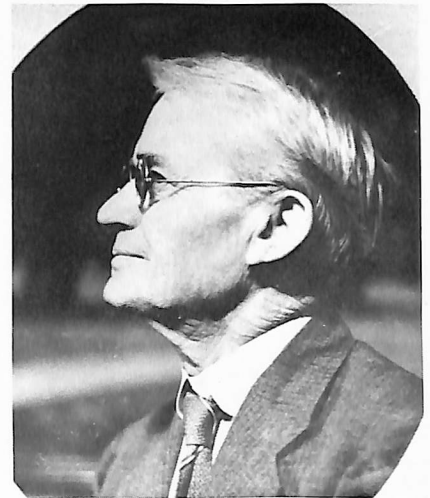

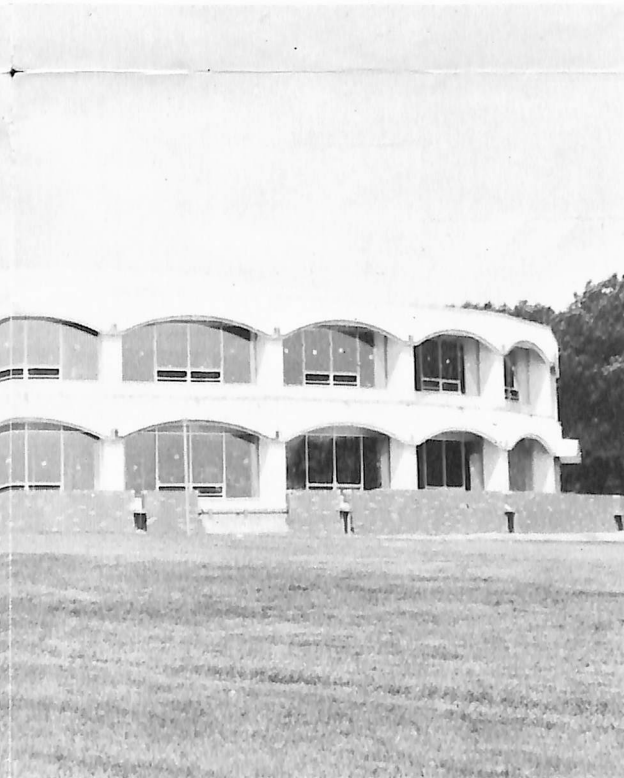
