Investigation Reveals Surplus Of Girls Dressers

Some of the girls living in Argo Hall this year are having a problem - a problem which is not usually encountered in campus life. It seems that some girls are without dressers and are resorting to sharing dressers intended for use by only one. Indeed, one dresser is hardly adequate space for two college women.

In the 1971-72 Dana College Bulletin under Student Life and Services it specifically states that "CAMPUS HOUSING CONSISTS OF DORMITORY ROOMS DESIGNED TO ACCOMMODATE TWO STUDENTS. EACH ROOM IS EQUIPPED WITH SINGLE BEDS, CHAIRS, DESKS, DRESSERS, (Ed. note: Notice the plural) AND DRAPES." If this is the case, then why are thirteen girls in Argo Hall without their own personal dresser?

At the present, there are 69 girls residing in Argo. Also in Argo are only 53 dressers, seven of which were personally brought by the girls not wanting to suffer

the inconvenience of being without. For a dorm which is listed as being able to accommodate 75 women, it seems strange that it can't even provide promised furnishings to only 69.

The school maintains it would be impossible to empty Elkhorn of its dressers. Dana is presently trying to contact several conferences to meet on our campus, and the delegates from these conferences would stay in Elk Horn. Blair Hall should be taken into account here, too, as it has room for sixteen guests. Elk Horn is listed as being capable of accommodating 90 men. This should mean at least 90 dressers that are sitting now unused. Cannot thirteen of these 90 be spared for the girls who will pay \$270.00 this year for rooms which are to supply them dressers?

If Elk Horn cannot be emptied of dressers, perhaps Mickelsen Hall could be of help. Presently in storage there are approximately

30 large dressers. These dressers are quite a bit bigger than the individual ones and could mean that much more space could be provided for two girls, if sharing is inevitable.

Out of all these dressers standing in disuse, why are some girls who need them now and were promised them, still without? It seems strange that students who pay our money for such privileges are denied those privileges. It doesn't seem as if a shortage of a mere thirteen dressers could be such a problem, but to those who are without, it is an uncalled for inconvenience. Such inconveniences are only hindrances to the making of a better college atmosphere.

The Dana Humanities department, headed by Rev. John Nielsen, would like to announce the coming week's Humanities-sponsored events; and to urge all Humanities students to attend and participate. Four films from the Civilization Series will be shown next week in DHA at 7:00 and 8:15 p.m. with a late afternoon preview on each day. Film five of the series, "The Hero as Artist", will be shown on Monday; on Tuesday, film six, "Protest and Communi-

cation", on Wednesday, film seven, "Grandeur and Obedience"; and on Thursday, film eight, "The Light of Experience".

An art exhibit that is now on display and will be until Sunday, September 19, was created by Mrs. Elizabeth Solevad Nielse. Mrs. Nielsen is a Dana graduate and presently teaches art at the Blair High School; she is the wife of the Reverend John Nielsen. Her art has been exhibited at the Rochester Community Show in Rochester, Minnesota, and at the Governor's Show in Omaha. Refreshments will be served from 2:00 through 5:00 p.m. this Sunday, September 12.

The Humanities department also takes pride in announcing that Dana College will play host to one of Europe's outstanding young political figures when Dr. Andreas van Buelow of the Bundestag visits Dana on the afternoon of Wednesday, September 15.

Dr. von Buelow will appear in the Parnassus Room at 4:00 p.m. and will discuss different aspects of the German political and economic affairs.

The Honorable Dr. von Buelow is in his early 30's. He had his early training at Heidelberg and studied law at the Heidelberg and Munich Universities. He did research in France and the United States as a fellow of Friedrich Ebert and Volkswagen foundations. Because of his work in higher civil service in 1969, he was promoted to doctor of law at Heidelberg University.

He is a member of the Social Democratic Party. He is a member of the Budget Committee of the Bundestag and Extraordinary Member of the Committee on Food, Agriculture, and Forestry.

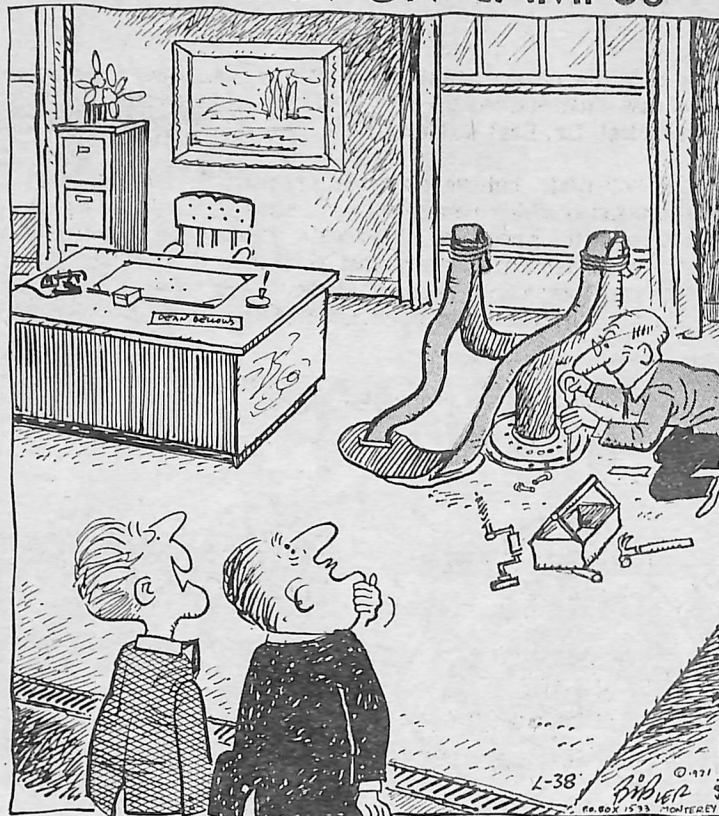

A Freshmen View Of Dana

What do those red-capped, name-tagged victims of Dana life think of Dana College at this point? Is it more than they expected, less than they expected, or just about what they anticipated when they made it the "college of their choice"?

These are some of the questions The Hermes recently asked of Dana's class of '75. The tone of the answers ranged from extreme enthusiasm to absolute apathy. The answers themselves followed the same lines, as those not-so-timid freshmen let themselves be heard.

Most of those interviewed were quite impressed with "how friendly the students seem to be on campus". One girl called the kids on campus "really cool", while another student remarked that "everyone seems to care so much".

A lot of the freshmen seemed to feel there was a great rapport evident between students and faculty. Many said they appreciated the personal attention that so many of the teachers were willing to give. One freshman remarked that "the instructors here care a lot more for the kids than the instructors they had in high school". I guess that's why I like it here so much", he concluded.

Another interesting aspect which impressed many of the freshmen was the beauty of the campus and surrounding area. One student thought this was "a really beautiful campus - kind of modern and kind of old". Another, from a rather large city, indicated a unique admiration for the countryside.

One other aspect of Dana which many of the freshmen felt was a

contributing feature, is its size. A good deal of them felt that the smallness of the Dana campus facilitated better student-student, student-faculty, and student-administration relations.

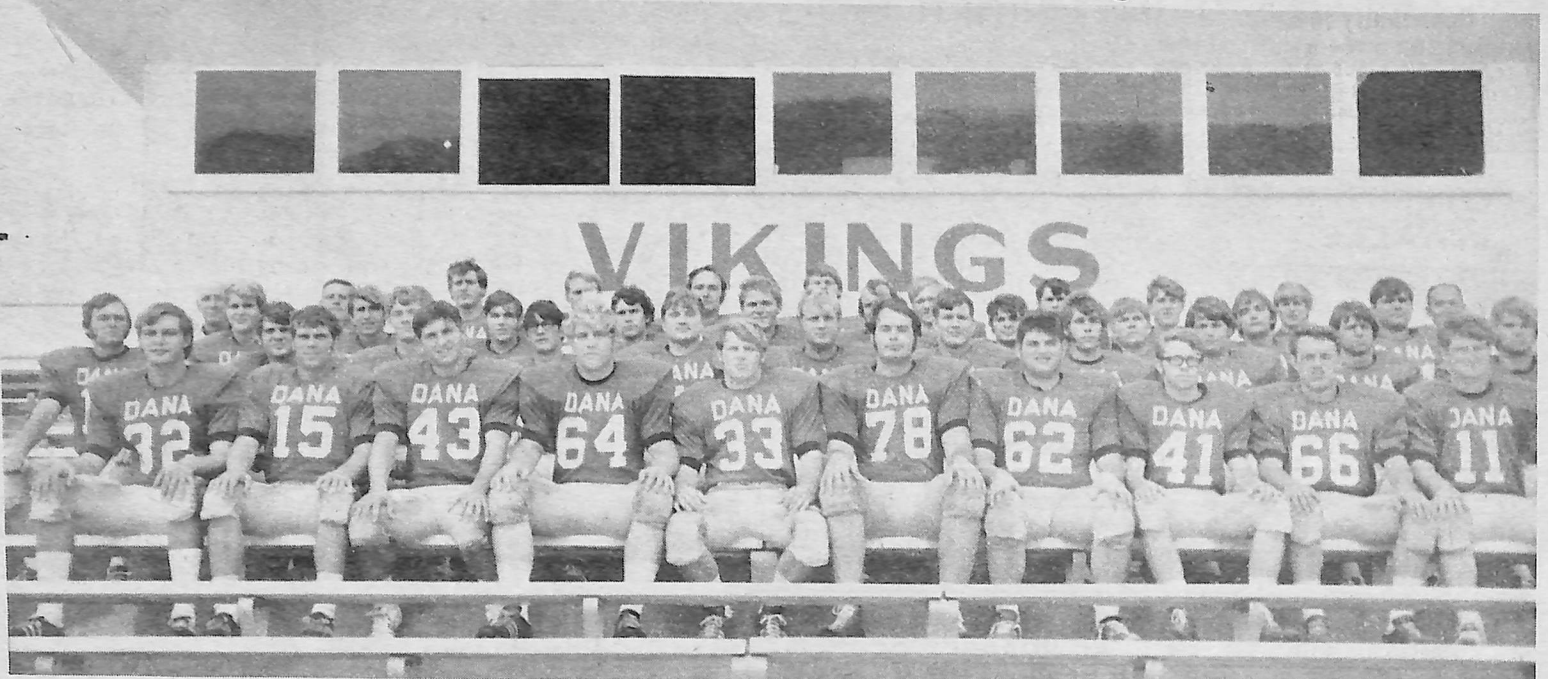
But, Dana isn't all a "bed of roses", as some freshmen gave testimony to. One of the greatest complaints of those interviewed was initiation week. Although there were many who felt initiation was "funny", "different", and a "way to get acquainted", there were quite a few others who found it "disgusting", "absolutely silly", and "stupid". One disgusted freshman described it as "one big game", and that she was "not here to play games". Another view was that "something must be obviously wrong with kids who go along with such garbage". Many felt that initiation was carried to an extreme and might be better received if it lasted for no more than a day or two.

Other interesting comments were obtained regarding the students themselves. One freshman girl asserted that Dana was "pretty lousy because the ratio of interesting to boring kids was so low". "There's nobody unique on this campus", she complained. "Nothing but frouzy blonds". On the other hand one freshman guy was quite impressed with "all the good lookin' chicks".

Many candid comments were obtained, pros and cons, both, on various aspects of Dana College. But, from their opinions and attitudes, it is evident that the freshman class of '71 is gradually adjusting to Dana life and custom.

Nebraska Wesleyan University will meet the revenge-seeking Dana College Vikings this Saturday starting at 2:00 P.M.

The Plainsmen will be led by tackles; Larn Martin, Dennis Erickson, and Rod Bergt, their combined weight is 774 pounds.

Their air game will be led by either Dave McGrane or Ross Stephenson, while their running attack is placed in the hands of their small but fast backs.

To meet this challenge the Vikings will be led by captain Phil Tegeler and the strong Dana defense, which consists of: John Wakefield, right end; Steve Hardiman, right tackle; Bob Mawhiney, middle guard; Steve Hines, left tackle; Hal Collett, left end; Gary McMullin, left back; Jim Uchtman, left back; Rick Mewhirter, monster; and Dan Smith, Kirk McLaughlin, and Ralph Mayer at the halfback positions.

The Viking offensive power will depend on one of the three quarterback candidates, either Mike Brady, Tim Hamer or Kirk McLaughlin. The running positions are filled by the hard hitting of Ron Schneider and Bruce Wright. The openings which these ball carriers will travel will be cleared by: Gary Amole, tight end; Dave Jones, Left tackle; Rick Nash, left guard; Tom Otto, center, Phil Tegeler, right guard; Mike Krivokucha, right tackle, and John Escher at split end.
