1974 Washington County Appeal Hits All-Time High

The 1974 Washington County Appeal for Dana College has posed an interesting problem for Appeal Co-Chairmen Kayo Vinton ('40) and Bob Krogh ('56). No dollar goal was set for this year's Appeal, but the Co-Chairmen were optimistic, and rightly so. The Appeal began on October 22, and by November 12, with a week yet to go, the more than 50 volunteers making calls on business and professional people in the County had solicited \$31,268 for Dana's operating budget, topping last year's record of \$30,520.

Bob Krogh and Kayo Vinton also served as Co-Chairmen for last year's drive, which within the last 5 years has become one of Dana's most relied-on fund-raising projects.

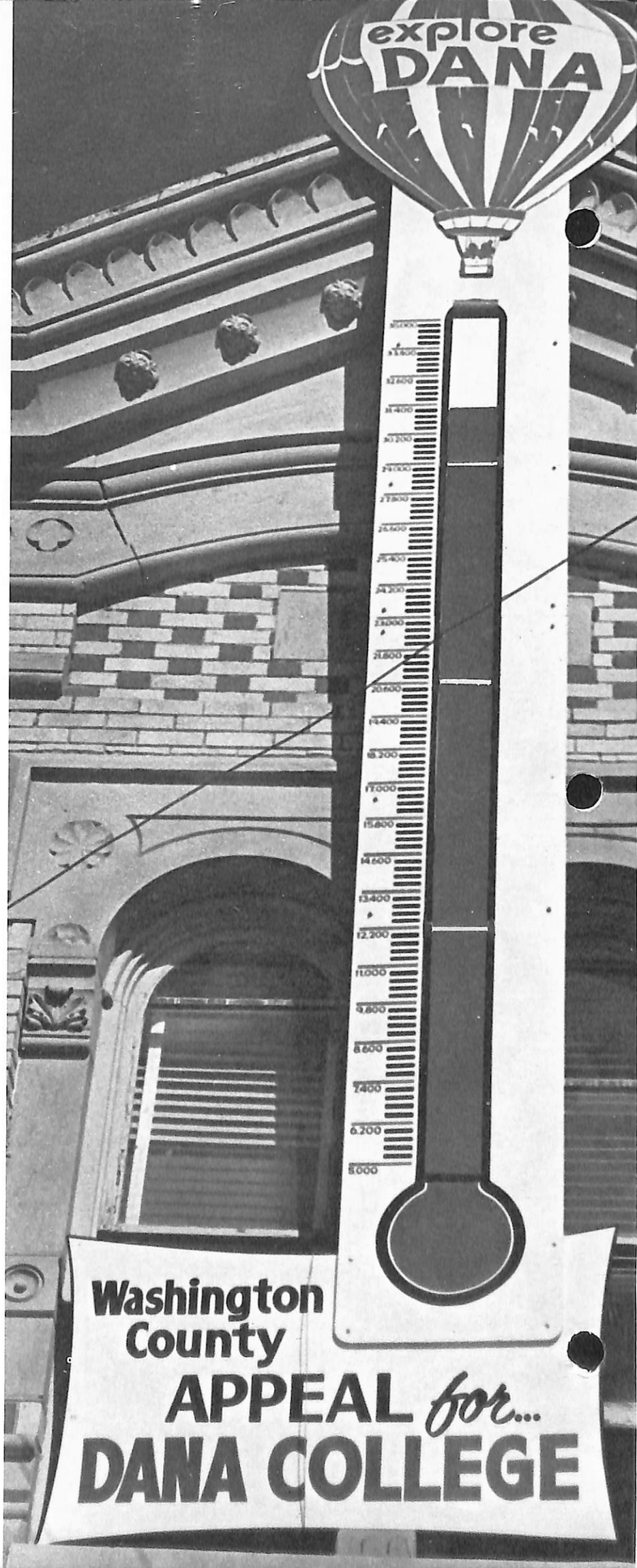

ENROLLMENT UP.....

A thirty percent increase in the size of the freshman class, from 148 last year to 191 this year, has helped Dana top last year's enrollment by three, for a total of 580 students.

Richard V. Showers, Director of Admissions, comments that "The thirty percent increase is highly encouraging, and is perhaps indicative of a national trend back to college. In our case, the 1974 freshman class is the largest we have been able to report in the past three years. There's no way to guarantee this trend will continue for the fall of 1975, but it most certainly points out that high school seniors are again heading for college in larger numbers."

Other current figures show 118 seniors this year as compared to 128 last year, 118 juniors as compared to 117 last year, and 105 sophomores as compared to 136 last year. This year 44 part-time students are registered, three more than last year. There are also 2 post-graduate and 2 special students registered.

As usual, the student body is cosmopolitan, with thirty states and eight foreign countries represented. Nebraska leads the list in the number of students, followed by Iowa, Minnesota, Colorado, Illinois, Pennsylvania, Ohio, and California. Foreign students are from Australia, Denmark, Ethiopia, Ghana, Japan, New Guinea, Nigeria and Rhodesia.

Dana Again "in the Black"

Only three to five percent of all American colleges finished this last fiscal year without a deficit, and Dana is one of them. This is the twenty-first consecutive year that Dana has operated in the black.

Dana President Dr. Earl Mezoff, in announcing the achievement, stated that "Dana is most grateful to its alumni and other friends and to The American Lutheran Church for their continued financial support which has made possible this outstanding record of twenty-one consecutive years without a deficit."

Official audit figures show that Dana realized a total of \$400,000 in gifts and grants during the past year. (This figure also includes an annual subsidy from The American Lutheran Church — the national church body which owns Dana College.) The \$5,000 operating surplus for 1973-74 has been transferred to the College's permanent endowment fund.

The *Omaha World-Herald* reacted to the announcement in the following editorial on September 4: "Financial success stories are hard to come by in these uncertain economic times. Particularly among hard-pressed institutions of higher learning.

So it is worthy of note that as fall classes begin at Dana College in Blair, the school reports it has closed its fiscal year in the black for the 21st consecutive time.

When Dana's books were balanced last Friday — they balanced. There was even a \$5,000 surplus, which went into the college's permanent endowment fund.

Only 3 to 5 percent of all American colleges and universities finished the fiscal year without a deficit. Dr. Earl Mezoff, Dana's president, credited alumni and other friends and the American Lutheran Church for helping the institution maintain a healthy financial standing.

"In particular," he said, "the increased giving of business, industry and individuals in Blair and Washington County has provided the incentive for others."

A lot has been said and written about the strain on small, private institutions such as Dana and the danger that they will go broke and leave higher education exclusively in the hands of big state universities.

Dana's experience seems to show that with sound management, emphasis on high standards and steady support of people who believe in an institution, the picture does not have to be as bleak as it has been painted."

NEW FACULTY & STAFF

Dana has six new faculty and staff members this year.

Mr. Eugene L. Meyer is the new Executive Director of Development, filling a position that has been vacant for several years. Prior to his appointment, he served as Vice President for Development at Brenau College in Gainesville, Georgia. Meyer is a 1958 graduate of Capital University, where he remained until 1968, serving successively as an Admissions Counselor, as Director of Placement, and as Director of Alumni Relations. Before going to Brenau he was Director of Alumni and Church Relations at California Lutheran College.

Assistant Professor of Physical Education and head coach of football and track, Gary L. Seevers is a 1957 graduate of Concordia College in Seward, Nebraska, where he was a former Nebraska College Athlete of the Year. Seevers has coached at Lutheran high schools in Ft. Wayne, Indiana; Chicago, and Milwaukee. He holds a master's degree in physical education from Northern Illinois University, with additional graduate work in football coaching at Azusa College, California. Seevers is a former member of the Chicago Area Football Board and the author of several articles on football for the *Chicago Daily News*. He replaces Bob Simpson, who has accepted a teaching-coaching position at the Ashland, Nebraska, high school.

Dr. Richard Holquist of Omaha has been named Assistant Professor of Business Administration. With a B.A. from Grinnell College, an MBA from the University of Nebraska at Omaha, and a Ph.D. from the Uni-

versity of Nebraska at Lincoln, he has been an instructor at UNO and has had banking experience.

Mr. Jack Hohensee has been appointed Assistant Instructor in Sociology, replacing Mr. William Wakefield. A graduate of UNL and UNO, he was a part-time instructor at Dana last year.

Head wrestling coach will be Ernest Abariotes ('65). His appointment is on a part-time basis, allowing him to continue teaching at Tri-Center High School in Iowa. He was named 1974 Coach of the Year in Southwest Iowa and "Official" of the Year for the past wrestling season in Iowa.

Although not new to the Dana staff, Mrs. Ann (Harms) George ('54) has been named an assistant to the Director of Public Relations. She is a graduate of Dana and the University of Nebraska. Mrs. George will continue to teach English on a part-time basis with the remainder of her time spent in the College Public Relations office.

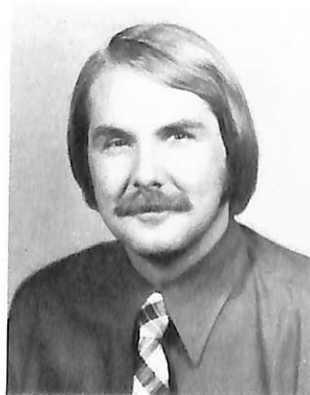

MEZOFFS IN DENMARK

It all started a number of months ago when plans were made for President and Mrs. Mezoff to visit Denmark. A June departure date was set, the reservations were made and numerous appointments with Danish educational leaders, businessmen and industrialists were confirmed. Several days before their scheduled departure, President Mezoff was hospitalized and scheduled for immediate surgery. The Denmark trip was out of the question.

Weeks later, following successful surgery and a recuperation period at home, President Mezoff returned to his office. And, although it would be difficult because of the pressures and responsibilities of the opening of the fall term at Dana, it was determined that plans should again be put into motion for the proposed Denmark trip.

And so on September 8, following opening faculty meetings, receiving of new students and parents on campus, the official opening of the 1974 academic year and a round of receptions and social functions, the Mezoffs took off from Omaha for Copenhagen.

Was it to be a sight-seeing tour . . . a business trip . . . a goodwill gesture? It was all of these and much, much more.

Hours after their arrival in Denmark the Mezoffs were formally received in Copenhagen's historic town hall by one of Dana's most influential Danish friends, the Honorable Urban Hansen, Lord Mayor of Copenhagen. (The Lord Mayor has visited the campus on several occasions and has been of invaluable assistance to the College in completing several major projects.)

After meetings with the press, hours on the phone confirming appointments and a few special hours for seeing Tivoli and becoming acquainted with Copenhagen, the Mezoffs rented a car and began their trip through the country.

But, where did they go, who did they see and what did they do?

The main purpose of their trip was to investigate the possibility of developing a student-faculty exchange program between Dana and one of the Danish educational institutions. To do this, the Mezoffs visited three major Danish universities, three teachers' colleges, the International Peoples College and the College of the Future. They

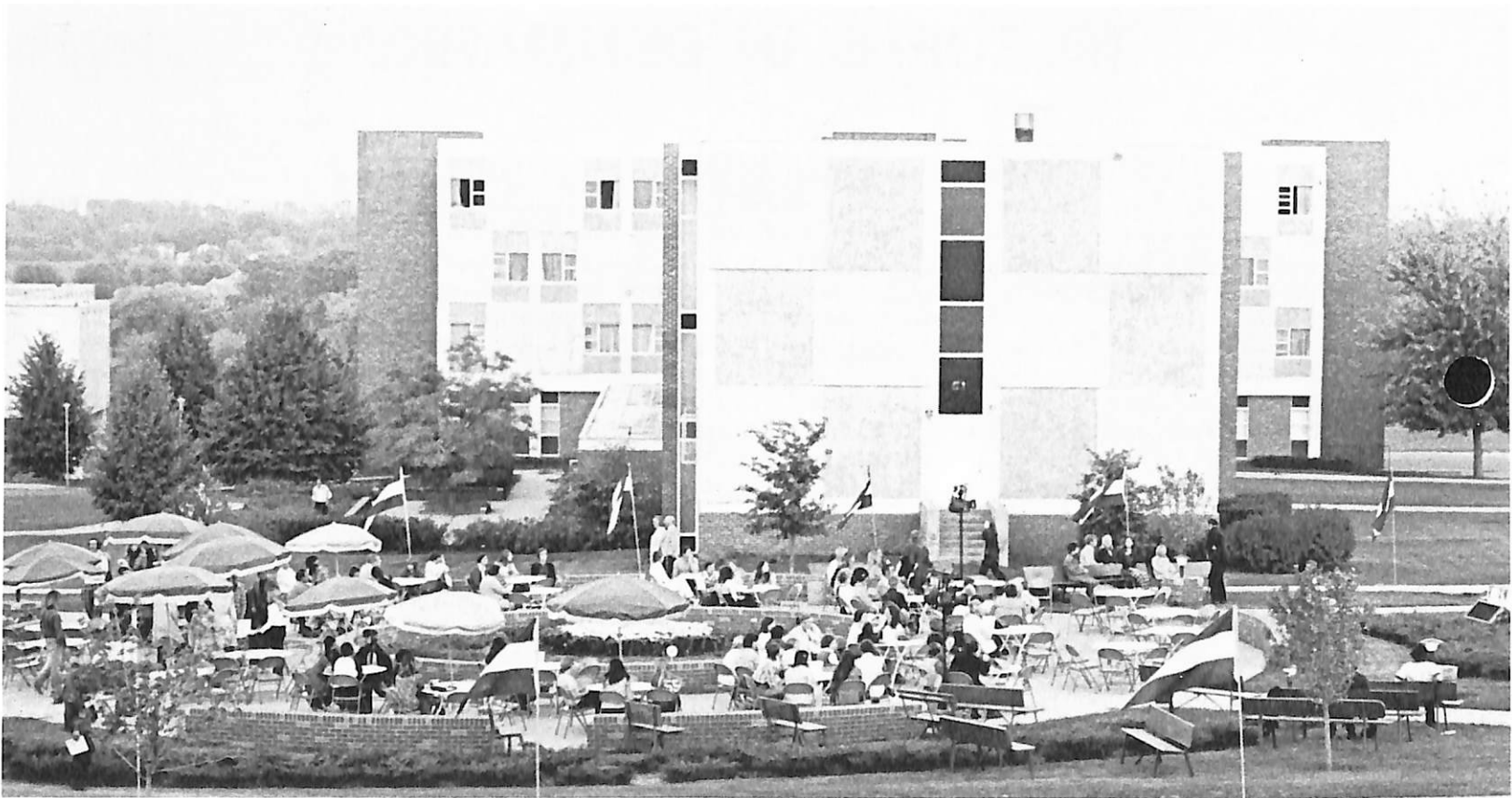
were warmly received and found the Danish educators to be greatly interested in Dana's academic programs. As a result of these visits, two plans are now being considered for the exchange of students and faculty between Dana and Denmark. As a direct result of their visit, the Director of the Danish International Student Exchange Program, Dr. Knud Helm-Erichsen, visited the Dana campus in early November to discuss specific plans for such a program. Negotiations for a second possible exchange program are continuing with Denmark's College of the Future.

From one end of the country to the other the Mezoffs were greeted by Dana alums and other friends of the College including such people as Reverend Anders Steensen, a Dana alumnus and former pastor of the UELC now living in Kolding; Anna Overgaard Felt of Aarhus and Elsa Tromborg of Tonder, both former Dana students; Mr. Chris Hauge of Bording, a longtime friend and supporter of Dana; Mr. and Mrs. Alfred Strom of Copenhagen and the parents of Bodil Strom Johnson, Danish instructor at Dana and Carlo Christensen, former Cultural Counselor to the Royal Danish Embassy in Washington and the recipient of an honorary doctorate from Dana.

Visits with Danish business and industrial leaders were also key items on the Mezoffs itinerary. And, although no definite commitments were received, further negotiations are expected. It is hoped that some financial assistance for Danish students and faculty members to come to Dana will be possible. A meeting with representatives of the two major publishing houses in Copenhagen will make it possible for the Dana Library to receive complimentary copies of all major Danish works published in English by those firms. The Mezoffs also toured the Bing and Grondahl Porcelain factory and met the President of B&G, Mr. Ole Simonsen, who volunteered his assistance in locating Christmas plates needed to complete the Dana collection.

Some twenty days later, more than 12,000 miles and who knows how many cups of Danish coffee and samples of kringle and other delicacies, the Mezoffs returned to the campus. For them, it was an exciting and educational trip. For Dana, it was an encouraging and productive step toward developing closer ties between the College and the oldest kingdom in the world.

"A Million Miles of Music" Celebrated at Homecoming

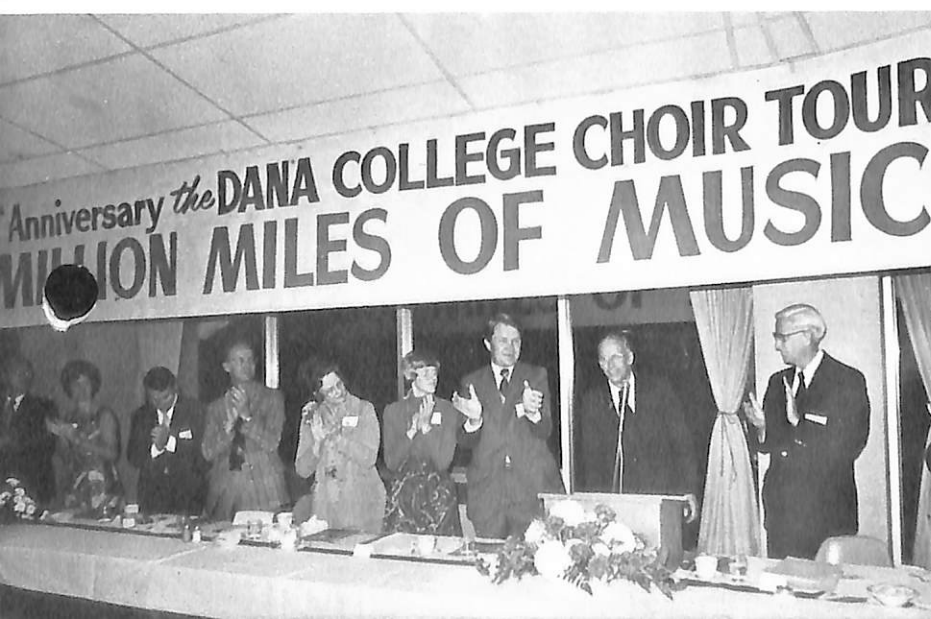

There were other highlights as well: "Music on the Mall" on Friday evening between the Campus Center and Borup with continuous entertainment by the Dana and Blair Danish Dancers, the band and choir, a barbershop quartet, and pianist Alan Brandes; the coronation of the 1974 Homecoming Queen Diane Kniep of Aurora, Colorado, who was attended by Kathy Andersen (Soldier, Iowa), Lori Brown (Omaha), Diane Larsen (Blair), and Mary Staby (Chadron, Nebraska); aebleskiver on Saturday in Mickelsen Hall Lounge served by the Danish Club; the Alumni Luncheon at the Fiesta Grande; the game (we lost); the rain, by now another Homecoming tradition; and, best of all, unexpectedly meeting old friends.

It was a wet—but eventful—Homecoming.



Woodrow Wilson Senior Fellow on campus

Sir Herbert Marchant, British representative to the United Nations Committee on the Elimination of Racial Discrimination, was in residence on the Dana campus as a Woodrow Wilson Senior Fellow the week of October 21-25.

Sir Herbert has a distinguished record in the British Foreign Service as Ambassador to Tunisia (1963-66) and to Cuba (1960-63, during the nationalization of foreign-owned property, the Bay of Pigs invasion and the missile crisis), and Consul General to San Francisco; Dusseldorf, Germany; and Zagreb, Yugoslavia. His diplomatic career began in 1946 as Consul in Denver, Colorado; he was a correspondent in Russia during the 1930's.

Sir Herbert is a member of the Order of the British Empire and Knight Commander of the Order of St. Michael and St. George.

This is the second year of the Woodrow Wilson Senior Fellows Program, and the first year in which Dana has been selected to participate. Administered by the Woodrow Wilson National Fellowship Foundation, the Program is financed by a three-year \$1,000,000 grant of the Lilly Endowment to bring nonacademic visitors — leaders in business and industry, the professions, diplomacy, and journalism — to the campuses of private liberal arts colleges in an attempt to "promote greater understanding between the academic community and the 'outer' world."

In addition to two public lectures on "Castro's Cuba: A Springboard for Communism?" and "Israel and the Arabs," he met with classes and participated in workshops, seminars, and informal discussions with students. His wife, Lady Diana Marchant, joined him in informal discussions on diplomatic life.

Pastors to Get Taste of College Life through Dana's New In-Residence Program

A Pastor-in-Residence Program will bring fourteen pastors from the Central District of The American Lutheran Church to the Dana campus for visits throughout the year for 10 day

periods. Dana is the first ALC school to have such a program, which is funded by a grant from the Division of College and University Services of the ALC.

Designed to "establish the means by which more pastors are able to relate directly and positively to the only ALC college in the District," the program is expected to benefit both pastors and Dana. While on the campus the visitors will attend classes, chapel, and special events, become acquainted with members of the faculty and staff, counsel students, and speak in chapel. They will also be asked to make suggestions regarding student life and programs. Their wives are invited.

The first five pastors to participate are the Rev. Elton Walth, St. Mark's Lutheran Church, St. Paul, Nebraska (October 15-24); the Rev. Myron Grams, Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, Hastings, Nebraska (October 29-November 7); the Rev. Donald Schoeppler, Immanuel Lutheran Church, Coleridge, Nebraska (November 12-21); the Rev. Robert Eller, the American Lutheran Church, Cozad, Nebraska (December 3-12); and the Rev. Ludwig Scholl, St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Lohman, Missouri (January 14-23).

The one-year grant is being used for travel expenses, for the stay on campus, for pulpit supply by a Dana faculty or staff member on the Sunday of absence from the parish, and for the wife's expenses if she accompanies her husband.

Those invited to participate were nominated by the Clergy Deans of the several Central District Conferences. Dr. John Northwall, Dana's Director of Church Relations and Continuing Education, is the coordinator of the program.

Professor attends Seminar in Israel

Dr. Delvin D. Hutton, Associate Professor of Greek and Religion, spent part of his summer, from July 13 to August 16, in Israel and Sweden attending a seminar on "The Jewish Sources of Christianity: Literary and Archaeological," co-sponsored by Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion, the Union of American Hebrew Congregations, and Duke

University. Most of the fifteen participants were teachers in American colleges and universities.

The first week of the seminar was spent at an archeological excavation at Meron in Upper Galilee, the site of an ancient Jewish synagogue dating to the 3rd or 4th centuries A.D. There the participants studied the methods of excavation peculiar to a Graeco-Roman site and were introduced to the concept of integrating archeological and literary resources.

The remaining three weeks were spent in Jerusalem attending lectures by Israeli scholars on topics concerning the relationship of Judaism and Christianity, especially in the early Christian era — topics such as Jewish Hellenism, Rabbinic literature and thought, interpretation of Rabbinic texts, the Samaritans, and Jewish Christianity.

The group also toured important Old Testament, New Testament, and early Jewish archeological sites, including Meggido, Capernaum, Qumran, and Herodium, a wilderness fortress built by Herod the Great.

For the fifth and final week the seminar group left Israel for Sweden to observe the international meeting of the Society of New Testament Studies in Sigtuna, near Stockholm.

On October 16 Professor Hutton gave an illustrated talk at Dana on "Palestine in the Graeco-Roman Period" based on some of his experiences this past summer.

November 5 Election Returns

Paul Simon ('50) of Illinois' 24th District has been elected to the U.S. House of Representatives. His address is 810 W. Walnut, Carbondale, Illinois 62901.

Walter George, Assistant Professor at Dana for 8 years and now Commercial Operations Supervisor for HunteL in Blair, defeated incumbent Blair Richendifer in the race for a seat in the Nebraska Legislature representing Nebraska's 16th District (Washington, Burt, and Thurston Counties). He is married to Ann (Harms) George ('54).

James Schaben of Dunlap, Iowa, leader of the Iowa Senate Democrats who won the Democratic primary ticket for Governor, lost to incumbent Robert Ray. Schaben attended evening classes at Dana between 1968 and 1970.

CAMPUS NOTES



Danish Language Kit. The Danish Brotherhood in America announced the availability of a Danish language kit entitled, "It's Fun to Speak Danish." It includes five tape cassettes, a read-along script and a Danish-English dictionary. The kit is available at a cost of \$24.95 and may be ordered directly from The Danish Brotherhood in America, 3717 Harney Street, Omaha, Nebraska 68131.

A Nebraska Arts Council grant of \$1,000 to Dana's Student Activities Board brought the Continental Theatre Company to the campus on September 19 and 20 for performances of *The Fantasticks*, *Comedy of Errors*, and *Cinderella*.

The audience of Blair school children assembled to see *Cinderella* were also shown how a play is put together — from casting, costuming, and makeup, to assembling the set, arranging properties, and focusing lights. *The Fantasticks* and *Comedy of Errors* were performed for members of the Dana and Blair communities.

The Continental Theatre Company, Kansas' only professional touring company, operates on grants from the National Endowment for the Arts, the Kansas Arts Commission, and private individuals and businesses. Members of the group are, however, from all parts of the country. In its fifth year of touring, the Company will be visiting 21 states in addition to Kansas.

Dana has received a \$2,000 grant from the S&H Foundation for a one-day lecture series next spring on "The Unknown Arabs," with lectures on the topics "The Ancient Heritage: a Faith and a People," "The Medieval Gift: Science, Philosophy, and All That," and "The Modern Enigma: Oil, Politics, and Progress."

The only Nebraska college to receive such a grant this year, Dana was one of 32 schools whose applications were accepted out of 369 applications.

Dana has also recently received the following gifts and grants:

HEW. Dana will share with nine other Nebraska colleges a grant from the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare for \$165,000 for the improvement of education through video techniques.

S&H. The Nebraska Independent College Foundation has received part of a \$35,000 grant from the S&H Foundation; Dana is one of eight member schools that will share in it.

Title II Higher Education Act. The Dana library has received \$4235 from the Title II Higher Education Act. This is the amount given this year to all colleges and universities, regardless of size, that qualified for the grant. Dana will use the amount to supplement departmental budgets.

Private Professional Library. Dr. Karl H. D. Busch, retiring Head of the Department of Biology at the University of Nebraska at Omaha, has given his professional library to Dana.

"Living the Spiritual Life" was the theme of the Staley Distinguished Christian Scholar Lecture Series given on October 28-30 by Dr. William Hulme, Professor of Pastoral Counseling at Luther Seminary in St. Paul, Minnesota, and Director of the Ministry in Social Change Action-Training Program.

This is the third year for Dana to receive a grant from the Thomas F.

Staley Foundation. Previous speakers were Prof. George Forell of the University of Iowa School of Religion and Dr. Alvin Rogness, President Emeritus of Luther Seminary.

Dr. Joseph Sittler, Professor Emeritus of the Divinity School of the University of Chicago, gave two lectures at Dana on Nov. 5.

A group of 64 humanities students and several faculty members spent the weekend of October 12 in Minneapolis, attending a performance of *Tartuffe* at the Tyrone Guthrie Theatre and visiting the Minneapolis Institute of Art.

Thora and Olaf Ballisager, who taught Danish gymnastics at Dana during the 1972-73 school year, are now in Massachusetts, where both are teaching at Boston University, and where Thora is also attending classes. Last year Olaf completed the equivalent of a master's degree in Denmark. Their address is 13 Tabor Place, Apartment I, Brookline, Massachusetts 02146; their telephone number is 617-566-4265.

Soccer has become Dana's newest competition sport, with about 20 members in the Soccer Club. Two students, Emmanuel Achalu and Justus Ike of Nigeria, who have international soccer status, are largely responsible for the formation of the group, which is funded by the Student Government. Games are being played with teams from Creighton University, John F. Kennedy College, and Offutt Air Force Base.

Professor Norman C. Bansen of the English Department is serving on a nine-member committee planning "ScanPresence II," a closed seminar on the impact of the Scandinavian presence on America. ScanPresence I, held in Minneapolis a year and a half ago, was sponsored by the Department of Scandinavian at the University of Minnesota and the Scandinavian Airlines System.

DANA FOOTBALL WRAPUP...

What does one say after an O-7-1 football season?

Ask Gary Seevers, who just completed his rookie year as head grid coach of the Dana College Vikings. After an opening-season 14-14 tie with Martin Luther College, a team with a surprising amount of talent dropped its remaining seven games including five Nebraska Intercollegiate Athletic Conference contests.

The Vikings suffered several heart-breaking defeats, including a 13-6 setback to Concordia in the traditional Homecoming Weekend game. Conference powerhouses Midland, Doane, and Hastings were major stumbling blocks on Dana's road to a respectable season.

Seevers pointed to overall inexperience as a key factor in the Vikes' lack of success, record-wise. Injuries to key personnel and a lack of depth also hampered the Dana gridders.

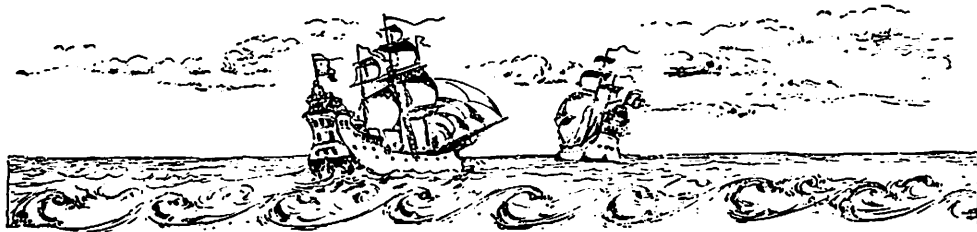
But 1974 is over, and Seevers is already pointing toward the 1975 season. A wealth of experienced returnees will most definitely bolster the Vikings' hopes. Just take a look at the numbers: Dana finished the year with 26 freshmen, six sophomores, and five juniors.

Seevers and assistants Paul Peterson and Dale Lemon will be losing the services of only four seniors—defensive back Terry Jensen, tailback Mack Hadley, fullback Dave Larson, and offensive guard Gerald Wilke. Jensen and Larson served as 1974 co-captains.

After the tie with Martin Luther, the season went like this: Westmar, 34-6; Dakota Wesleyan, 35-20; Concordia, 13-6; Nebraska Wesleyan, 27-0; Midland, 69-0; Doane, 67-7; Hastings, 48-7.
