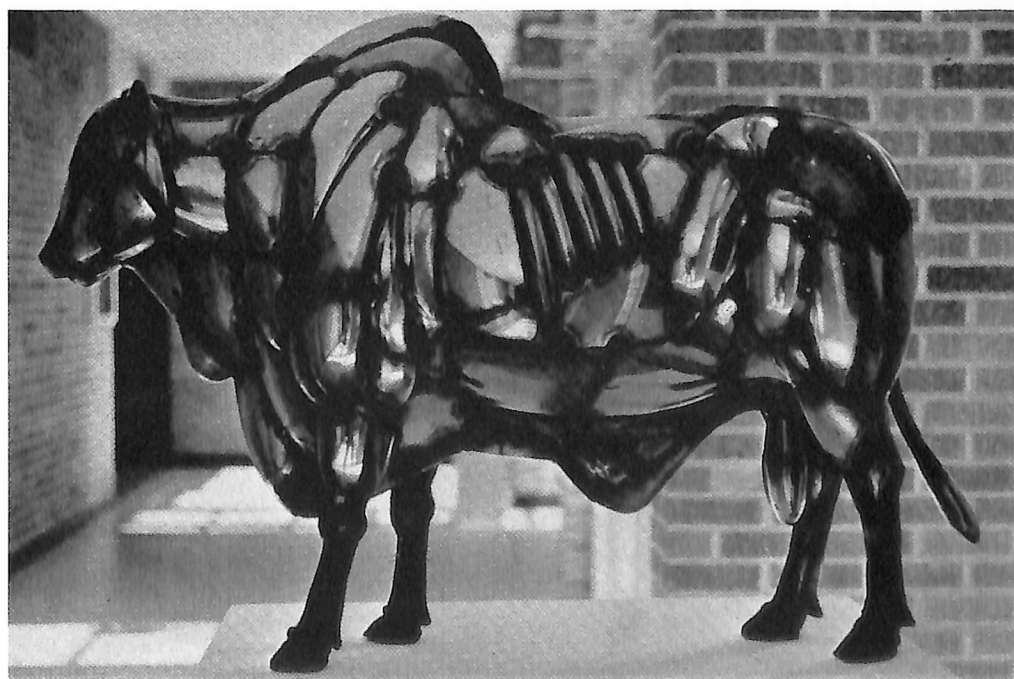
Mr. Peterson is currently artist-in-residence at Bemidji State College, Bemidji, Minn.
