'Earth Day' Set For April 22 At Dana

Demonstrations at a nuclear power plant and a feedlot are among the activities planned by Dana students and faculty members as part of a nationwide "environmental teach-in" on April 22.

The main purpose of the program is to make persons in the area more aware of environmental pollution, according to George Grube, associate professor of Biology at Dana, who is coordinating the event. Grube said that hundreds of other colleges and universities are also planning to participate in the April 22 "Earth Day" program.

Grube explained that tentative plans call for students to demonstrate at the Omaha Public Power District's Fort Calhoun nuclear power plant and at the Blair Cattle Co.'s feedlot. The purpose of the demonstration is not to condemn the companies but to focus attention on the potential dangers of thermal and radiation pollution.

Other events scheduled during the "Earth Day" include lectures, discussions and a film on the effects of nuclear war. Speakers include Dana students and professors and visitors such as James Malkowski, director of the Fontenelle Forest in Omaha, Eugene Solomon of the Soil Conservation Service and Dr. Donald McGee of Creighton University College of Medicine.

All events of the "Earth Day" are open to the public at no admission charge. A detailed schedule of events is available upon request from the Public Relations Office at Dana.

Madsen To Head NICF

President C. C. Madsen was recently elected Chairman of the Board of the Nebraska Independent College Foundation.

The NICF is an organization made up of eight Nebraska church-related colleges committed to raising funds for those non tax-supported colleges.

Death Takes Former Student And Respected Missionary To Japan



Barbara Magee Wallace, wife of kidney victim George I. Wallace, died in a Portland, Maine, hospital on Sunday, February 23, following a brief illness.

REVIEW readers will recall a story carried late last year concerning George I. Wallace, a Dana senior, who was forced to drop out of school because of a serious kidney ailment. George left Dana in April of last year and went to Peter Bent Brigham Hospital in Boston where it became evident he would have to receive a kidney transplant. Barbara, who was teaching at Morton Junior High School in Omaha, left her position to join her husband in Boston.

Originally, George was scheduled to have his kidneys removed in September of 1969. Another operation for the removal of his parathyroid glands necessitated the postponement of the kidney operation. The kidney operation was rescheduled for November but a case of double pneumonia again forced postponement. The date was

again set—this time for December 10—but a case of hepatitis and an eventual liver surgery made it impossible. The kidney transplant is now scheduled for a date in the future as soon as George is physically ready for it.

In a letter to Dr. Madsen dated January, 1970, Barbara expressed hope for the future in these words: "We still keep up our courage and pray for better months ahead—with a summer filled with fishing, boating, swimming and loafing."

During the past months Barbara has been teaching in a Brunswick, Maine, high school and spent her weekends with George in Boston.

Missionary Dies

Dr. J. M. T. Winther, 95-year-old missionary of the American Lutheran Church, died in Japan on March 3, 71 years after he had gone there as a missionary.

Dr. Winther had been closely associated with Dana, Trinity Seminary and the United Evangelical Lutheran Church since coming to the U.S. from Denmark in 1896. After two years in this country, one of which was spent at Trinity Seminary, he left for his first mission assignment in Japan.

His career in Japan was interrupted twice—once between 1921 and 1927 when he went to Denmark to serve a congregation and again when World War II forced him to spend the years 1941 and 1950 in the United States.

When he asked to return to Japan after the war at the age of 76, he was told he would have to do so "at his own risk and responsibility." Although there was a limitation of 70 years as the top age of anyone returning to Japan, Gen. Douglas MacArthur, Japan's occupation governor, made an exception and granted permission for him to return.
