Several changes in the weekend lineup have been made since the September REVIEW reached you:

—The Friday evening entertainment will feature the "Viking Revue—Carnival Style." A series of vaudeville-type acts in a carnival atmosphere will be staged in Alumni Memorial Auditorium beginning at 8:00 p.m. The Coronation of the 1972 Homecoming Queen will also take place during the course of the "Revue" program.

—KDCV-FM, Dana's new radio station, began program testing in early September and by Homecoming should be on a regular broadcast schedule. The station will be officially opened during brief ceremonies on Friday afternoon beginning at 3:00 p.m. in the KDCV-FM studios on fourth floor of Pioneer Memorial. Reunions for the classes of 1947, 1962 and 1967 will be held as scheduled on Saturday morning. Information concerning the exact location of each reunion coffee hour will be available in Homecoming Headquarters in the Campus Center.

—The concert by Earl Wrightson and Lois Hunt, "The American Musical Theater—On the Lighter Side," will be held in Borup Coliseum at 8:30 p.m. on Saturday evening. The concert will feature selections from the American musical theater including "Camelot," "Man of LaMancha," "Porgy and Bess" and many others. Following the concert, former members of the Dana

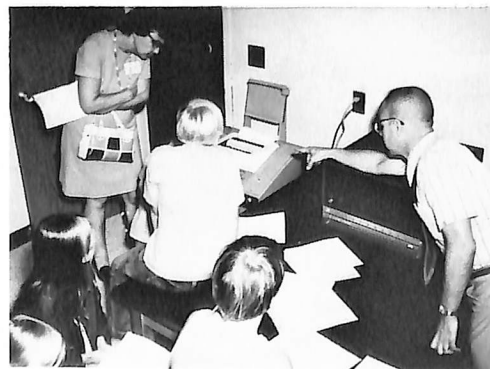

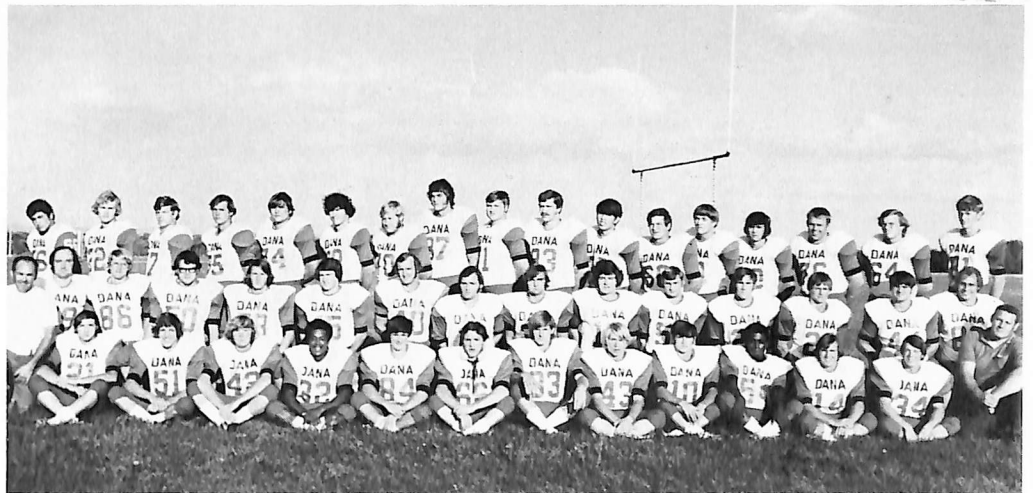
