Shortly before her death, she was named to the publication **Who's Who in American Universities and Colleges**. She is listed as an honor student as well.

Funeral services will be held in Milltown, Wisconsin, at 2:30 p.m. tomorrow, November 17. Several Dana students are driving to Wisconsin for this.

A memorial service was held yesterday morning in Pioneer Memorial Chapel.

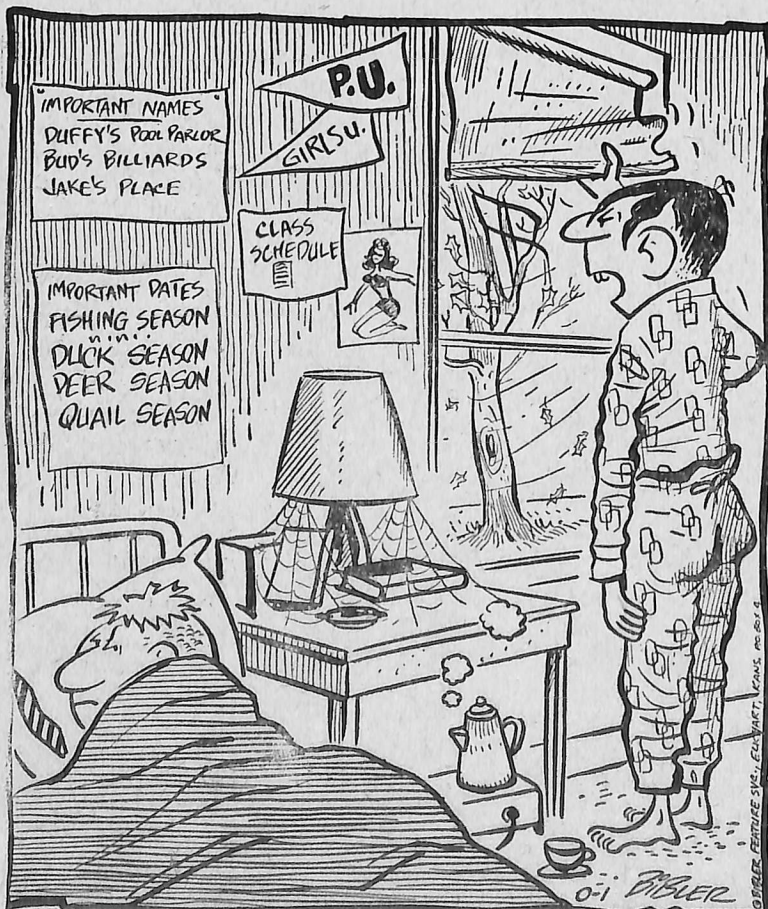
