

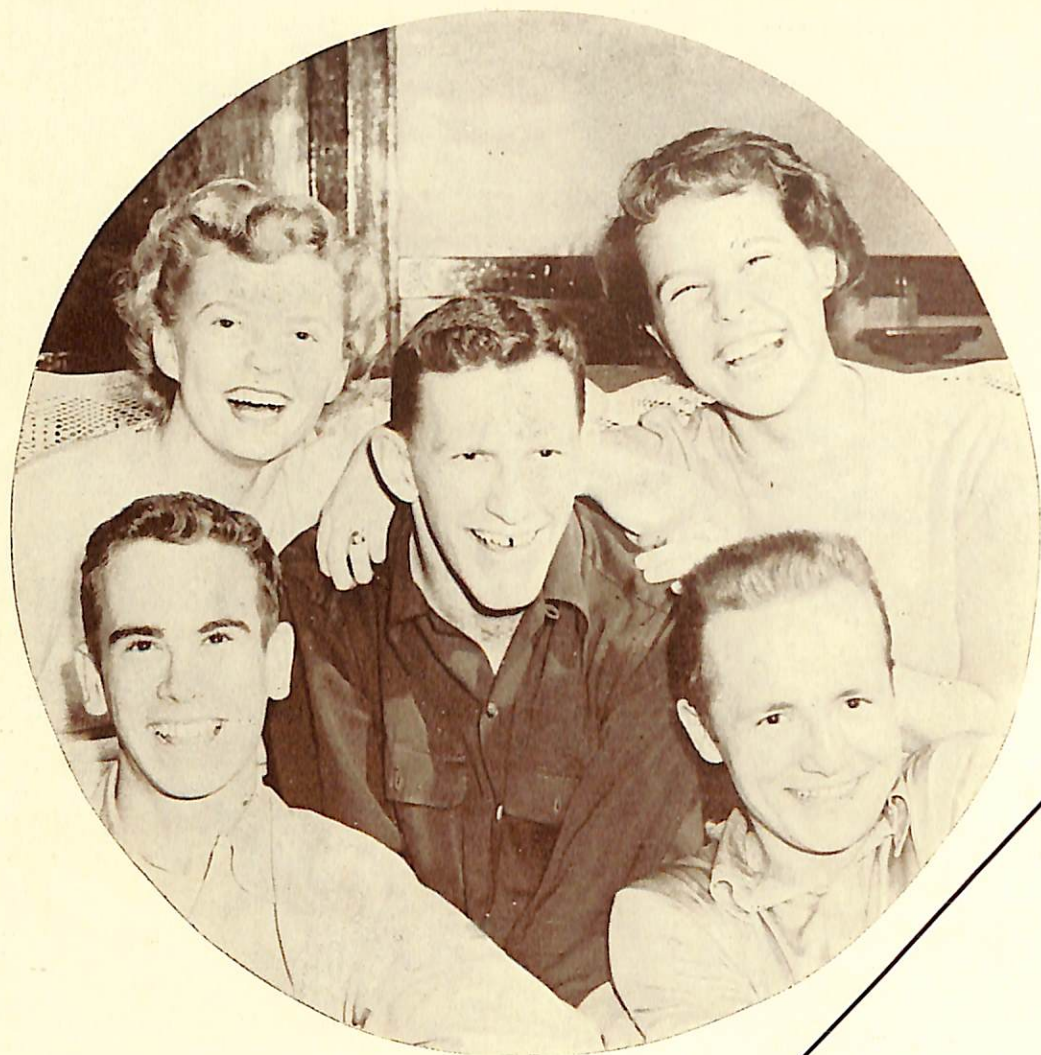

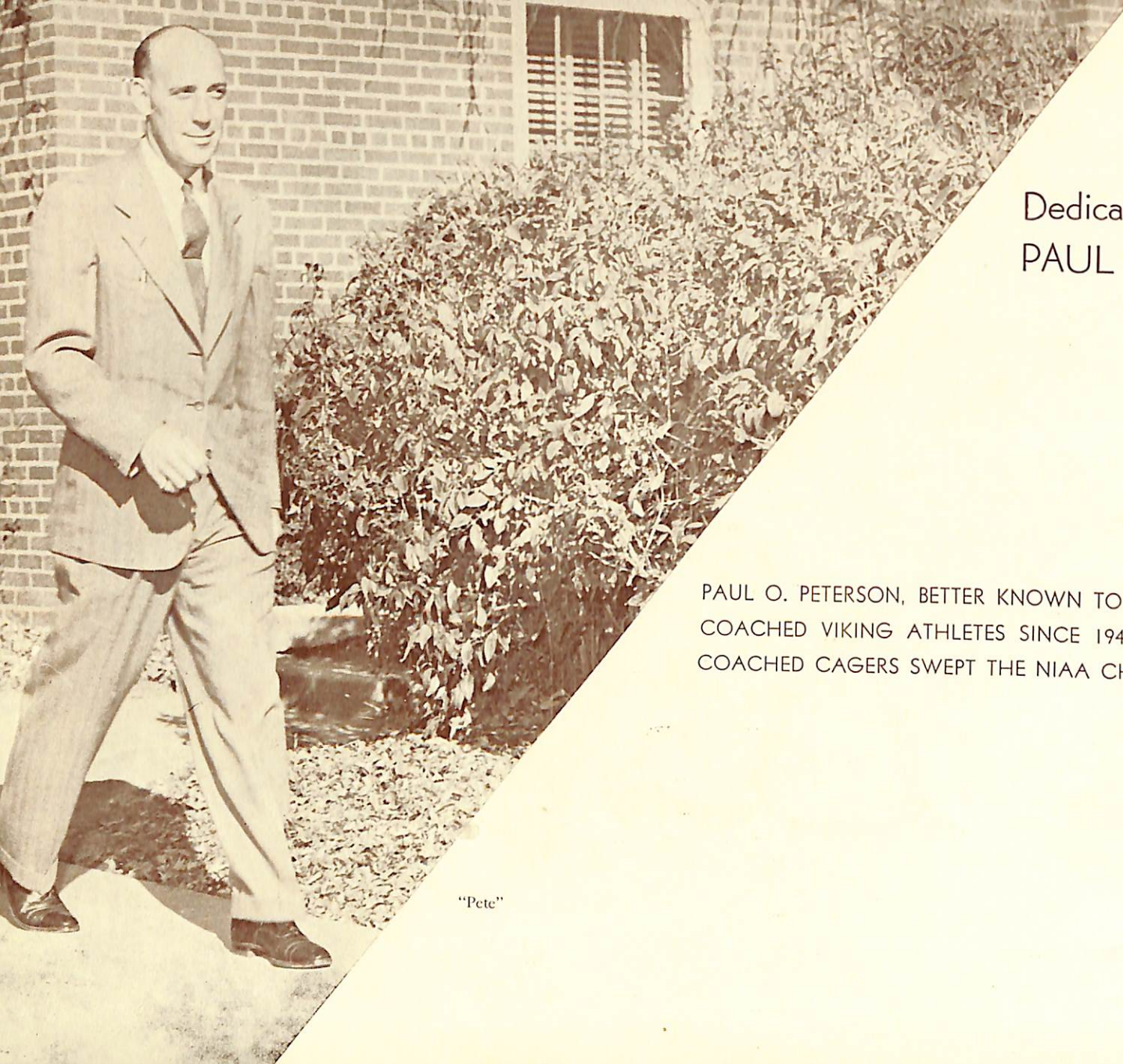

In Memoriam



Dr. N. C. Carlsen was born June 1, 1884, near Hjoerring, Denmark, and died Feb. 6, 1950 at his home in Blair, Nebraska. In 1894 his family emigrated to America. Young Niels pursued the trade of machinist until 1902, when, feeling the call of the ministry, he entered Dana College. Poor health interrupted his studies, but later he was able to continue, and on June 5, 1910, was ordained from Trinity Seminary.

Elected to the vice-presidency of the Synod in 1921, he became president in 1924, and has been re-elected every three years. In 1931 he was honored with the degree of Doctor of Divinity by the theological school, Capital university, and in 1936, King Christian X of Denmark conferred on him the order of Knight of Dannebrog.

Surviving Dr. Carlsen are his widow, Caroline Martine Neve Carlsen, ten children, and a brother and sister.

A Pioneer Has Passed

No longer will we see him walking among us on the campus, stopping here and there to talk with students, asking about their parents, their studies, or their plans for the future. No longer will we hear his friendly earnest voice raised in greeting, or in the Alumni Memorial or First Lutheran Church preaching and exhorting.

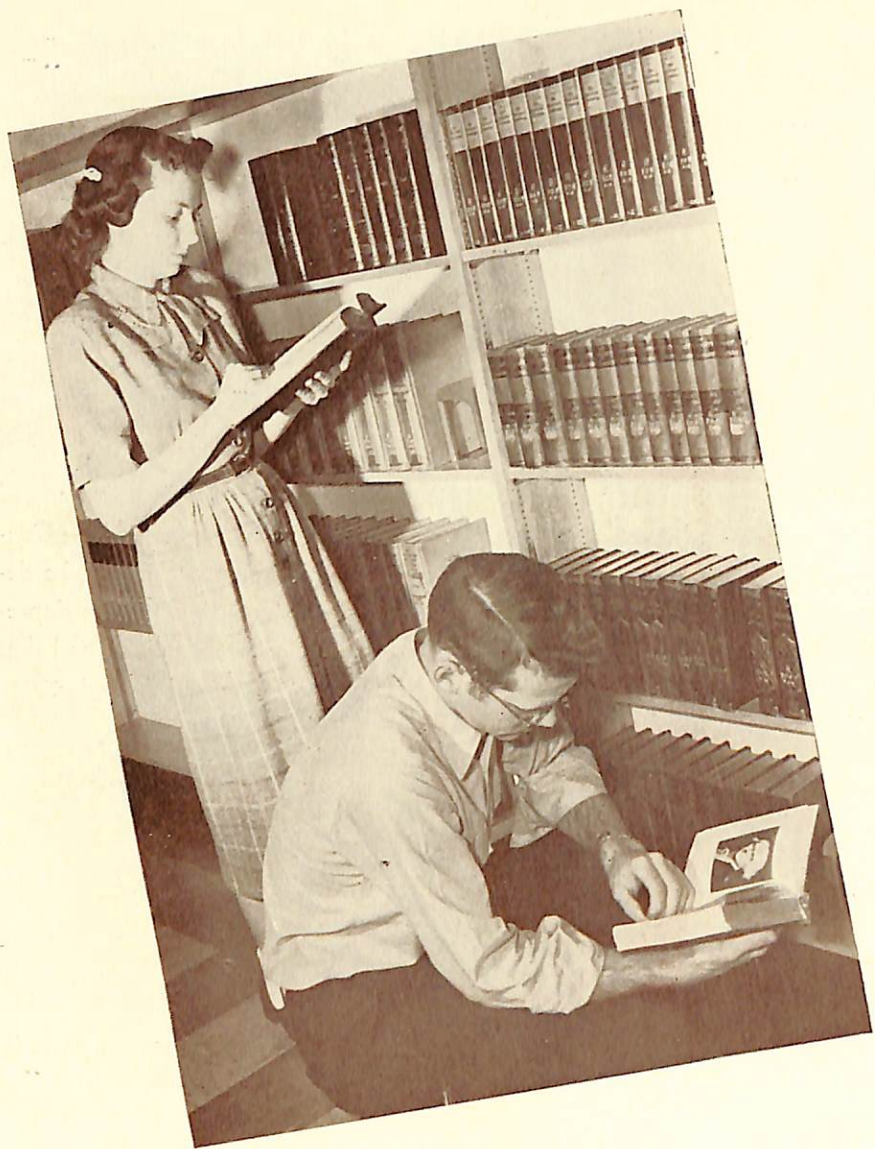
Dr. Carlsen is dead . . .

And so we heard him preaching Christ Crucified and the power of the Cross to salvation. He did not adjust his sermons to suit the whims of the people. He preached what man needed and must hear. Now was the time for repentance, not tomorrow. There was often a desperate urgency in his voice as if he sensed that his days were numbered, too.

The affection Dana and Trinity students and faculty of this era and the past hold for Dr. Carlsen is a matter of individual affections that cannot be measured directly.

But the influence of his years directly involved with the school as synodical president show that his attitude towards the college and seminary was one of great interest and concern that these schools be what they profess to be—Centers of Christian Higher Education. Moreover, to his honor and credit, he defended the college against the attacks of those who from time to time depreciated and maligned this institution. We who love Dana and Trinity and that for which they stand, give thanks to God for such a friend and defender.

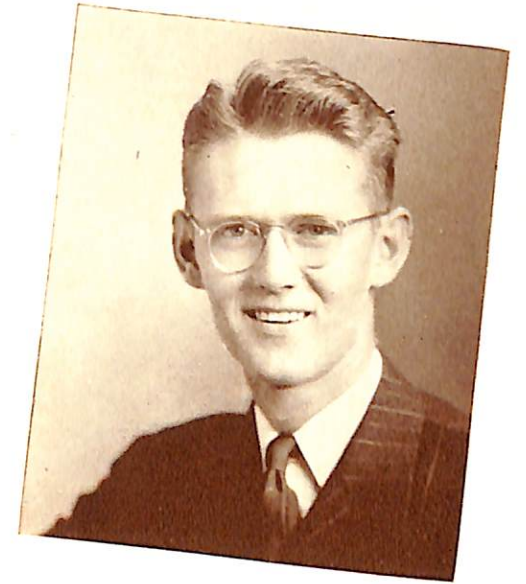


ARLO ANDERSEN

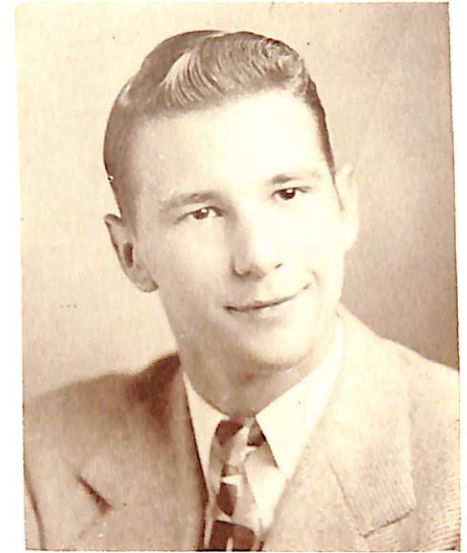
JAMES R. HANSEN

Blair, Nebraska

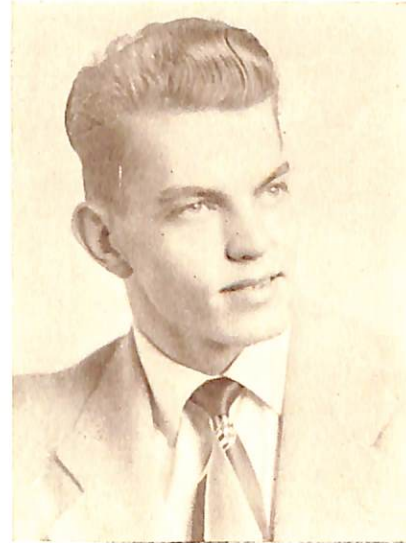

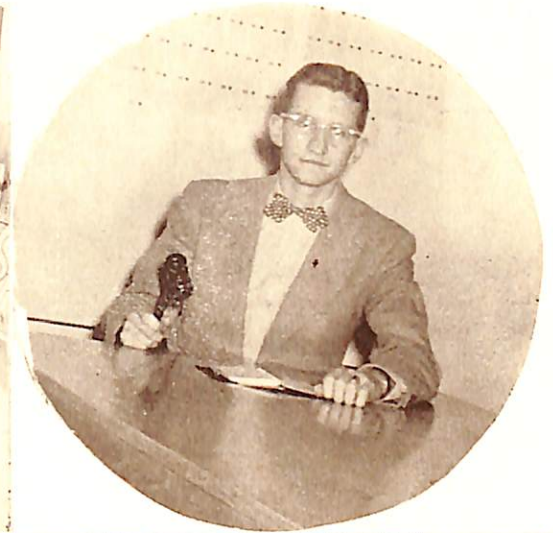

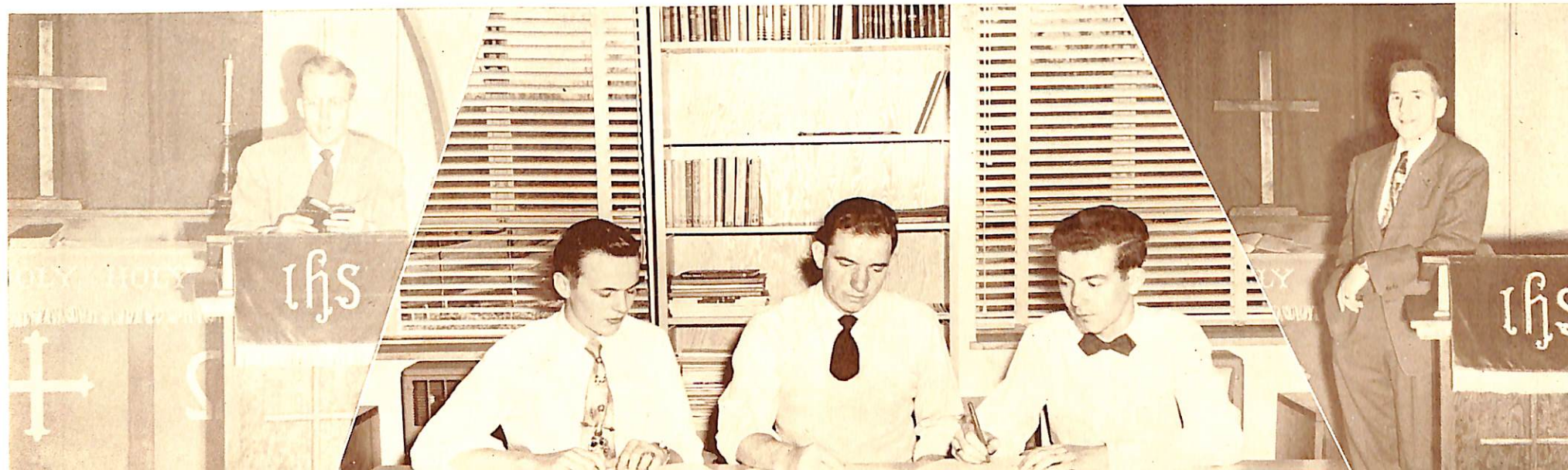

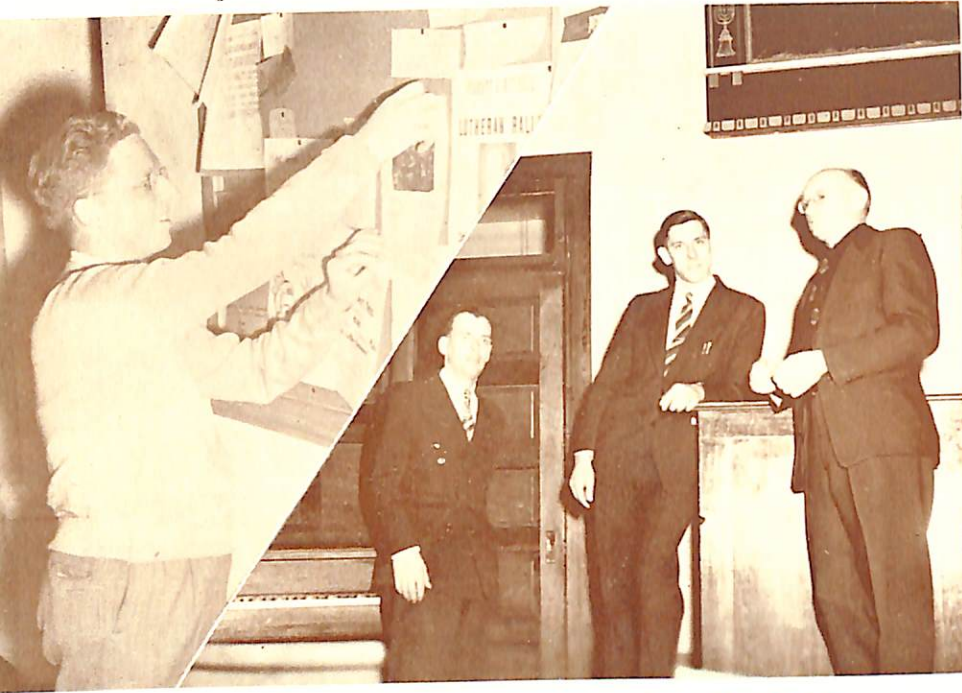

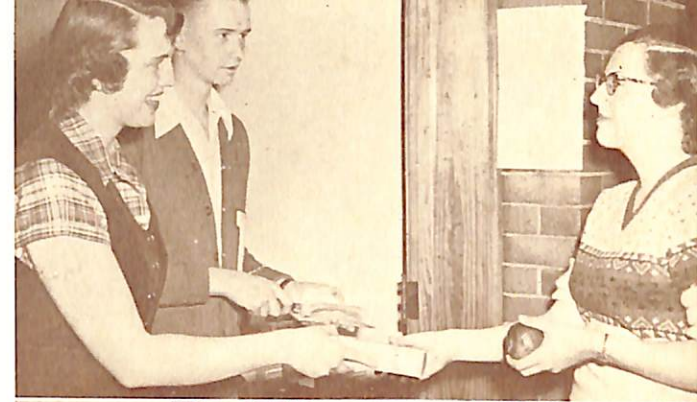

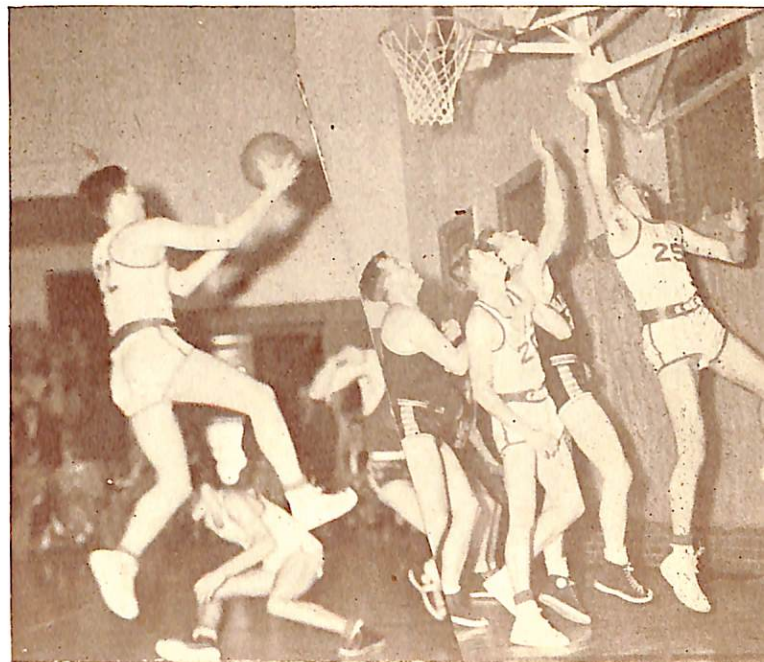

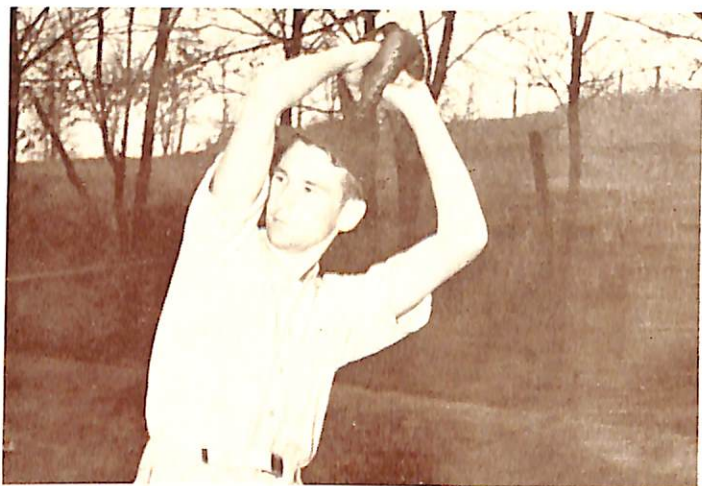

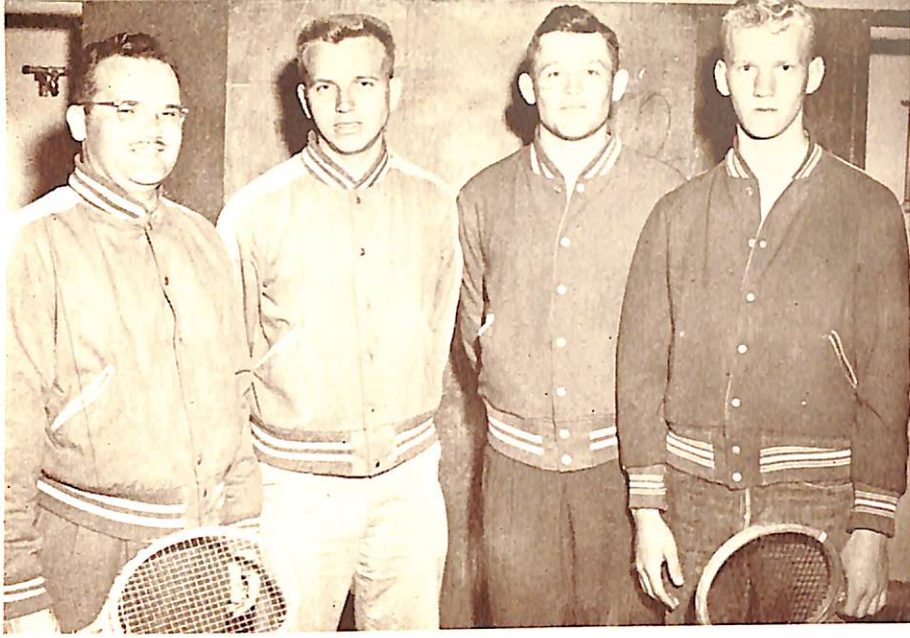

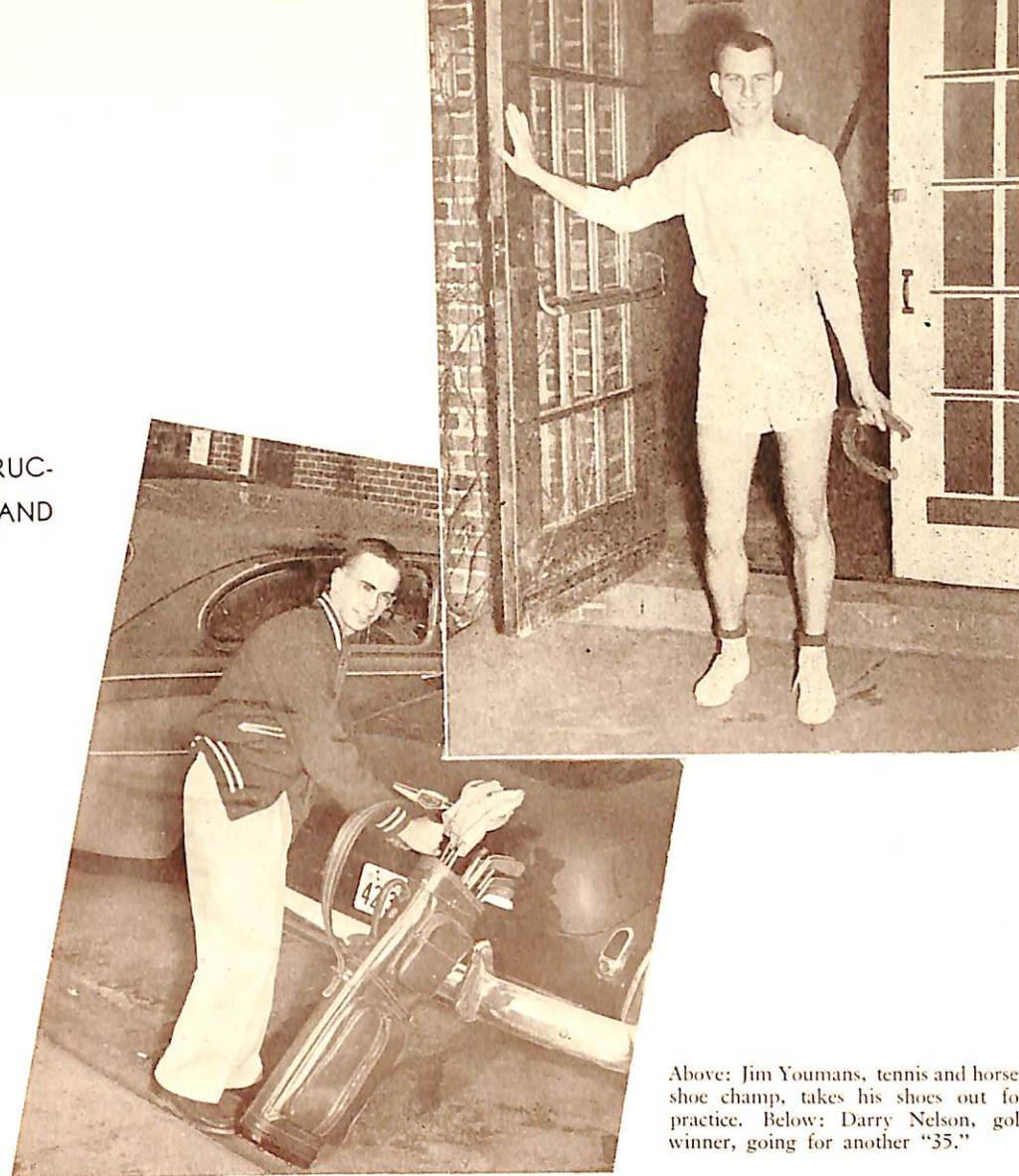

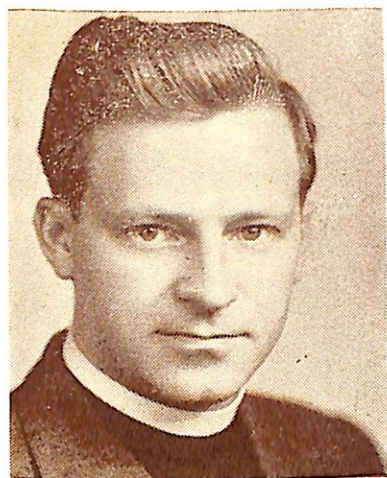

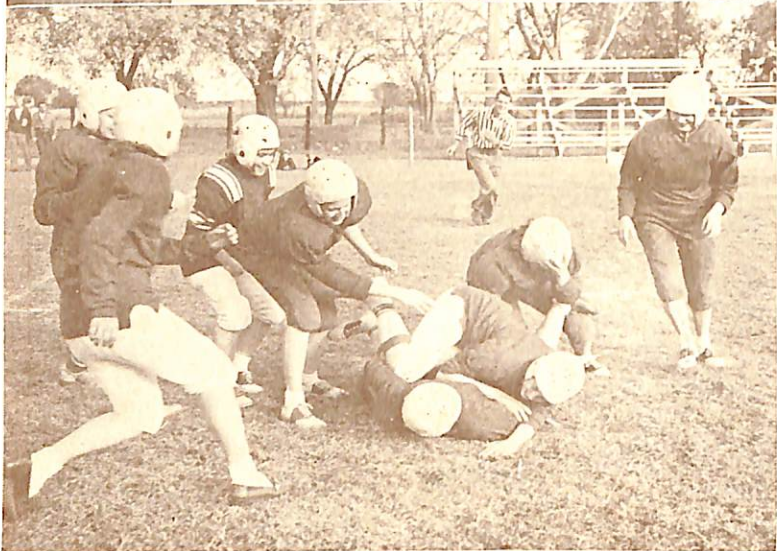
