## Dana Staff Honored



Approximately 150 Dana faculty-staff members and their spouses were guests of the Board of Regents at an Appreciation Dinner held on campus in early May.

The dinner, the first of its kind at Dana, was planned to express the appreciation of the Regents for the dedication and years of service given to the College by the staff. Regent Margaret Fischer of Omaha delivered the official expression of appreciation.

Plaques were presented to thirty-one staff members who have completed at least ten years of service to Dana. Further recognition was given to several staff members who have been at Dana for twenty-five years or more.

President and Mrs. Mezoff also received an expression of appreciation and support from the Regents in the form of a Viking ship — complete with an "explore Dana" motto. The gift was particularly appropriate in view of the Mezoff's planned trip to Denmark later this summer.

# Membership Increases in Dana's Three Levels of Giving

Total membership in Dana's three levels of giving, The Century Club, The President's Society and The Tower Circle, has increased somewhat over the number of charter memberships issued during the previous year.

According to Development Office figures, a total of 358 memberships in the three levels were issued between June 1, 1973 and May 30, 1974 as compared to a total of 303 charter memberships in the first year of the program.

The Development Office also reports a total increase of \$36,973.00 in cash and pledges received from all

sources between June 1, 1973 and April 30, 1974. This increase was due to the added support received from friends of the College, parents, Danish-Americans, alumni and Blair area business and professional people.

Of particular importance to the College's continuing campaign for funds is the fact that alumni giving in 1973-74 increased some 32% over the previous year.

## "Explore Dana" Campaign

That bumper sticker inviting you to "EXPLORE DANA" on a car whizzing past on the Interstate is one part of an extensive advertising campaign conducted this Spring in the metropolitan Omaha area.

The slogan "EXPLORE DANA" also appeared on 13 billboards, on back-of-bus signs, on buttons, and in newspaper ads and radio announcements. The objective of the low-keyed campaign was to make Dana's name better known in the Omaha area and to suggest indirectly to high school and college students an alternative to attending the University of Nebraska at Omaha (UNO), with its large classes and parking problems.

Guest speaker Norman Bansen of Dana's English Department described life at Dana during the past year. Mr. Paul Strand of the Development Office and Mr. Richard Showers, Director of Admissions, also spoke.

The Chicago Club will again present a \$200 scholarship to a Dana student from the Illinois District.

## Honors and Awards

CHARLES O. MOREHOUSE ('41), guidance counselor at the Kimball (Nebr.) County High School, has received a 1974 Knights of Ak-Sar-Ben Good Neighbor Award for his work in the special needs of school children, for his contributions to his profession, and for his service with statewide groups. Mr. Morehouse started a hearing conservation program in his District, the first in Nebraska, and was chairman of the project. Three years ago Governor Exon appointed him to serve on the Public Employees Retirement Board. In 1973 he won the Counselor of the Year Award given by the Nebraska Personnel and Guidance Association; he is on the board of that organization and also on the board of the American School Counselors Association. A model Career Education project that he wrote for kindergarten through the 12th grade was approved and funded by the U.S. Office of Education for the Kimball school. He was one of 93 individuals in Nebraska and Western Iowa singled out for Ak-Sar-Ben recognition. His wife is the former MARY JANE HANSEN ('44); they have three sons, John, Frederic, and Tom.

# CAMPUS NOTES



Nostalgia was the order of the day for two recent campus events — ballroom dancing and a ragtime concert. Ballroom dancing made its comeback when 52 students learned the foxtrot, the rumba, the swing, the cha-cha, and the waltz. Organized by Frank Hengeveld, Associate Professor of Chemistry, the session was taught by two professional dance instructors from Omaha. Students were enthusiastic about the lesson.

The "Three Generations of Ragtime" concert, featuring a piano trio, drew a crowd of 500. The Student Activities Board sponsored the premier performance of a five-state tour by the pianists.

Dr. and Mrs. C. C. Madsen celebrated their 40th wedding anniversary and the 40th anniversary of his ordination at a open house on the campus June 2.

The Rev. F. W. Thomsen of Dana's Art Department has been commissioned to do a mosaic mural for the community building of a Housing for the Elderly project in North Platte, Nebraska. His plans for the Black Elk-Neihardt Park, described in the Spring Review, have been given unanimous endorsement by the Nebraska American Revolution Bicentennial Commission.

George Grube, Associate Professor of Biology, is a newly elected member of the Executive Committee of the Omaha-based Quality Environmental Council. The Council is a part of the national organization of the Consortium of Regional Environmental Education Councils (CREEC). He also recently attended a training program on water quality control at the Beech Training Institute in Overland Park, Kansas. The program was sponsored by the Conservation Foundation and funded by the Environmental Protection Agency. Mr. Grube participated as a panelist on a session about the impact of major waterways modifications.

Harold Moseley, social work instructor, has been appointed to the Citizens' Advisory Committee on Mental Health and Alcoholism Treatment Programs for the Immanuel Medical Center in Omaha.

Dr. Delvin Hutton, Associate Professor of Greek and Religion, is spending four weeks at the Hebrew Union College in Jerusalem as a participant in the Summer Seminar in Israel on the Jewish Origins of Christianity. The seminar is co-sponsored by Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion and Duke University. He will also attend the international meeting of the Society of New Testament Studies in Sigtuna, Sweden, before returning to this country.

Dr. Larrie Stone ('57), Professor of Biology, presided over the 84th annual meeting of the Nebraska Academy of Sciences at Nebraska Wesleyan University in Lincoln on April 19 and 20. He was elected to serve a three-year term as a Councillor on the Executive Committee of the Nebraska Academy.

Dr. Paul Emmerich, Associate Professor of English, has had his computer program DACBAP (Dana College Basic Algorithm Processor) accepted for inclusion in the program library of the Data General Corporation User's Group. Two other programs on Palaung pronouns and haiku will be included in a volume of nonnumerical computer applications published by the Philadelphia School District.

Stan Johnson, a junior at Dana majoring in chemistry, has isolated a new strain of bacteria (fortunately harmless) from a hot water tank in the Dana maintenance building. He presented a paper on his discovery entitled "Thermophilic Bacteria in Tap Hot Water: A New Isolate," at the spring meeting of the Nebraska Academy of Science in Lincoln; co-author of the paper is Dr. Robert Ramaley of the University of Nebraska Medical School, who directed Mr. Johnson's research during the 1974 Dana Interim.

Student body officers for the coming year are Kent Day, a sophomore from Sioux Falls, South Dakota, President; Layne Johnson, a junior from Nerstrand, Minnesota, Vice-President; Rana Chapman, a junior from Anita, Iowa, Secretary; and George Hertz, a sophomore from Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, Treasurer.

As a public service, KDCV-FM, Dana's radio station, broadcast a series of "meet the candidates" interviews of those running for office in the April 2 Blair election.

Dr. Earl Mezoff, President of Dana, has been elected Vice-President of NETCHE (Nebraska Educational Television Council for Higher Education) for the 1974-75 year. NETCHE is a state-wide organization with representatives from all of Nebraska's public, private, technical, and community colleges. The organization produces television courses for use by its member colleges to supplement work offered on the individual campuses.

At a recent meeting of the Public Relations Advisory Council (PRAC) of The American Lutheran Church Colleges in Minneapolis, Mr. Richard V. Showers, Director of Admissions at Dana, was elected Vice-President of the organization for the 1974-75 year. The position also carries the title of President-Elect for 1975-76. Membership in PRAC includes personnel from the twelve colleges of The American Lutheran Church involved in alumni relations, development, financial aid, public relations, and admissions.

The initial meeting of the Dana College District Task Force on relationships between the College and the Central District was held on campus April 19 and 20. This task force was jointly appointed by Bishop Archie Madsen and Dr. Mezoff; it will concern itself with developing closer relationships between the College and the District.

The Dana Chapter of the American Scandinavian Foundation sponsored an exhibit from April 28 through May 17 on the life and work of Carl Sandburg. The exhibit featured a series of photographs of Sandburg by his famous brother-in-law photographer, Edward Steichen, and recordings of the poet reading his own stories and poetry. The display was prepared by the National Park Service and circulated in cooperation with the American Scandinavian Foundation.

Dr. Einer Juel of Atlantic, Iowa, a physician and member of the Dana Board of Regents, presented a program entitled "Voyage into Darkness" at Dana on April 30. His presentation consisted of slides and movies he had taken in Africa during the recent solar eclipse.

A special two-week course in the study of radiation phenomena and their side effects was given at Dana from April 29 through May 10. The course was developed by the Oak Ridge Associated Universities and the Atomic Energy Commission and consisted of lectures and laboratory sessions in a mobile laboratory provided by the AEC. Dana and Midland College faculty and students participated in the program.

Under the auspices of the American Chemical Society's Visiting Scientist Program, Dr. R. J. Kern of Monsanto recently made three presentations on the campus. An organic chemist, he talked on "Unique Aspects of Industrial Chemistry," "Managing the Use of a Technical Education," and "Problems of Society and the Chemistry-Based Corporation."

A well-attended two-day symposium on the "Charismatic Movement" was held at Dana on March 24 and 25. Designed to take an in-depth look at the charismatic phenomenon which seems to be on the rapid upswing in this country, the symposium featured two guest speakers who have had personal associations with the charismatic experience. The speakers, the Rev. Robert Ellison of Omaha's Calvary Lutheran Church and Dr. Lee Snook, Associate Professor of Theology at Luther Theological Seminary in St. Paul, Minnesota, exchanged views on the movement through a series of dialogues. Both speakers also visited classes and met informally with students.

Sol (Gipson) Bird Mockicin ('64) was on the campus May 9 and 10 to lecture on the topic "The Native American and Dana College." He is a member of the faculty and Director of the Indian Studies Program at Augustana College, Sioux Falls, South Dakota; Chairman of the South Dakota Indian Education Program; a member of the Coordinating Committee on National Crises for The American Lutheran Church; and a consultant in Indian affairs.

Dana was host recently to two district conventions of The American Lutheran Church. Approximately 500 representatives of the Central District, from Nebraska, Kansas, Missouri, Colorado, and Oklahoma, met on the campus from May 29 through June 1. Central District Bishop Archie Madsen ('49) of Denver, Colorado, presided, with Dr. David Preus, President of The American Lutheran Church, giving the keynote address.

A week later some 700 delegates, this time from the Iowa District, met here from June 7 through 9. Dr. J. Elmo Agrimson, Bishop of the Southeastern Minnesota District, was the main speaker.

A new Dana scholarship has recently been established in memory of a well-known Dana alumnus, Anchor "Buck" Sorensen. The scholarship was made possible through gifts from Sorensen's family and friends. It will be presented annually to a Dana sophomore, junior or senior student with a grade point average of 6.0 or better.

## Human Rights and Concerns Activities

What are today's most important human issues and problems? Chairmen of the student government's Human Rights and Concerns (HRC) committee — Nancy Carlsen the first semester and Al Hanson and Mary Jo Henriksen the second semester — asked themselves this question and answered it by scheduling programs and activities on women's issues, criminal and penal reform, spiritual emphasis, science, death and dying, educational trends, politics, minorities, and volunteer work.

Speakers, performers, and programs, sponsored or co-sponsored by the student-financed committee, have included a political life seminar, Dennis Banks of the American Indian Movement, Art Simon ('52) on world hunger, the seminar on the charismatic movement, Professor Dale Johnson of Rutgers University on the situation in Chile and a Chilean folksinger, a performance by Omaha's Afro Academy of Dramatic Arts directed by Harry Eure, a concert by Fajilawa of the Afro-American Academy of Dramatic Arts, and a lecture on exploration of the Antarctic by Dr. Samuel Treves of the Geology Department of the University of Nebraska at Lincoln, who has recently returned from his seventh research expedition of that area.

Activities sponsored by HRC include "Viewpoints," held every Wednesday noon with students and faculty meeting to discuss current events and issues, a campus cleanup, a recycling day for the community of Blair, and participation in the Heart Fund Drive and local Blood-mobile program. The committee also subscribed to magazines and newspapers for the Campus Center.

## VIKING SPORTS

### BASEBALL

The Vikings ended the 73-74 baseball season with a 23-14 record — an all-time high number of wins during a single season. Their conference record of 6-4 was good enough to give Dana a tie for second place in the Nebraska Intercollegiate Athletic Conference.

At the close of the season the Vikings also participated in their sixth consecutive NAIA District Play-off's.

Head coach Dale Lemon reported that seventeen members of the squad earned baseball letters including 3 seniors, 5 juniors, 5 sophomores and 4 freshmen. While the 3 graduating seniors will be missed next season, the fact that a talented group of underclassmen also lettered this season means the outlook for 74-75 is good.

Dana's star center-fielder, Steve Woitock, a senior from Racine, Wisconsin, was named the most valuable player on the squad for the second year in a row. In addition to breaking numerous Dana baseball records, Woitock was named to both the All-Conference and the All-District NAIA teams. Woitock was signed by the Kansas City Royals during the February draft and reported for practice with Sarasota of the Gulf States League in early June.

Another Dana stand-out, Barry Olson, a sophomore from Minnetonka, Minnesota gave Woitock a close race in the voting for year-end honors. Olson set 7 seasonal pitching records and was also given All-Conference honors. Another senior receiving honors this year was Jerry Wilson of Persia, Iowa. He supplied 3 game-ending hits during

the season and on three other occasions kept game winning rallies alive with hits. Wilson was also named to the All-Conference team.

### TENNIS

The Viking tennis team developed into a well balanced unit during the course of the season and displayed consistent strength in the singles and doubles. They defeated Midland, Wayne and Faith College while losing to Nebraska Wesleyan, Doane and Concordia. Five team members lettered for the season.

### GOLF

Inconsistency in scoring on the part of the Dana golfers led to a disappointing season. One bright spot however was the fact that Jim Larson of Cottage Grove, Wisconsin won the fifth medalist spot in the All-Conference match. Five team members earned letters.

### SPECIAL HONORS

The Dana coaching staff selected Bryan Traylor, a senior from Council Bluffs, Iowa and Jerry Wilson, a senior from Persia, Iowa, recipients of the Coach Rufus Olson Award for their dependability, versatility and excellence as members of the 1973-74 baseball and basketball teams.

Walt Schacht, junior from Neligh, Nebraska, earned the 1973-74 Scholar Athlete Award with a grade point average of 8.74.

# Alumni Council Elections

Because the terms of several Alumni Council members are expiring, a nominations committee appointed by Alumni President Bud Robinson, consisting of Ann Harms George, chairman; Phil Pagel; Barbara Wolf; Jari Uecker Kolterman; and Paul Strand, has drawn up the roster of candidates appearing on the ballot in this issue of the REVIEW.

As in the past, several guidelines were kept in mind in selecting nominees: (1) to ensure continuity, the candidate(s) for President should have served at least one term on the Council; (2) to ensure good attendance at Council meetings, the candidates should live within comfortable driving distance of Blair; and (3) to involve a larger number of alumni, the Constitution stipulates that no member of the Council should serve more than two three-year terms in one position.

The Alumni Association Constitution defines an alumnus as "any person who has been a student for at least one semester, is a faculty or staff member of Dana College, or is an alumnus or a former faculty member of Trinity Seminary."

Terms for the following positions are expiring:

**President.** Bud Robinson, the current President, has served one three-year term and has asked that he not be renominated. Nominee Paul Olson of Lincoln has been a Council member representing the classes between 1960 and 1969. He received his B.S. in Business Administration from Dana in 1961; his wife, the former Lois Lorenzen, was graduated the same year. Paul is a tax accountant for Central Telephone and Utilities Corporation — the nation's fourth largest independent telephone company — with operating headquarters in Lincoln. At Our Savior's Lutheran Church he is a Council member, sings in the choir, and has taught in the Bethel Bible Series.

**First Vice President.** Karen Jensen Capel has served as 1st Vice President for two terms, and therefore cannot be renominated. The two nominees are Lydia Nielsen Stave (Mrs. Otto Stave) and Tim Brown, both of Blair.

Lydia Stave attended Dana in 1939-40, having previously attended the Lutheran Bible Institute in Minneapolis. She is President of the Altar Guild of First Lutheran Church, and at the time of the merger of the former UELC, ALC, and ELC, was on the 1st Central District ALCW as 1st Vice President. She is a realtor and is also

President of the Women's Division of the Blair Chamber of Commerce.

Tim Brown, a member of the Class of 1967, teaches the fifth grade at Blair's Central School. His wife, the former Lou Vasby, is a member of the same graduating class. Tim is a member of Blair's Recreation Committee; he also coaches a girls' softball team.

**Representative, 1920-29.** Professor Emeritus Dr. Paul Nyholm of Blair is an incumbent, having already served one term as a representative for 1920-29. He taught at Dana from 1922 to 1925, and at Trinity Seminary from 1936 to 1943, and from 1946 to 1955, when he moved to Dubuque to join the faculty of Wartburg Seminary, retiring in 1966. After service as an Associate Pastor at Lutheran Church of the Master in Omaha, he and his wife Ingfrid returned to Blair. Dr. Nyholm is a Knight of the Order of Dannebrog. He and his wife are members of the Dana Chapter of the American Scandinavian Foundation.

**Representative, 1930-39.** The two nominees for the years 1930-39 are Howard Thompson, who is in the insurance and real estate business in Blair, as well as in farming and cattle feeding.

Howard attended Dana from 1929 to 1932 and received his B.S. from the University of Nebraska in 1933. He is Secretary-Treasurer of the Blair Rural Fire District; Past President of the Washington County Farm Bureau, the Blair Lions Club, the Washington County Planning Commission, and the Blair High Alumni Association, and Past Secretary of the Blair Chamber of Commerce.

**Representative, 1970-Present.** Incumbent John Prouty ('70) and Barbara Wolf ('73) are the candidates to represent the most recent classes.

John lives in Omaha, where, with his brother James ('72), he operates Wessco Products, Inc., a graphic arts industry. His wife is the former Stephanie Peterson, a member of the Class of 1971.

Barbara Wolf as a Dana student was a member of the Student Senate, the Women's Dorm Council, and the Student Education Association. She was the 1972 Homecoming Queen. Barb lives in Blair and teaches the third grade in Fort Calhoun.
