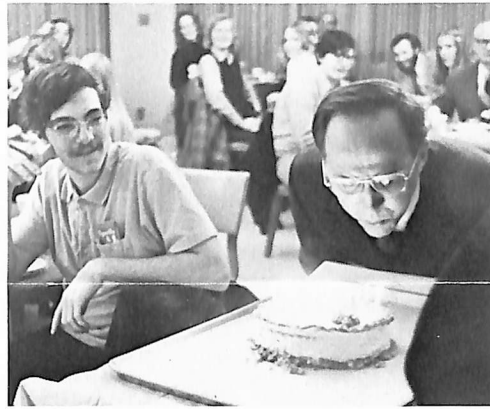

Former Dana-Trinity President Dies

The eighth president of Dana College and Trinity Seminary, the Rev. Theodore M. Hansen, died at Hastings, Nebraska, early in February, at the age of 87. Funeral services for the former president were held in Ruskin, Nebraska. He is survived by his wife, three sons and one daughter.

T. M. Hansen was a product of the institutions he was destined to serve as president having been prepared for the ministry at Dana and Trinity. Following several years of pastoral experience, he was selected by the synodical convention for special training to fit him for a position as teacher in the seminary. He returned to Blair in 1922 and took up his teaching work at Trinity. Then, in 1925, following the resignation of three Trinity professors including the president, T. M. Hansen was named acting president of the two institutions. He was elected to the regular presidency in 1926 and served in that office until 1929 when he resigned to accept a call to the parish ministry in Denmark, Wisconsin. He continued his service to the school in later years by accepting the post of Chairman of the Board of Trustees.

Dana Players to Present Children's Drama for County Area Schools

Several thousand Washington County elementary children will be coming to the campus in early March for the Theater Department's annual children's play. Presented as a service to the area communities, the children's play has become one of the most popular theater attractions at Dana.

According to Mr. Dennis Henneman, Director of Theater, this year's play, "The Ransom of Red Chief," will be presented in Alumni Memorial, March 14 and 15. Invitations are now being sent to all elementary schools in the county and capacity audiences are expected at each performance.

Dana Basketball Midseason Report

The Dana College cagers, sporting an overall 5-10 record and a 0-4 conference mark, have completed nearly two-thirds of their 23-game 1972-73 basketball schedule. All but two of the remaining eight games are conference contests and the Viking squad is expected to improve markedly on its so far winless conference record.

The Vikings have displayed a much improved, well rounded attack this season and continue to hound their opponents with traditional relentless defense. Strong points, personnel-wise, have proven to be greatly improved efforts from 6'6" sophomore center Jim Huseman from Alta, Iowa, and a more consistent scoring attack from 6'6" senior Terry Miner from Cedar Rapids, Iowa, who is second in total points scored with 247 through 15 games. Perennial point leader Bryan Traylor, a 6'2" junior forward-guard from Council Bluffs, has pitched in 296 points to lead the team average-wise by scoring at a 19.2 point per game clip. Leading a strong rebounding team this season is 6'6" senior Gary Bott, from Millard, Nebraska. Gary has grabbed 175 errant shots and has compiled an 11-per-game average through 15 games.

Perhaps the most disappointing aspect to date has been that the majority of the Vikings' losses have been by rather small point spreads, due mainly to somewhat poor shooting from the free-throw line and an inability to put an opponent away once a lead is established.

Coach Jerry Rainforth has expressed his Viking squad, however, and expects them to perform well in the home stretch this season.

"Levels of Giving" Marks First Year With 261 Members

February, 1973, marks the first anniversary of the creation of Dana's three levels of giving—the Century Club, President's Society and Tower Circle. After only one year, membership in the three levels has grown to 261, representing a total of \$55,898.93 paid or pledged to the Dana Foundation.

Although the calendar indicates these three levels have been in existence for a year, charter membership will remain open through the month of May, 1973. That means there's still time for you to join with the other 261 friends of Dana who have committed themselves to a definite level of giving over a one-year period.

Charter membership in the Century Club is based on a gift of \$100 or more received before May 31, 1973. Membership in succeeding years is based on an annual gift of \$100 received during any fiscal year, June 1-May 31. There are now 211 members.

The President's Society, with a current membership of 23, is also still offering charter memberships based on an annual gift to the College of \$500 or more. Membership in succeeding years is based on the continuation of the \$500 gift.

With 27 members to date, the Tower Circle is actively seeking charter members based on an annual gift of \$1,000 or more received by May 31, 1973. Membership in succeeding years is based on repeating that level of giving.
