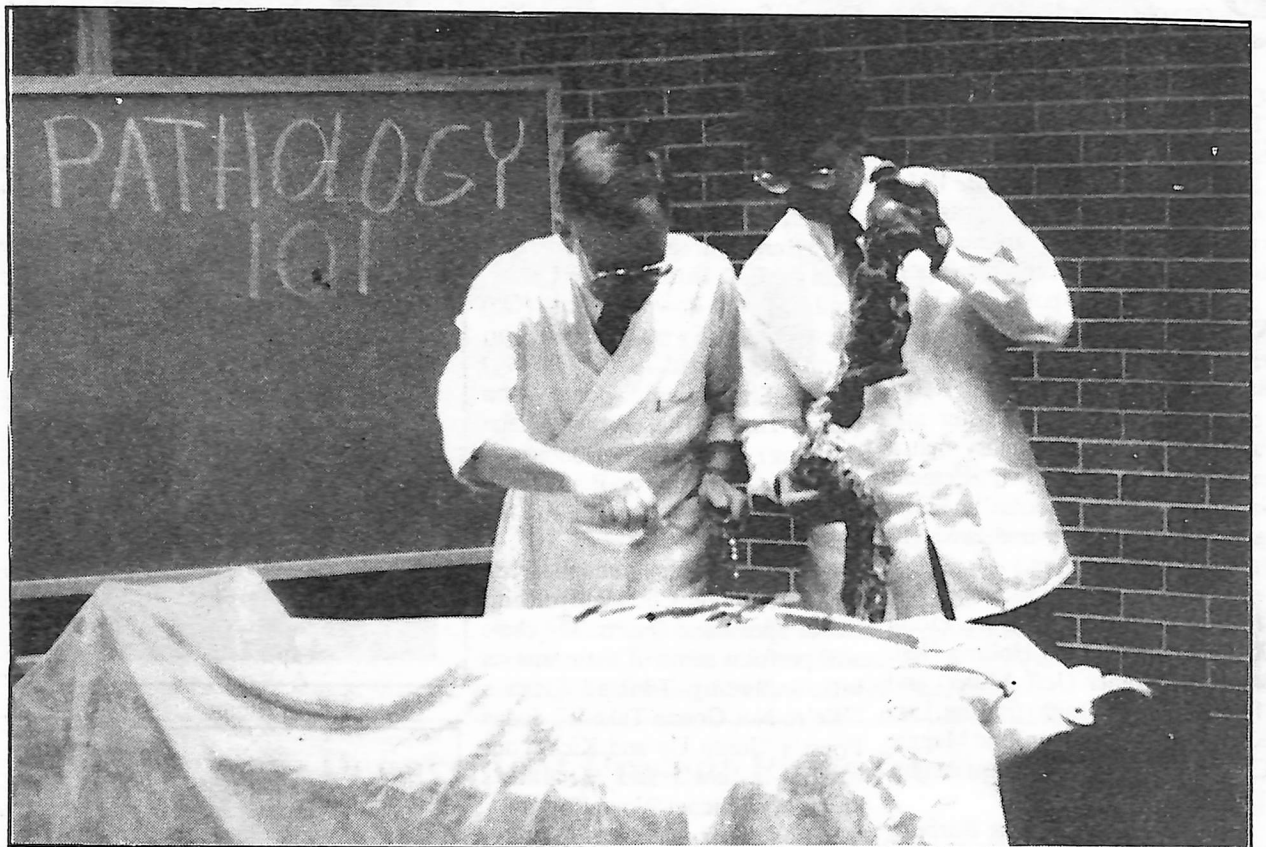

## Cafeteria Food Poisons 250; AFM Says "We're Not Sorry"

An unusual occurrence took place on the Dana campus last Monday - 250 students were diagnosed as suffering from Botchelism. Nurse Ima Hernia was assisted by Dr. Mike Davenport in determining the cause of the outbreak.

After working a strenuous twenty-four hour shift, Hernia and Davenport concluded that the illness seemed to be linked to food poisoning.

Private Investigator Chip N. Dale was immediately called to the scene to get to "the heart of the matter."

In an interview with one of the victims, Chip N. Dale learned that the cafeteria had served spaghetti the night before the food poisoning was detected in the students. However, what the students believed to be spaghetti noodles was actually earthworms.

What Dana's biggest concern seems to be at the present moment is where to store the 250 deathly ill students until the trial. They have become a great inconvenience to the library. Each student was given a separate bookshelf to rest their sickly bodies on, but the librarians claim this can't go on much longer.

Whatever the outcome of the trial may be, Pammy May Baker triumphantly commented, "I hope those wimpy students get what they deserve - a jail cell swarmed with earthworms! Then maybe they'll appreciate the cafeteria's delightfully worm-cooked meals and desire to uphold the value of celebrating Earth Day everyday!"

Dana's food poisoning incident was expected to be the most unique case ever recorded in health history. What a difference the Dana cafeteria has made in the lives of "spaghetti lovers" all over the world!

At approximately 8:45 a.m. Thursday, May 10, a corpse was found in the heating tunnel under the grass oval of the Dana College Campus.

The body was that of Rig R. Mortus, a senior physical education major. Mortus was listed as missing last Tuesday. Foul play was suspected.

Dew E. Decimal, the head librarian, found the body after following the strange stench which began early Thursday morning. Decimal was instructed by Dan Arbeit, Dean of Students, not to call the local authorities. When questioned about this decision, Arbeit replied, "This is an internal matter, we will handle it."

Sean O'Mally, Chief of Dana Security, is heading up the investigation. He said that access to the tunnel was gained through a resource room in the basement of the library. The room has a large heating duct leading to the tunnels under the oval. He speculated on the entrance to the locked room. They never could keep a decent bulls-eye, because it always got broken up in the soprano-alto brawls. But Rig, though full of holes and bashed up a bit, was always able to come back the next night."

When asked about this comment, the president of Dana's Choir, Christmas Miller, said, "We didn't kill nobody. Rig was still breathin' when we left him in the tunnels."

The fate of Dana's Music department seemed to hang in the balance. What was the cause of death?

Because the cause of death was indeterminate, an autopsy was performed by Drs. Larry Rock and Mark Frogg of Dana's biology department, along with the help of senior biology majors.

Those students received extra credit for helping out, and 150 Dana students turned out to watch the autopsy for Hum credit.

Dr. Rock announced the results to the Doctors Hall Auditorium audience. "It appears that Mr. Mortus died of African Sleeping Sickness, carried by the infamous Tse-Tse Fly."

Dr. Frogg commented on the symptoms, "Trypanosoma causes febrile tremors, enlargement of the lymph nodes, myocarditis, profound somnolence, and pronounced turbidity of the cerebrospinal fluid. These are, of course, fatal."

Professor Blindlad of the chemistry department, rushed into DHA and shouted out information crucial to the case. "The Tse-Tse Flies from the lab are missing!"

Things began to fall into place for Sean O'Mally after that.

The college registrar, Ms. Graides, provided a possible motive for the homicide. "Rig was the valedictorian.

It's such a shame he won't be able to give his speech. But, on the bright side, there's a student who was only .001 of a point behind Rig."

Investigation by Dana's crack security team turned up some interesting evidence this morning. Prudence Braunnase, Biology major, was seen entering the library at approximately 1:00 a.m. last Wednesday morning, after the choir students had stumbled out. She was allegedly carrying a small glass jar, contents unknown.

A search of Ms. Braunnase's room turned up unauthorized keys to DHS, the Library, and the men's locker room in Borup; as well as the missing Parnassus computer. A G.P.A. check showed Prudence to be next in line for the coveted title "Valedictorian".

The Campus Judiciary Council has convicted Braunnase of 2nd degree murder, a crime which carries a stiff \$75 fine on this campus. In keeping with their hardnosed record, the council also sentenced Braunnase to 150 hours watching tapes of the Old Main Fire.

In an official comment to the press, Prudence stated, "I never meant to kill him. I just wanted to give that speech. You've got to

understand the pressure I'm under. I figured with the reputation of the choir people, it would be easy to make them take the fall. I guess I was wrong."

Services for Rig R. Mortus will be held Monday during normal chapel time, burial will be on the hill near the cross.

The Dana Community is reminded that this is an internal matter and all official information concerning it will be destroyed. The campus administration and staff will deny any knowledge of the events occurring May 10. As far as the Herpes is concerned, this article is completely fictitious.

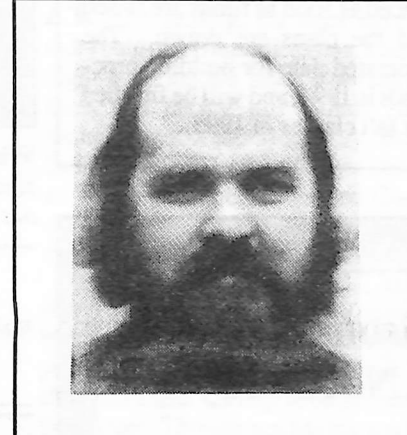

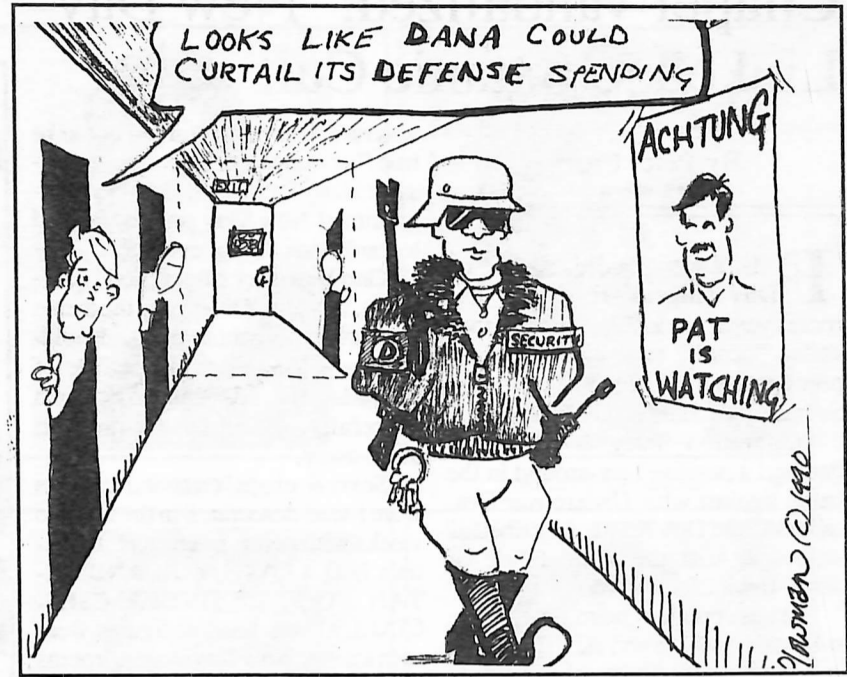
