Homecoming 1968 - Nov. 1-2-3

"Viking Days," the theme for Homecoming 1968, will take place during the first weekend in November.

The Homecoming Committee has extended a cordial invitation to all alumni, parents and other friends of the College to attend as many of the Homecoming Weekend activities as possible.

The main program of the weekend will be the "Viking Revue" which will include performances by alumni, students, faculty and a surprise personality. This program will be presented on both Friday and Saturday evening so all Homecomers will have an opportunity to attend.

The Saturday noon Alumni Luncheon will be held at the new Fiesta Grande restaurant in Blair. There will be no charge for this informal luncheon other than the Homecoming registration fee.

On Saturday afternoon a "fired-up" Viking team will meet the Bulldogs of Yankton College on Viking Field.

The Homecoming dance will begin at 9 p.m. Saturday evening. It will be formal—black tie only! For those not interested in attending the dance, other activities will be available. The dining room in the Campus Center will be converted into the "Casino Royale" where various games will be available, refreshments on sale and tables available for casual conversation. At the Casino Royale, either the formal dress of the dance or clothes worn to the "Viking Revue" will be acceptable.

Two special ceremonies on Sunday afternoon will climax the Homecoming Weekend—the laying of the cornerstone at the new Dana Library and the dedication of the new campus entrance known as James R. Hansen Memorial Road. The road is in memory of the

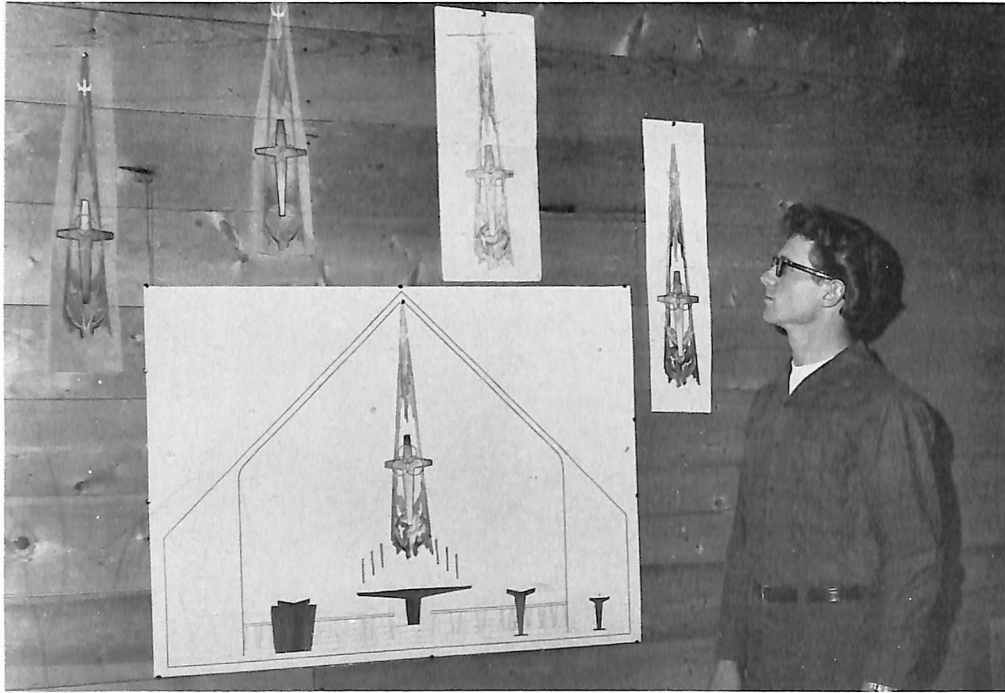

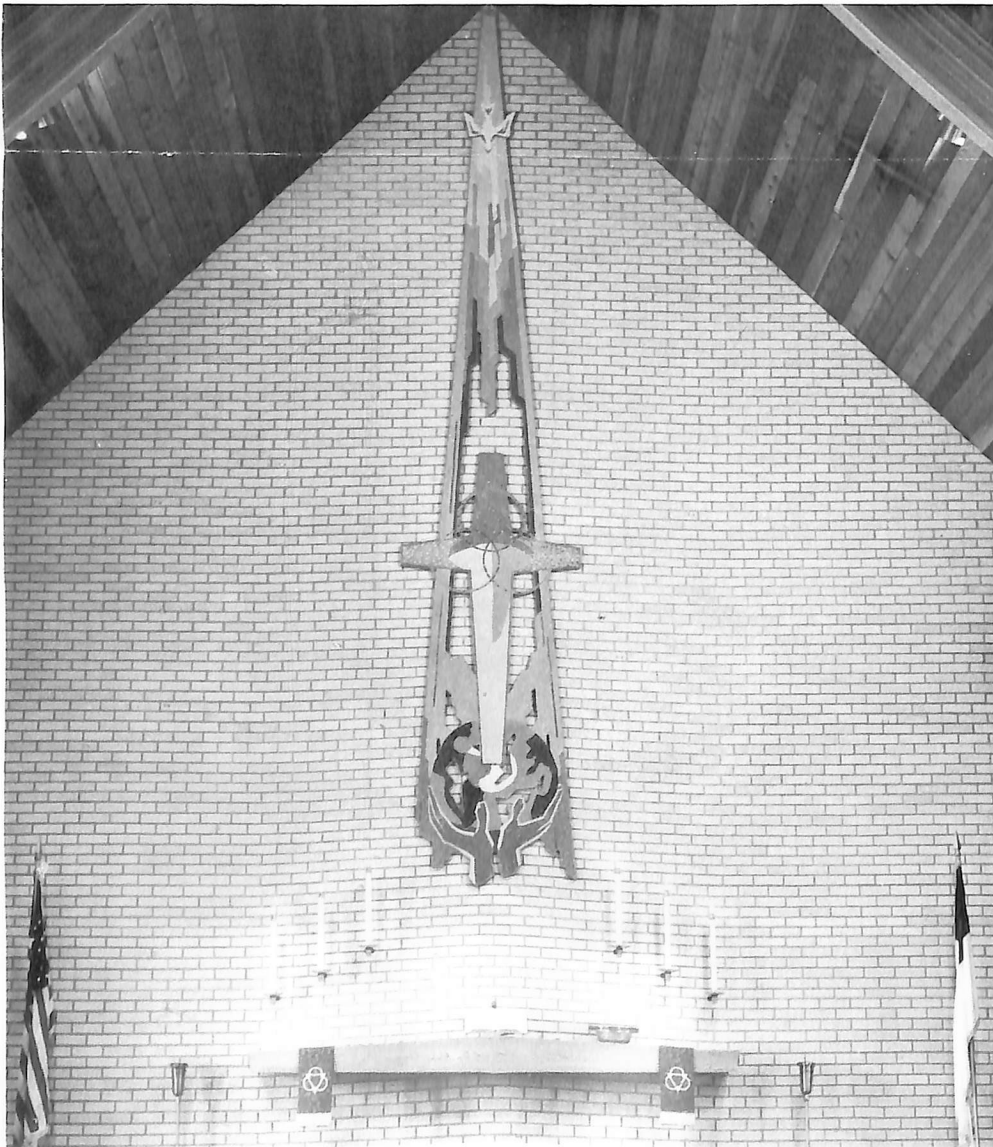
