Simon Seeking Nomination For Governor of Illinois

Lt. Governor Paul Simon of Illinois, well known Dana alumnus, has launched a campaign for the Democratic nomination for Governor in next year's election.

Early last fall, Simon received unprecedented support for the nomination by the powerful Illinois AFL-CIO. The move was the first time the Illinois labor federation has endorsed a state candidate more than a year before an election and prior to slate-making.

Tuition-Grant Bill to Be Considered by State Legislators

The introduction of legislation to create a tuition grant program in Nebraska is currently being considered.

The tuition grant program is a State program which provides direct financial aid to qualified and needy students in order to enable them to attend the college of their choice. Thirty-five states have already adopted some form of aid program and twenty-three of them are patterned after the tuition grant program. Iowa, for example, has such a program and legislators have termed it "the greatest educational bargain in the State."

If established in Nebraska, the tuition grant program would not only give students a choice of institutions, but would help to strengthen the independent colleges and universities and lessen the eventual burden on the State's taxpayers.

Under the plan now being considered, residents of Nebraska who attend accredited independent colleges and universities in the State and who demonstrate a need for financial assistance, would be eligible for a tuition grant. The grant could be in the amount of part or all of the difference between tuition at the State university and the college or university of the student's choice.

Several years ago TIME announced plans to aid higher education in the United States by offering free advertising space to any college or university submitting copy and layout which met the magazine's rigid standards. A number of colleges received the full page space before the offer expired in early 1970.

The Dana ad, which features the College's Liberal Arts Reading Program, was prepared by Mr. Phil Pagel, Director of Public Relations. Pagel submitted the ad in December of last year, unaware of the fact that the free advertising offer had expired. The TIME staff evidently considered the ad to be of superior quality however, and despite the fact that no new ads were being accepted, they agreed to prepare it for publication "as space became available."

Shortly before Christmas, President Mezoff received a telegram stating the Dana ad was scheduled for publication in the January 3 issue (West-Central Edition) of TIME. Mezoff commented on the news by saying, "It's a tremendous way to end 1971 and an even better way to begin 1972."

A new scholarship, primarily for students currently enrolled at Dana, has been established by the College faculty and staff. Known as the "Friends of Dana Scholarship" it will be awarded on the basis of need, academic standing and citizenship.
