

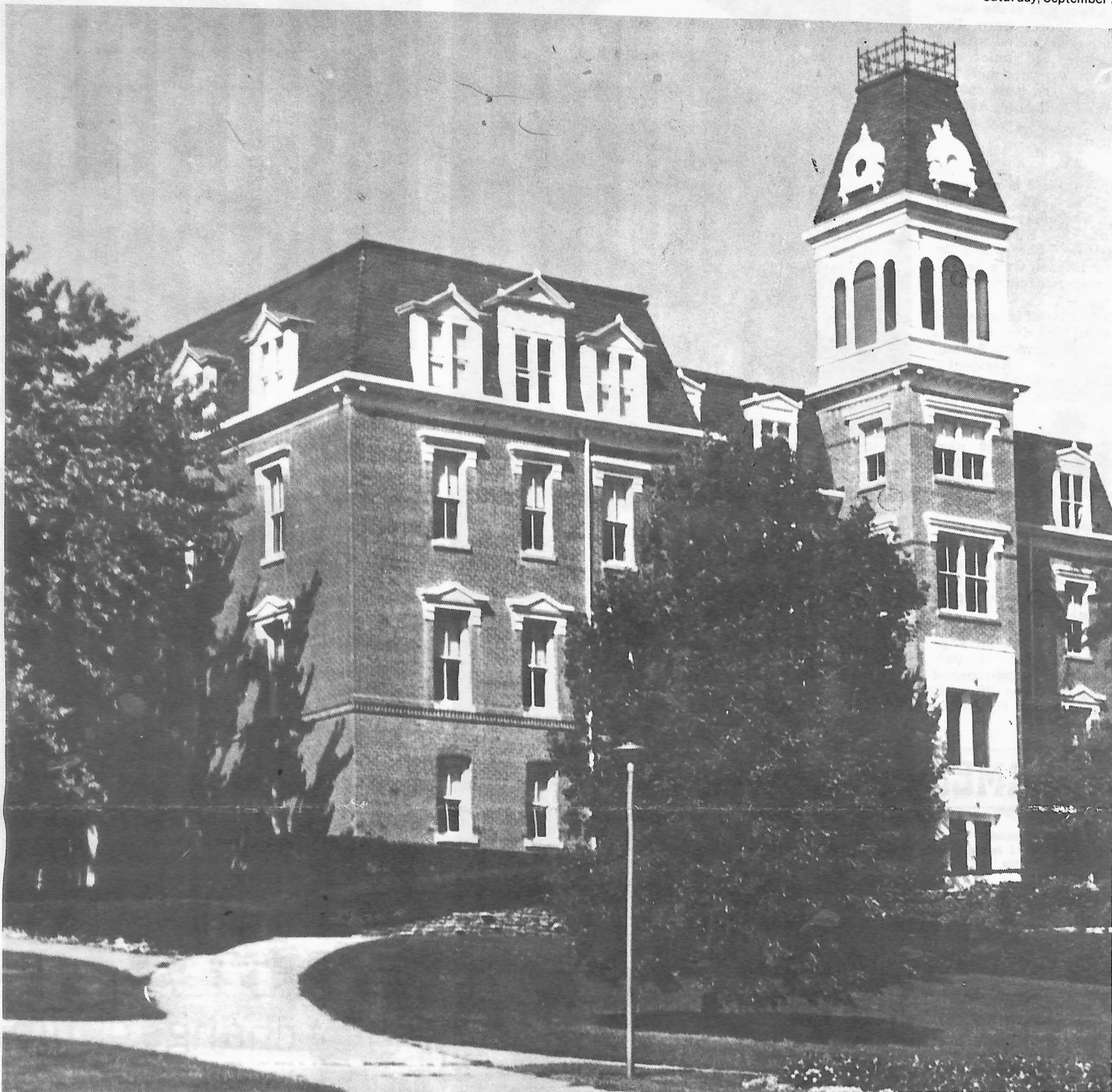

Activities highlight Homecoming week

The festivities began yesterday with registration in the afternoon followed by dinner with a bonfire and pep rally at 8 p.m. Closing the day's events was a Student-Alumni Drop-In at the Dragon's Head.

An early morning breakfast meeting aroused the Alumni Council. Balloon races drifted over the campus Oval while reunions of the '29 Denmark choir, the Overseas Choirs of '35, '61, '69, and '71, plus a general reunion and reunion of

classes of '39, '49, '54, '69, and '74.

Late afternoon activities included the President's reception for the football team and their parents, "D" Club reunion and a reunion of all Overseas Choirs in Argo Hall. Awards were given to bands in the Oval.

The Homecoming banquet was followed by the traditional choir reunion. The Dana football team is playing against Nebraska Wesleyan on the Blair High School field.

The Dragon's Head will host an Alumni Drop-In with reunion choirs performing. Tivoli is sponsoring a Young Alumni Drop-In following the game.

Sunday, a continental breakfast will be given in the Dragon's Head at 9:00 a.m. Worship Service will be at 10:30 a.m. in Borup Coliseum. Lunch is scheduled for 11:30 a.m. in the cafeteria.

Blair plans Danish Days next week

Blair Danish Days welcomes everyone to join the festivities Saturday, October 6, in the Central School Gym. These events are sponsored by the Danish Brotherhood Lodge #206, Blair Chamber of Commerce Civic Committee, Dana College, and the Blair Jaycees.

The activities commence at 8 a.m. when entries for the Baking Contest are received. Seven sections of baking goods are offered. Danish plates will be given to all first place winners. There will be a special drawing for a Danish plate for every contest entry, the plates are given by the Blair Danish Brotherhood.

General registration gets underway at 9 a.m. in the Central School Gym. The Kaffebord serves coffee and Danish pastries in the Congregational Church basement from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. John M. Nielsen, coordinator of the Teaching Learning Center, will be telling Hans Christian Andersen stories.

The Vihtualieforetning, a Danish delicatessen, opens at 10 a.m. and closes at 4 p.m.

Free minibus trips will depart and begin their guided tour of points of interest including a stop at Dana. The Smorrebrod, Danish open face sandwiches, will be served in the Methodist Church basement beginning at 11 a.m. The Danish Day Parade leaves the Blair Bank parking lot at 1:30 p.m. Dana Folk Dancers will perform immediately following the parade at the Central School Gym.

Policy change outlined Optimism stressed

pointed, and several new staff positions have been created.

New style rules, resulting from much research and observation have been adopted and closer tabs on technicalities will be instituted.

These changes, we feel, will bring a more professional quality to the *Hermes*, and will add to the "new look" - the new enthusiasm for the *Hermes*.

We also pledge our support of the Student Senate and of the administration. There is a vital link between this cooperation and the success of the *Hermes* and its influences on campus attitude.

We're looking toward another great year at Dana, with enrollment increases and diminished financial burdens. For these we are thankful.

There is also this Homecoming Weekend to appreciate. Returning alumni and friends of the College will pick up on this sense of "something great" that is in the works for Dana.

Excitement runs high, and we welcome all visitors to share in this wonderful Dana experience.

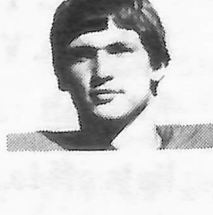
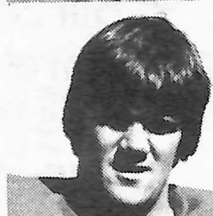

Athletic Hall of Fame

The Dana College Athletic Hall of Fame has nominated three individuals who will be accepted as members this weekend, Harold Hurd, Russell Moseman, and Jan Philby have been given this honor.

Harold Hurd, '36, was a member of Dana's only undefeated football team his freshman year. He received the title of being an All-Star basketball and football player. He holds the Dana record for the longest touchdown, an 80 yard touchdown pass, which occurred against Omaha University in 1934. After majoring in English and math, he worked for Texas Oil Company until 1967, when he became a real estate agent. He retired in 1975 and is living in Peoria, Arizona. Mr. Hurd will not be present to receive this award.

Russell Moseman, '57, was active in baseball, track, and football during his college years at Dana. He was listed on the All-Conference football team in '53, '54, and '56. Also in '56, he was named to the Little All-American Honorable Mention recipients. Besides these activities he was president of the D-Club. He received his Bachelor of Science in Education degree

from Dana. He is vice president of the Blair Bank and the president of the Dana Boosters. He is a member of various other area clubs.

Jan Philby, '58, was another all-around athlete. He participated in basketball his senior year and was a starter; in football, he quarterbacked the team for four years becoming an All-Conference player in his senior year; in baseball he was a leading hitter for four years. During his reign as captain, he was named Athletic of the Year in 1956. With his majors in history and physical education, he taught and coached for twenty years then became a carpenter working for Griswold Custom Cabinets, Inc., in Griswold, Iowa.

This Athletic Hall of Fame is a program designed to honor and recognize outstanding former Dana athletes and individuals who have made significant personal contributions to the Athletic programs of Dana College.

The names of all new members will be permanently inscribed on a Hall of Fame plaque displayed in Borup Coliseum. They will also receive a Dana Athletic Hall of Fame citation and an official membership card.

Alpha Psi helps renovate AMA

As a landmark on Dana's campus for the last fifty one years, Alumni Memorial Auditorium is once again in the spotlight. This year, members of the Dana community have joined forces in a type of "renovation" for the auditorium.

Mr. Sieghard Krueger, an instructor at Dana in the early 1960's, returned to Dana this year as assistant professor of speech and theatre and director of theatre. He has been instrumental in organizing the modernization of the auditorium. Mr. Krueger has been assisted in the refurbishing work by members of Alpha Psi Omega, the honorary dramatics society.

"AMA is past being a beautiful building, but we don't need to be embarrassed by it," remarked Mr. Krueger. He related that the major obstacle faced by the group as they began their undertaking was that financial resources. The school purchased the supplies used by the group.

New outside doors had been installed on the building this summer before classes resumed. Alpha Psi members painted these doors as well as the west entryway, and the proscenium arch which outlines the stage. New curtains were also purchased for the stage area. These are in the process of being hung. Downstairs, there has been no major rearranging done. The majority of work in this area involved clean up.

Alpha Psi members hope to finish several other tasks before they finish their work in the auditorium. These tasks include repainting the east entryway, cleaning the curtains for the windows at the back of the auditorium, and mainly distracting from the feeling of general unpleasantness. "The ceiling hasn't been forgotten," explained Mr. Krueger. "We just are undecided as yet as to what will be done with it." This work has involved much extra time for Alpha Psi members. "I'm really proud of all of the

hard work these Alpha Psi members have done," stated the new director.

Alumni Memorial Auditorium was erected in the late 1920's. It was dedicated on February 20, 1928. In its earlier years, it served as both a gymnasium and an auditorium. At a building cost of \$30,000, it received the name Alumni Memorial Auditorium after an alumni drive which raised \$15,000 to cover the debt incurred as a result of its construction.

Today, Alumni Memorial Auditorium houses a variety of groups and activities. The Dana Players and Alpha Psi Omega hold many of their theatre productions within the auditorium. Numerous musical recitals are also held within the building. The basement houses pianos and practice rooms for music students. Chapel is held every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday in the auditorium. Ekklesia Koinonias, the campus congregation holds services in the auditorium each Sunday morning during the school year.

At the present time, the Theatre Department has been busy preparing for its upcoming season, as well as working on the beautification of the auditorium. Alpha Psi Omega, under Mr. Krueger's direction, are preparing the closing devotion for the Central District Convention of American Lutheran Church Women. The members will perform in Omaha on Tuesday, September 25, which has been designated by the convention as "Dana Night". The devotion is in the form of a play entitled, "It's My Life". Alpha Psi member Jill Wetzel, '80, explained that the play "is a series of modern day parables".

The musical, "Once Upon A Mattress" will be held in November. Tryouts for the musical are scheduled for October 1.

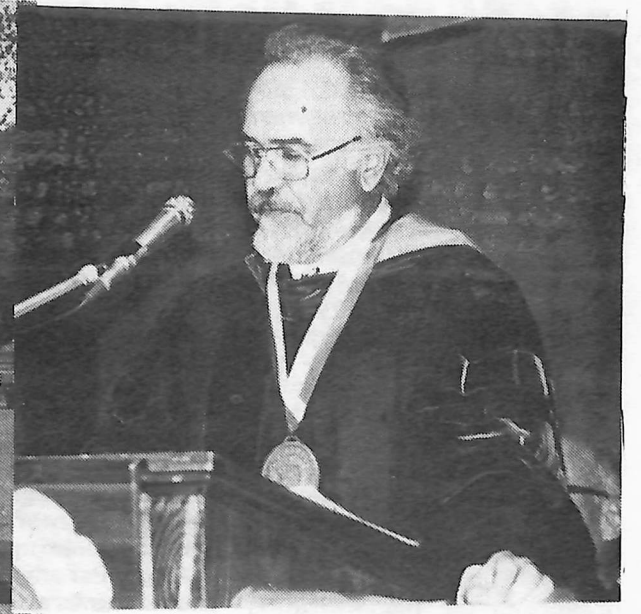
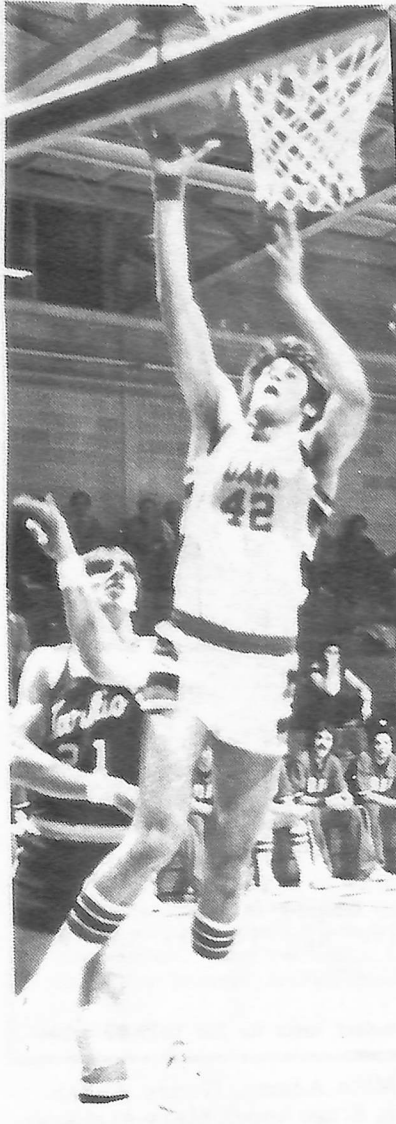

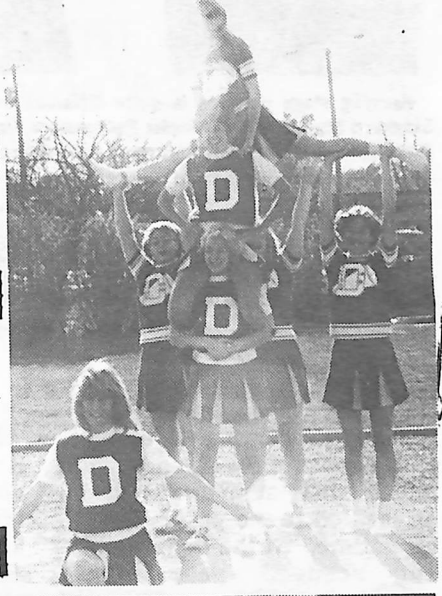
