FROM THE PRESIDENT ...



Two hundred years ago, Thomas Paine wrote in *Common Sense*, "These are the times that try men's souls." I have heard college presidents paraphrase that statement in the following way, "These are the times that try college presidents' souls, for these are trying times for private higher education."

These men state that the climate for private higher education has changed from the decades of the fifties and sixties, which was a period of affluence, ever-expanding enrollments, massive construction programs, increased federal funding, high credibility of colleges and universities, to one which reflects lower enrollments, outrageous inflation, increased costs at every turn, emphasis on vocationalism, expansion of the community college concept, recession with inflation, loss of credibility in institutional structures, etc., etc. True. And one could become easily discouraged by this turn of events. **Yet taken in their proper perspective**, these challenges are simply an expression in different forms or different terms of the problems which our kind of college has had to face in all of its history.

I would submit that rather than these conditions ringing the death knell for the private, church-related colleges, the opposite can be true. There has never been a more golden opportunity than today for the independent, church-related college. Some will scoff at such a brash statement. But let me pursue it.

In view of the type of ethics, morality and dehumanizing events as reflected in "the Watergate mentality" which has permeated not only government

but also much in business, industry, education and almost all other aspects of public and private life, there is a searching cry and yearning for institutions, structures and concepts whose positive value systems, goals and human relationships are those with which one can identify and in which one can sink roots. This is an imperative for any individual or society if it is to be worthy of survival.

I would submit that the church-related college at its best provides the type of education which speaks to that need and search. By its nature, intent and objectives, it reflects a high-level value system, a code of ethics and morality in its way of life — for it is a commitment to Christianity.

This time is truly a golden opportunity for Dana. Therefore, Dana has committed itself to the following four short statements: "It is a liberal arts college of the American Lutheran Church. Its future lies with the church rather than independence from the church. It is dedicated to an educational experience which is intellectually challenging and spiritually and culturally enriching. It seeks to develop the unique talents of each person, not just students but faculty and staff as well, for a lifetime of service to God and mankind."

This era can be a golden one for Dana, but it will require much. This is no time for men and women of little faith, lack of commitment or selfish concerns. The history of Dana is replete with men and women in the church, on its board, its faculty, staff and student body who rose to the challenges and the opportunities which were theirs. They were people of vision, dedication, selflessness, faith and belief in themselves, Dana College and its future. They gave of themselves, their lives, their interest, their love, prayers and financial resources. As for today and tomorrow, I have committed my all to Dana, for I believe this heritage and history of Dana is worthy of the best that I am and have. It is my hope and prayer that you will agree with me and that you will join me in creating this golden era for Dana College by giving of yourself, your prayers, interest, love and material wealth.

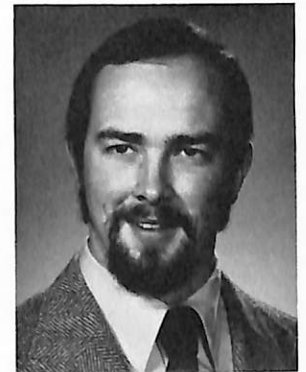

Margaret Chase Smith To Be In Residence At Dana

Former U.S. Senator Margaret Chase Smith and her associate Major General William Lewis (U.S. Air Force, Ret.), will be in residence at Dana the week of November 9 as Woodrow Wilson Visiting Fellows.

This is the second consecutive year that Dana has been selected to participate in the Woodrow Wilson Visiting Fellows Program, which is funded by a grant from the Lilly Foundation.

Pastor-In-Residence Program Enters Second Year

A new program last year — the Pastor-in-Residence Program — has been so successful that it is being continued.

Funded by a grant from the Division of College and University Services of the American Lutheran Church, the program this year will again bring up to fourteen pastors from the Central District of the American Lutheran Church to Dana for ten-day visits throughout the year.

As they did last year, the visiting pastors will participate in campus life — attending classes, visiting with students and members of the faculty and staff, and speaking in chapel. Tribute To Winther Scheduled For October 23

Dana will honor Dr. Sophus Keith Winther, Professor Emeritus, University of Washington, on Thursday, October 23.

Winther, who as a child emigrated with his parents from Denmark to Weeping Water, Nebraska, is the author of a trilogy of novels about the Danish immigrant experience. The first book of this Grimsen trilogy, *Take All to Nebraska*, will soon be reissued by the University of Nebraska Press.

Winther has presented several lectures on the campus in recent years and, as announced in the Spring *Review*, has given his professional library to Dana.

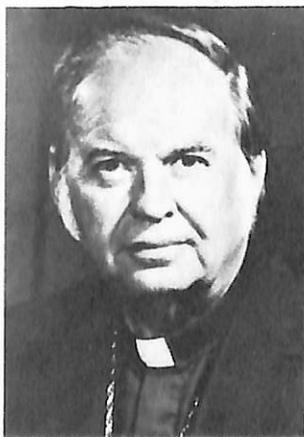

Lutheran Hour Speaker At Dana For Christian Scholar Lecture Series and Reformation Rally

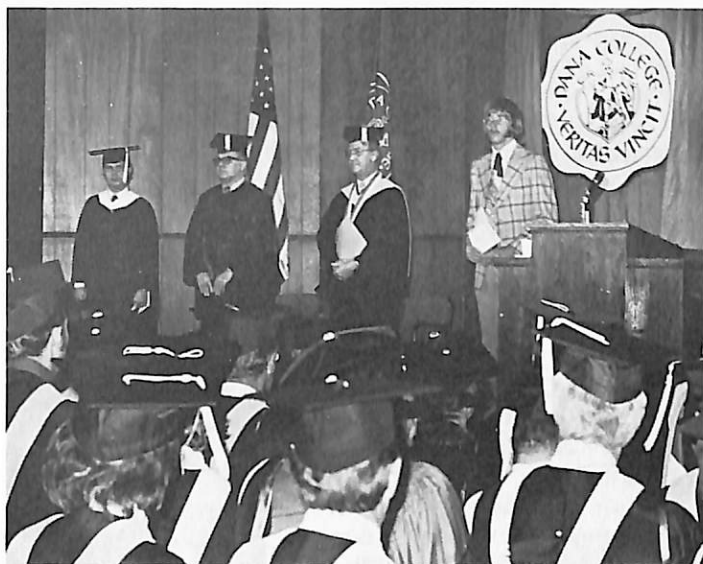

Dana Begins 91st Academic Year

The 91st academic year of Dana College was declared officially open by President Earl R. Mezoff at an all-school convocation on Wednesday, September 3, the first day of classes.

Quoting Proverbs 29:18, "Where there is no vision, the people perish," Mezoff in his main address spoke of Dana's "very great and rich academic, cultural, and spiritual heritage," citing an "outstanding faculty" concerned about each student; a student body "interested not only in itself but in others"; a well-designed, modern physical plant; "fiscal stability"; and a "uniqueness of heritage."

At the beginning of the convocation Mezoff installed the student body officers and student senate. Dr. Robert Glass, Dean of the College, also recognized the 83 students on the past semester's Dean's List and the 45 recipients of this year's Regents Scholarships.

Rally will also feature a massed choir of area church choirs and the Dana Choir.

In addition to his three evening addresses, Hoffmann will give a special presentation on Thursday morning to members of the Dana faculty and staff on "Lutheran Higher Education Today," and will conduct a seminar for area pastors in the Elk Horn Hall Conference-Retreat Center on Friday afternoon.

The Staley Foundation was established in 1969 by Mr. and Mrs. Thomas F. Staley of Rye, New York, in memory of their parents, Dr. and Mrs. Thomas F. Staley and Judge and Mrs. H. H. Haynes of Bristol, Tennessee. Dedicated to the belief that the message of the Gospel, when proclaimed in its historic fullness, is always contemporary, relevant, and meaningful, the Foundation brings to American campuses distinguished Christian scholars who can communicate their beliefs to students. The series at Dana is in its fourth consecutive year.

All presentations in the series are open to the public at no admission charge.

Cooperation Between Dana And Midland Discussed At Joint Faculty Meeting

For the first time in the history of both colleges, faculty and staff members from Dana and Midland met recently for a two-day workshop to discuss areas of cooperation. Midland, in Fremont, Nebraska, is affiliated with the Lutheran Church in America, Dana with the American Lutheran Church.

The workshop, held at Dana the afternoon of August 28 and at Midland the next morning, was a consequence of a study of areas of possible cooperation made by Dr. Ronald Farland, specialist in higher education at the Evaluation and Training Institute in Los Angeles. Farland visited both campuses last winter, meeting with faculty and staff members and studying the schools' programs. His study and subsequent report were funded jointly by the American Lutheran Church and the Lutheran Church in America.

Suggestions made by those at the workshop ranged from sharing faculty in order to enlarge departmental offerings at both schools, to joint sponsorship of visiting scholars and artists-in-residence, to the mutual funding and sharing of specialized — and expensive — laboratory instruments.

The idea of cooperation on a smaller scale is not new to either college, for in recent years a few faculty members at both schools have offered classes on the other campus, and both libraries have exchanged catalog cards for new acquisitions.

Farland, the Rev. Dennis Griffin, vice chairman, Board for the Division of College and University Services of the ALC; and Dr. Richard Solberg, director of the Department for Higher Education, Division for Missions in North America of the LCA, also participated in the session.

When the three were asked to make closing remarks, Farland emphasized the "enrichment and economies" that could result from cooperation. Solberg encouraged both schools to continue their efforts, and Griffin suggested that both faculties find "specific and concrete things which can be done immediately." He indicated that both church bodies regard the effort at cooperation a "pilot project" that they could look to as they begin to discuss other joint programs.

Encouraging and developing areas of cooperation will be the responsibility of two campus facilitators. Dana's facilitator is Dr. RAY WECKMULLER ('52), Department of Education; Midland's is Miss Darlene Ritter, Department of English.

Dana In Black For 22nd Year

For the twenty-second consecutive year, Dana has once again been able to operate in the black.

In his announcement of this accomplishment, President Mezoff noted that "fiscal stability has continued to be one of Dana's major strengths and I am pleased to announce that the auditor's report confirms that we completed the 1974-75 year without a deficit — our 22nd consecutive year of operating 'in the black.' This is an especially significant record when one considers over fifty colleges in the United States have closed during the past four years as the result of accumulated operating deficits."

Dr. John Northwall, formerly Associate Professor of Speech and Director of Church Relations, has been named full-time Director of Church Relations and Continuing Education.

Mr. Kenneth Lizer, who was Assistant Director of Admissions and Director of Financial Aid last year, is now Assistant Director of Development and Director of Alumni Relations.

Fall Enrollment Figures Show Increases In Freshman and Sophomore Classes

Registration figures show that 567 students are enrolled for the first semester as compared to 580 at this time last year. The freshman and sophomore classes, however, are larger than last year's.

A breakdown by classes shows 109 seniors, 86 juniors, 136 sophomores, 195 freshmen, and 41 special, post-graduate, and part-time students.

More than one-half of all Dana students are members of the Lutheran church, with nine other major religious denominations also represented.

Those enrolled are from 26 states and seven foreign countries. The largest contributing state is Nebraska followed by Iowa, Illinois, Colorado, Pennsylvania, New Jersey, South Dakota, and Ohio. The foreign countries represented are Denmark, Ethiopia, Ghana, Japan, New Guinea, Nigeria, and Rhodesia.

High Percentage of Education Graduates Get Teaching Contracts

Eighty-eight percent (37 out of 42 students) of Dana's 1975 graduates with teaching certificates seeking teaching positions have been placed, according to statistics prepared by Dana's Department of Education.

Of the 25 graduates seeking positions on the elementary level, 22 have teaching contracts. Two of the three remaining graduates are in teacher-related positions.

Of the 17 graduates seeking positions on the secondary level, 15 have contracts. The remaining two are in teacher-related positions.

Poetry translations from the Danish and German by five Dana students appear in the 1975 issue of *Versuch*, a student publication of the Department of Germanic Languages and Literature of the University of Kansas. The anthology includes translations from and original work in Germanic and Romance languages by students at American and Canadian colleges and universities. The only other Lutheran schools represented are St. Olaf and Bethany. The Dana contributors are Kristi Westphal and Mark Grorud, both 1975 graduates; Pat Knuth; Lori Nielsen; and Wanda Peltonen.

Dr. Herta Engleman, Professor of English, spent three weeks touring Russia this summer. The itinerary of her tour group included the cities of Leningrad, Moscow, Volgograd, and Sochi on the Black Sea.

Dr. John Northwall, Director of Church Relations at Dana, attended the 1975 conference of the NILB/LU-CHIP (National Indian Lutheran Board/Lutheran Church and Indian People) at Cook Christian Training School in Tempe, Arizona, from September 18 to 21.

With the theme "What do Indians want in the Christian Church today?" the conference was organized to enable "Lutheran and other Christian Indians to meet together to develop more effective models of assisting their church in both clergy and lay education."

Dr. Northwall also set up a Dana exhibit at the meeting.

SOL (GIPSON) BIRD MOCKICIN ('64), Project Coordinator, South Dakota United Indian Association, Rapid City, was one of the conference participants.

Dr. Delvin Hutton, Associate Professor of Greek and Religion, is teaching a six-part lecture-discussion class on "Issues in Jewish-Christian Relations" at the Jewish Community Center in Omaha. The course, which began October 6, explores the critical areas that have brought about the schism between Christians and Jews.

Poet Paul Engle and his wife, Hualing Nieh Engle, were on the Dana campus September 22 for three public appearances. In the afternoon Mrs. Engle, a Chinese author and scholar, presented a program on the relaxation of censorship in China during the middle

1950's, and Dr. Engle, Director of the International Writers' Workshop at the University of Iowa, read from his published and unpublished poetry. In the evening both gave a program on the ideas and writings of Mao Tse-tung.

Diane Wolkstein, New York City's official storyteller of the tales of Hans Christian Andersen, was on the campus October 19 as a Lithgow-Osborne lecturer. Her visit, which was part of a tour arranged by the American-Scandinavian Foundation, was sponsored by the Dana ASF chapter in celebration of Andersen's continuing popularity and in recognition of the 100th anniversary of his death in 1875.

An author and recording artist, Ms. Wolkstein tells Andersen's tales every summer at his statue in Central Park; she also teaches the art of storytelling at American colleges and universities and travels in Third World countries collecting oral tales.

At Dana she gave an afternoon reading for children of Andersen's tales and an evening lecture on the Danish author's more sophisticated stories.

Dana's Washington County Appeal started October 14, with two Blair businessmen, Kermit Andrews and Dick Charleston, serving as this year's co-chairmen. They head a group of fifty volunteers who are contacting Washington County residents for financial support of Dana.

Vice-chairman of the Dana Board of Regents, Mr. Norman Williams of KMTV, Omaha, has been named president-elect of the Nebraska Association of Broadcasters.

The Nobel Laureate conference held October 1 and 2 at Gustavus Adolphus College in St. Peter, Minnesota, was attended by Dana faculty members Eugene Lindblad, Associate Professor of Chemistry, and Roger Olson, Associate Professor of Mathematics; and by Dana junior Stuart Hansen. Twenty-eight Nobel Prize winners, most of them in the sciences, were at the meeting. Speakers included Glen Seaborg, Nobel winner in chemistry; Polycarp Kusch, winner in physics; Sir John Eccles, winner in medicine; and Dr. Langdon Gilby, a theologian.

HOMECOMING 1975: LAURITZ MELCHIOR MEMORIAL ROOM IS DEDICATED

Football Season Opens With Largest Number Of Players In Years

Sixty-eight players, the largest number in several years at Dana, reported for football practice in late August. Included were 24 returning lettermen and 44 new prospects.

According to head coach Gary Seevers, one of the major strengths on the side of the Vikings this year will be considerably more depth at all positions and better overall team speed. But lack of experience due to the large number of freshmen and sophomore players is one of his major concerns.

1975 co-captain Dan Dye from Cedar Rapids, Iowa, and Bill Bylund of Avoca, Iowa, are the only returning defensive linemen on the team. Newcomers fighting for interior line positions include Bob Kutella of River Forest, Ill.; Jay Paist, Hatboro, Pa.; Bruce Winter of Seward, Neb.; John Kegler, Herman, Neb.; and Jim Godbolt, Pemberton, New Jersey.

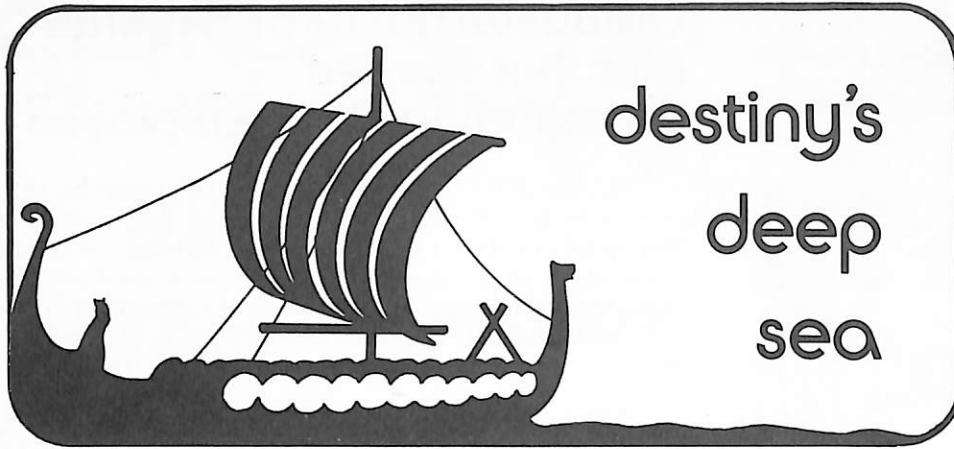
Black Elk-Neihardt Park Dedicated

A dedication ceremony for the 80-acre Black Elk-Neihardt Park directly west of the campus was held on October 4. Participating in the event were retired faculty member Pastor F. W. Thomsen, creator of the Black Elk-Neihardt monument and developer of the park concept; Dr. Clifford Madsen, Dana President Emeritus; a representative from the office of Congressman John Y. McCollister; Robert Mackey, chairman of the Nebraska Indian Commission; and former Omaha mayor Eugene Leahy.

Forty acres of the park area have been provided by Dana, with purchase made possible by a grant from the U.S. Bureau of Recreation. The remainder was already owned by the city of Blair, and the area will become a part of the Blair city park system.

Groundwork on the park has already begun, with a pond for ice-skating the first project. The ceremony also marked the start of a fund-raising drive for construction of the monument. Several Omaha and Blair businesses have already contributed generously to the project.

"In honor" and "in memoriam" cards, which convey a personal message and indicate that a special gift has been sent to further the cause of Christian higher education, are available through the Development Office.

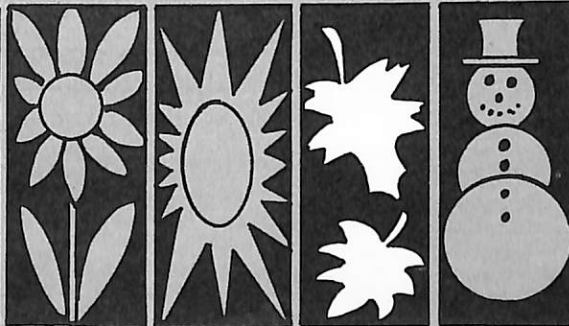
Former Dana Professor In Nebraska Women's Hall Of Fame Series

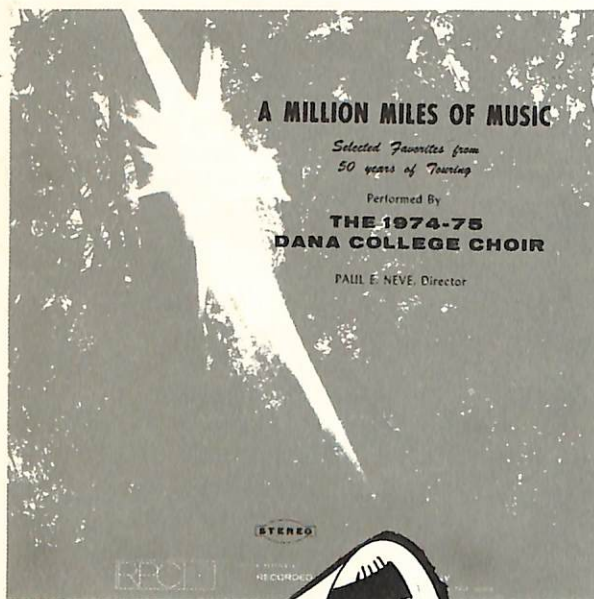

THE PRESIDENT'S REPORT TO INVESTORS 1975



dana college, blair, nebraska

On the following pages are the names of individuals, corporations, congregations, organizations and foundations who make up the 1974-75 honor roll of Dana donors. To each of you on this list we extend sincere thanks and appreciation for the faith you have demonstrated in us. And, because of your faith and investment in Dana, this report is offered to tell you what has been accomplished in the past year and what is being planned for the future.

In spite of spiraling inflation, economic recession, the energy crisis, and growing uncertainty in practically all areas of life, the year 1974-75 was a good one for Dana. After five years of smaller and smaller entering classes, the freshman class of 1974 reflected a 30% increase over the previous year. It appears that upward trend is continuing this year.

Equally encouraging is the fact that we closed the year without a deficit, our twenty-second consecutive year of operating in the black. This is significant when one realizes that over 50 colleges have closed during the past four years as the result of accumulated deficits - 3 in Nebraska alone. But the good news of our continued financial stability must be tempered with the sobering fact that our margin of surplus last year was only \$1400.00, the smallest in the past five years.

Although colleges such as Dana are especially affected by phenomenal increases in operating costs, I am pleased to report that we have made no serious curtailments or cutbacks in programs or personnel. Every effort is being made to insure that fact again in 1975-76.

In order to keep tuition and fees as competitive as possible, we have instituted a series of astute management techniques. Closer controls and accountability are allowing us to design effective ways of doing things at lower costs. Quantity may be affected, but never quality.

While sound management principles are important, they are by no means the sole reason for Dana's financial stability. We have been fortunate in attracting financial support from a growing number of alumni, parents, residents of Washington County, congregations of The American Lutheran Church, and corporations and industrial firms. Giving, in practically all categories, increased during the 1974-75 year.

Our financial statement reflects careful planning and sound management, but it says nothing about our greatest asset - people. We are blessed with a highly skilled and personally dedicated faculty and staff who continue to give not only of themselves, but of their means as well.

Past support has provided us with an outstanding physical plant. At this point in our development, however, we find ourselves torn between three pressing needs: funds to supplement the current operating budget, funds to build the permanent endowment, and funds to expand or improve our facilities.

Later this fall the Board of Regents will consider a feasibility study which was conducted to determine our needs for expanded chapel and fine arts facilities. We are also expecting to receive a revision of the campus master plan. The results of these studies will be shared with all of our publics as soon as they are available.

While studies are essential, they tell us **what** to do, not **how** to do it. We know from past experience that the only way it can be done is with your help.

I said at the beginning of this report that 1974-75 was a good year for Dana. I believe 1975-76 will be as good or better. And, as we continue to work together, let us each day thank God for this College - one which proudly proclaims its Christian value system; one which states clearly that education should have an ultimate purpose of service to God and man rather than education for and of itself; one which states that its future and mission are clear; and one which possesses the human resources dedicated to preserving the church related, liberal arts college.

To all of you who have invested in Dana, your investment has been, and will continue to be, a sound one!
