

## Choir To Sing In 4 Midwest States

Dana's a capella choir this year will tour four upper Midwestern states.

Director Paul Neve has scheduled an 11-day tour beginning April 22.

The schedule so far calls for concerts in Racine, Wis., Hutchinson, Minn., Chicago, Detroit, Saginaw, Mich., Greenville, Mich., and Minneapolis.

The Minneapolis appearance is to be part of the constituting convention of The ALC. Choir members also will join with choirs from other colleges in the merging church to present a mass concert.

Plans also are being made for the choir's 1961 trip to Denmark. Public Relations Director Phil Pagel said the choir may present a joint concert with the touring band of Luther College, which will be traveling in Norway.

The banner was used for the first time during Diamond Jubilee festivities.

## Inside The Bookshelf

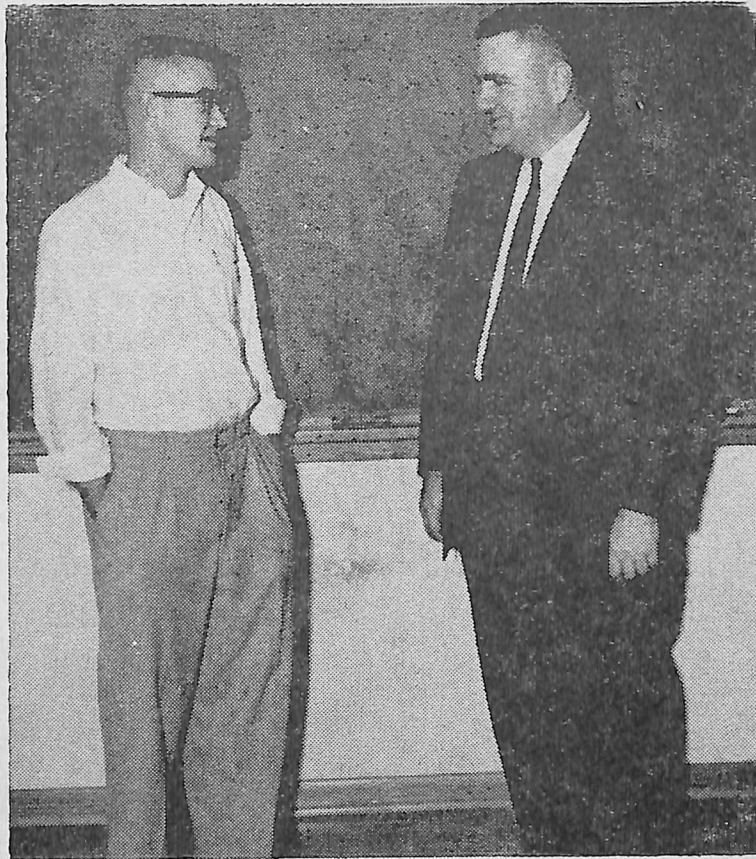

The past few months Dana College library has been the recipient of many books for its collection. It is not only the value in actual dollars and cents that is important, but also the thoughts behind the gifts. Take for example the seventy-nine books, valued at \$235, given by Mr. and Mrs. Chester Carlson, Pittsford, N. Y. These are mostly in the fields of philosophy and comparative religion, in certain fields of which we have very little and should be of great help in term and research papers.

Every year from time to time, the National Book Foundation lists books which they will send us if we desire them. These are usually in the sociological and economic fields, such as Erickson—AMERICAN INDUSTRY AND THE IMMIGRANT; Bogue—MONEY AT INTEREST; and McConnell—THE DECLINE OF AGRARIAN DEMOCRACY.

Our Danish collection recently received twenty books, three of which were old Bibles. There have been many books received from various sources. Altogether, in the first three months, the Dana library has received 228 books as gifts.

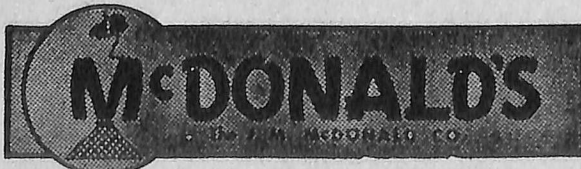

Friday night the Dana Vikings lost a heart breaker to Concordia Teachers of Seward by the score of 72 to 67. The outcome of the game was never decided until the final minutes of the game when the Concordia Bulldogs pulled ahead.

The lead of the game changed several times and the score was tied seven times throughout the contest. Concordia jumped off to an early lead but were soon headed by Dana who took control until about four and a half minutes remaining in the game.

### Lost Halftime Lead

At intermission the score read 40 to 33 in favor of the Dana Vikings. Following the rest period the Bulldogs turned the tables and scored 40 points while letting Dana score only 27 points.

### Petersen Surprises

Playing the best offensive and defensive game of his college career was Roger Petersen who took scoring honors with 19 points. Roger was followed closely by teammate and captain, Don Jorgensen who scored 17 points.

Game scoring honors went to Gordon Beckler for the Bulldogs with 22 points.

### B-Team Wins Thriller

The first game of the evening was a thriller to the final buzzer when the Dana second team held on to a short lead. The final out-

come of the game was 64 to 63 in favor of the Dana B team.

At halftime Concordia was on the long end of a 31 to 25 score. With eight minutes remaining in the game the score was tied at 52 all. With 30 seconds remaining the B squad was on the long end of a 62 to 59 score with Concordia in possession of the ball. Etzler connected on a long handed set shot and made the score 61 to 62, an exchange of baskets made the score 64 to 63 with seven seconds remaining and Concordia in possession of the ball. A time out was called by Concordia. Etzler again took a shot to go ahead, but the ball bounced out of bounds and the final buzzer sounded the end of a well played game for the second team.

### Two Top Scoring

John Volkman and Bob Erickson lead a well balanced scoring attack to score 14 points apiece followed by Randy Anderson who put through 10 points.

Game scoring honors went to Devin Etzler who burned up the net with 35 points. Most of Etzler's points, who score over half of the teams total, came on long shots just past the half way mark. Etzler, a senior, will become eligible to play on the varsity squad the second semester.

## Chadron Surprised As Strong Team Splits Pre-Vacation Record

Before the start of Christmas vacation the Dana College Vikings journeyed across the state where they met the Chadron Eagles. The result of the two games played Thursday and Friday evenings was a split. The Eagles won the first game by the score of 84 to 72. In the second game Dana won their first Nebraska College Conference game when they defeated the Eagles by the score of 78 to 72. The Chadron loss was the first for the Eagles in NCC play.

In the first game of the two game series Chadron was ahead of Dana 41 to 35 at the half and went on to take the win. Don Jorgensen was high point man of the game with 21 points followed by 12 points for Larry West and ten points each for Larry Fustos and Don Joern.

Pete Hook and Norm Wilson tied scoring honors for Chadron with 15 points apiece.

### Third Quarter Spurt

In the second game Chadron jumped off to a 44 to 38 intermission lead. The lead was short lived as the visiting Danians

poured in 40 points while limiting the host team to only 28 points during the second half rally.

### West Didn't Miss

Game scoring honor went to Larry West who scorched the nets with 26 points followed by Don Joern with 13 points and Larry Fustos and Phil Larsen scoring ten points apiece.

Pete Hook took scoring honors for the Eagles with nineteen points.

### Fouls Hurt

The outcome of the first game would have been different if three of the starters, Joern, Jorgensen and West wouldn't have fouled out in the last half of the game. Another factor would be that the team had to play without the services of their starting guard, Mark Petrusson. Mark was unable to make the trip because of a practice teaching assignment in Omaha.

The outcome of the game was never in doubt as the Lincoln Plainsmen poured in 42 points the first half while limiting visiting Dana to only eleven points. During the second half Dana was able to score 21 points while Wesleyan scored 35 points.

Ward Christensen was high scorer for Dana as he put in eleven points followed by Larry West and Phil Larsen with four points apiece.

Game scoring honors went to Rudy Stoehr who lead his teammates with 25 points. Stoehr is thought to be one of the finest forwards in the Nebraska College Conference.

In the first game of the evening the second team took it on the chin by a 71 to 62 score. Wesleyan's second team built up a 41 to 29 halftime lead but were outscored the second half by Dana 33 to 30. The 33 points in the second half were not enough to take away the lead which Wesleyan had built up in the first half. A total of 39 fouls were called during the game with 24 being assessed against Dana while only 15 against Wesleyan. Dana's second team made 72 per cent of their free throws by sinking 18 out of 25. Wesleyan was only able to sink 17 of 32 for 53 per cent.

Dave Nielsen was the top scorer for the Dana squad with 20 points. Dave was followed by Randy Andersen who collected 13 points.

Fredstrom, for Wesleyan, took game scoring honors with 21 points.
