

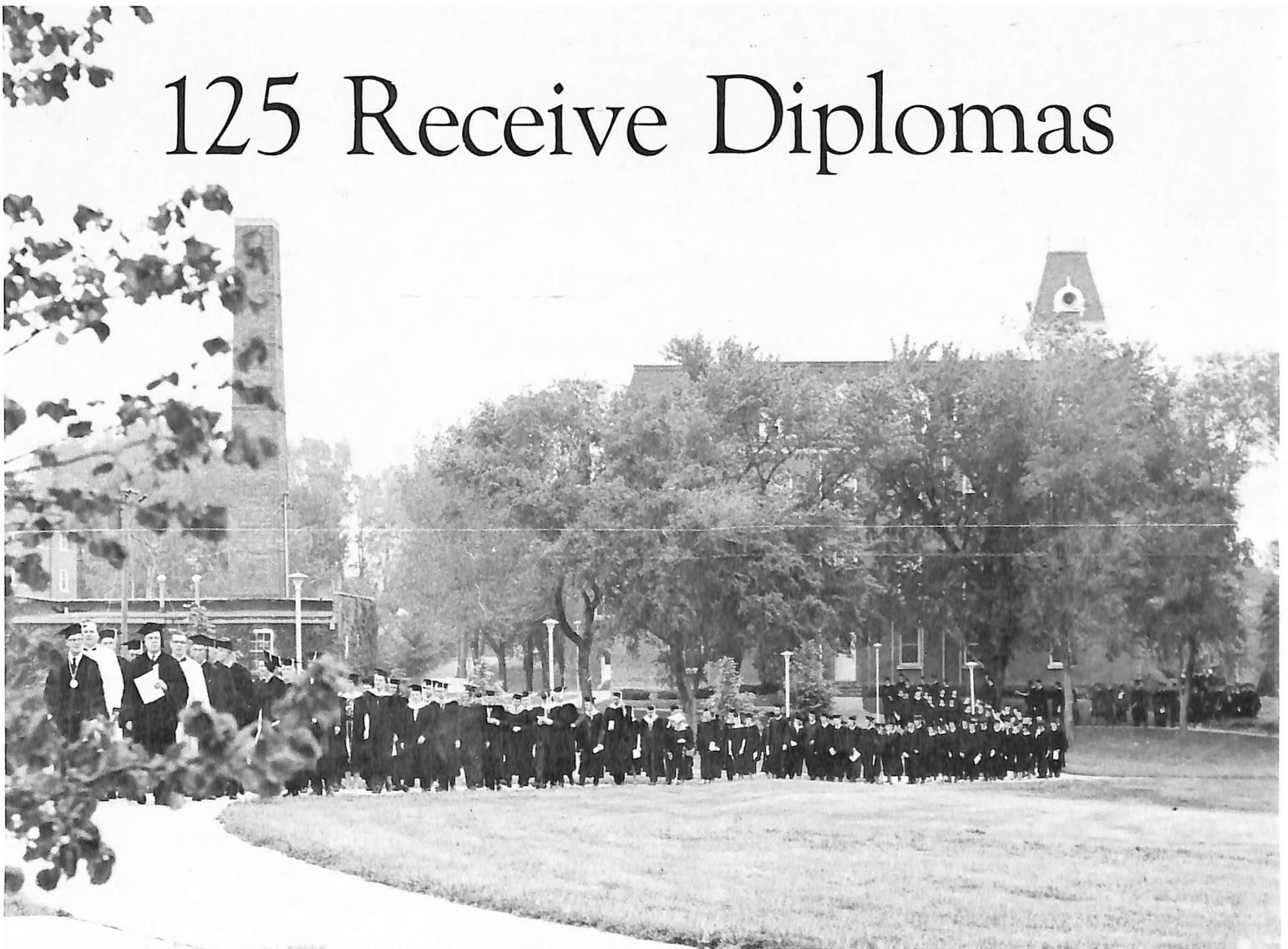

## 125 Receive Diplomas



A crowd of more than 3,000 witnessed a class of 125 receive diplomas at Commencement ceremonies, May 28, in Borup Coliseum.

The Class of '67 numbered two less than last year and four less than the Class of '65 which set a record with 129 graduates.

Highlights of the Commencement program included the presentation of the third annual College-Community Service Award. This year's recipient was Roy Brown, one of Blair's leading citizens who has served as the chairman of the Dana Parents' Organiza-

tion for the past four years.

Quarter-Century of Service Awards were presented to Professor Paul E. Neve, Professor Paul O. Peterson, Dr. Elmer M. Rasmussen and Professor F. William Thomsen.

The Commencement address, entitled "The Think Factory," was given by Dr. George Schultz, National Director of LIFE (Lutheran Ingathering For Education, the Church's challenge for 1967).

Dr. Schultz pointed out to the graduates that "... in your educational experiences to date, you have been

more the reporter than the philosopher. Now the task really begins of organizing the pieces of knowledge into new patterns, of discovering that scraps of information assumed to be unrelated because they come from different courses with different catalogue numbers, are significantly related. This is a part of assimilation, which is a prerequisite for the kind of a think factory for which your generation is destined."

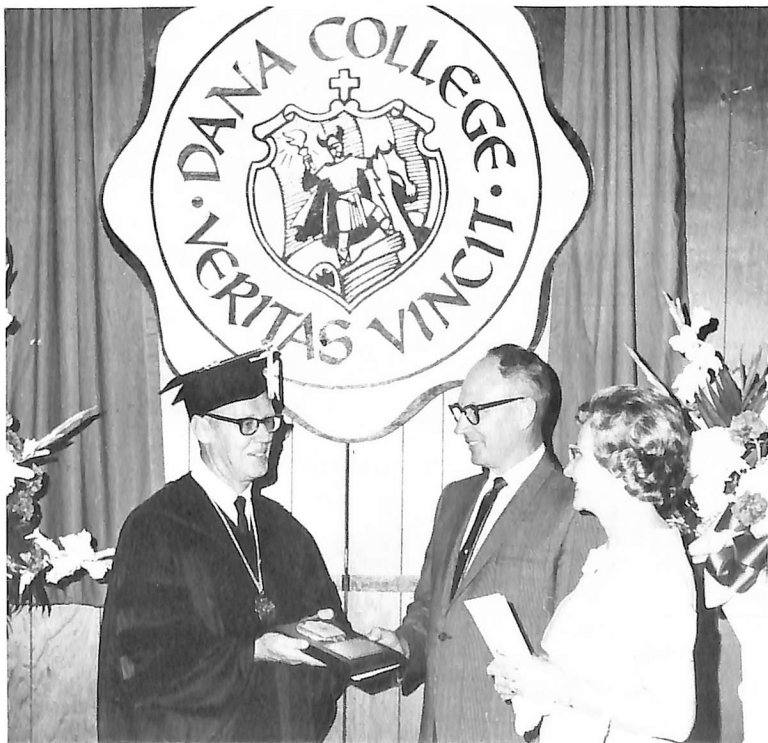
## Service Award

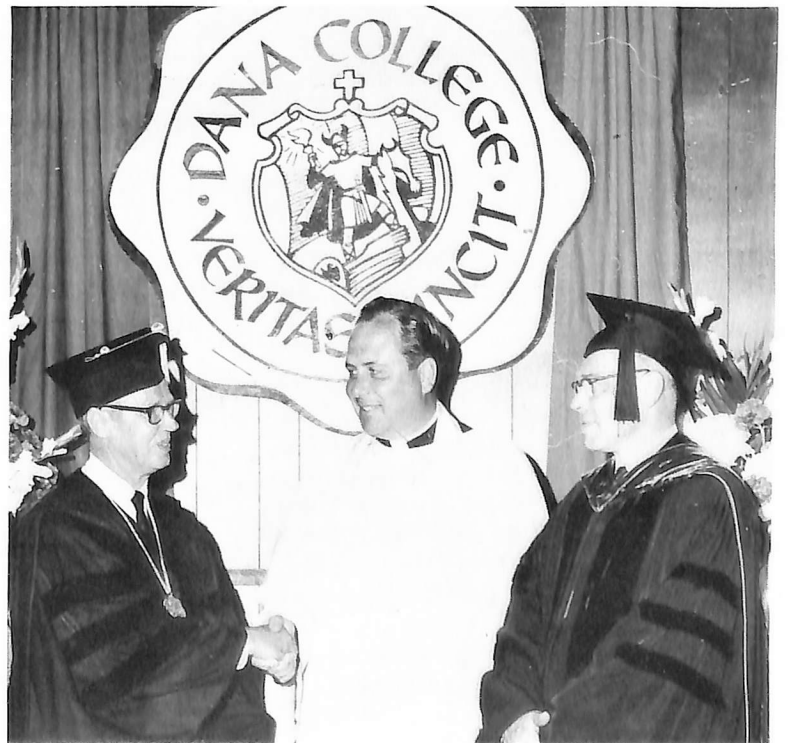
Mr. and Mrs. Brown's son, Tim, and their daughter-in-law, Lu, were members of the graduating class.

society's thinking today is leech-like, sucking little scraps of thought from other people, forgetting in the process that these scraps, like little waves, only ruffle the surface. But it's the tides, not the waves, that are recorded on the pages of history; much of the thinking is chameleon-like, reflecting the person last talked to, forgetting the art of disagreeing agreeably; . . . much of the thinking is sheep-like, a marvelous follow-the-leader technique for the multiplication of ignorance . . . and much of the thinking is salmon-like, a persistent going against the tide in a false assumption that to differ is smart, intellectual or sophisticated. None of these animal traits will meet the challenge of your day.

"Up to this point I appear to be espousing the cause of rationalism that insists that reason is the supreme authority and even a sole guide to religious truth. But I am not.

"Fundamental to all I have said is the proposition that sound conclusions are dependent upon accurate and complete premises. God, who gives us the ability to think, supplies the basic premises in His Word. I cannot imagine you graduating from Dana College without having that conviction.

"Whatever your daily pursuit in life shall be, a most appropriate prayer for the beginning of each day is 'Sanctify us, O Lord, in Thy Truth: Thy Word is Truth.' With this prayer on your lips, you can find treasures of inestimable worth in your Think Factory."
