'Twas given you by other hands, you know,

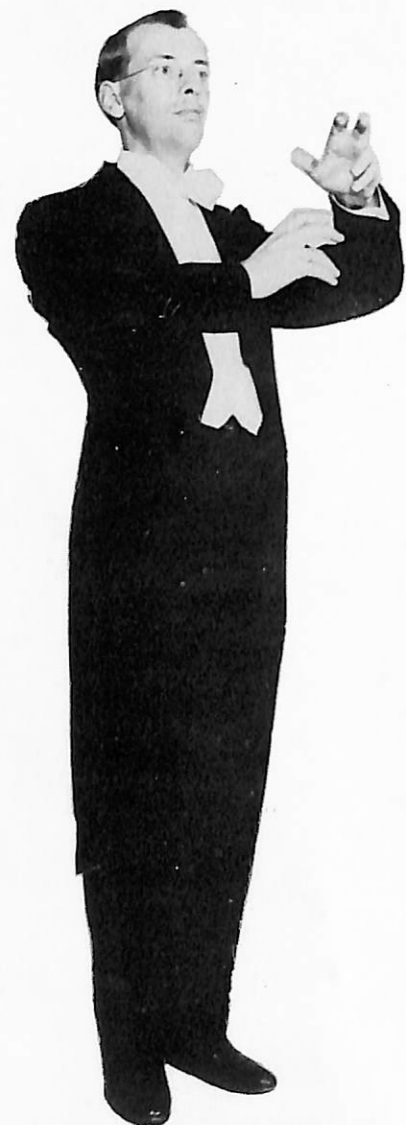

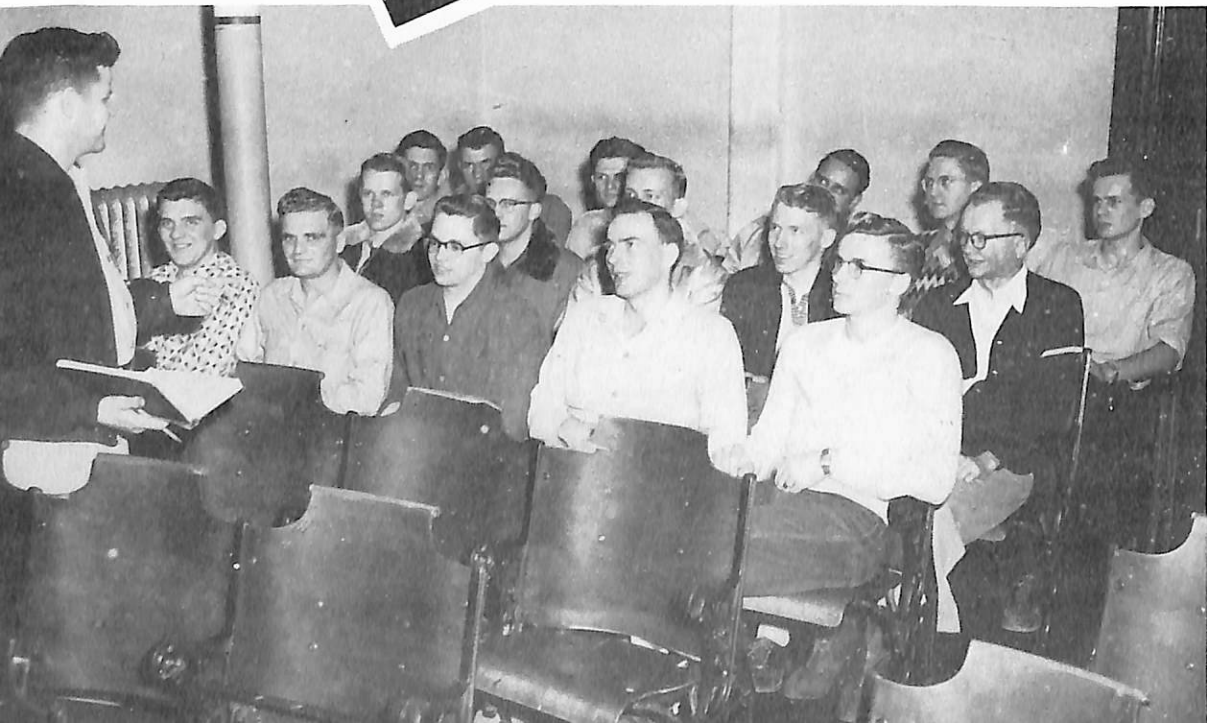

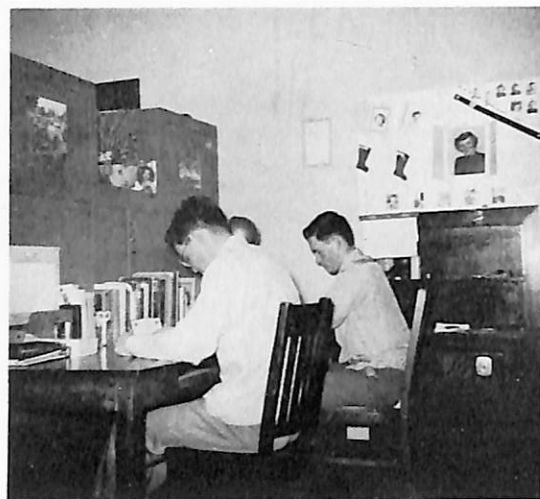

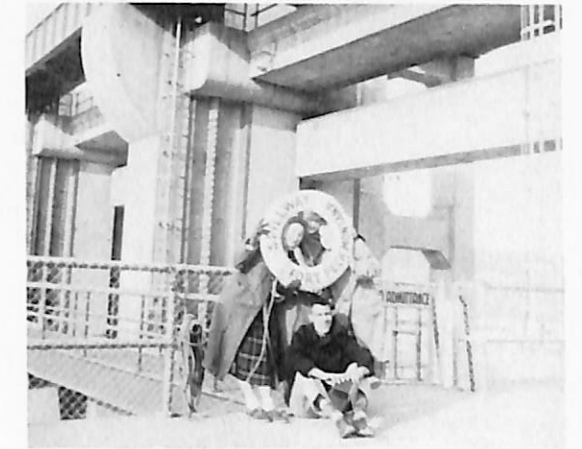

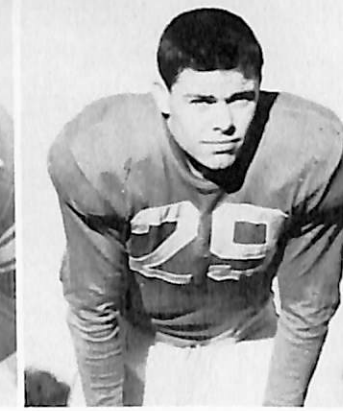

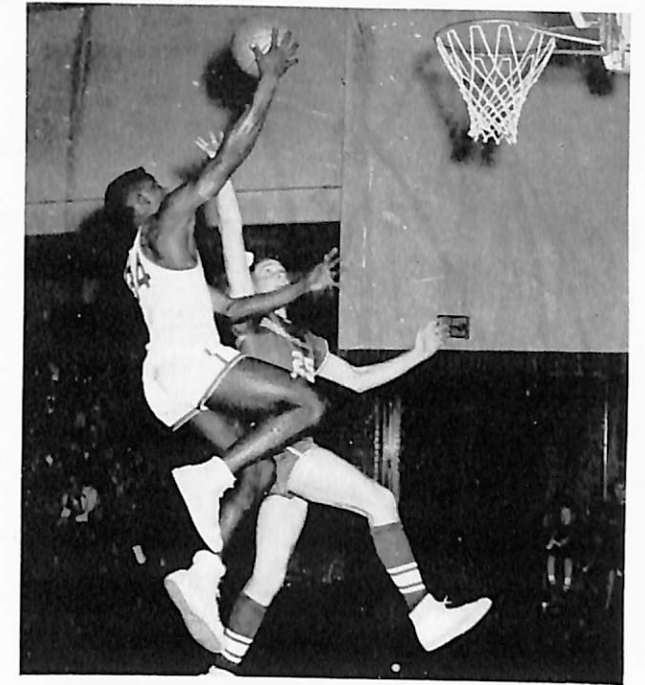

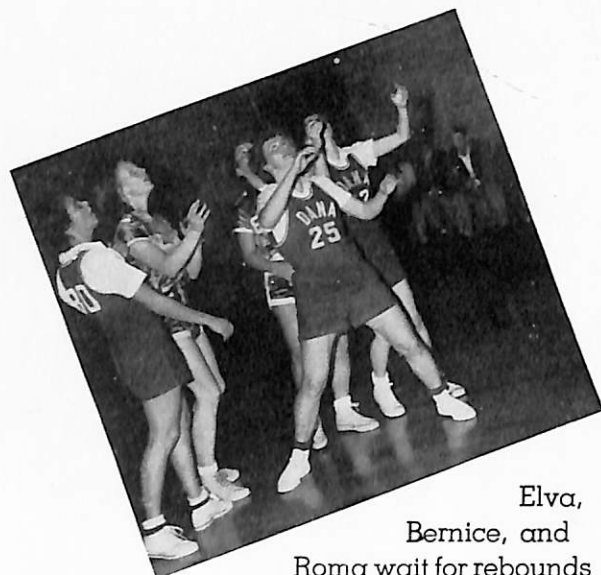

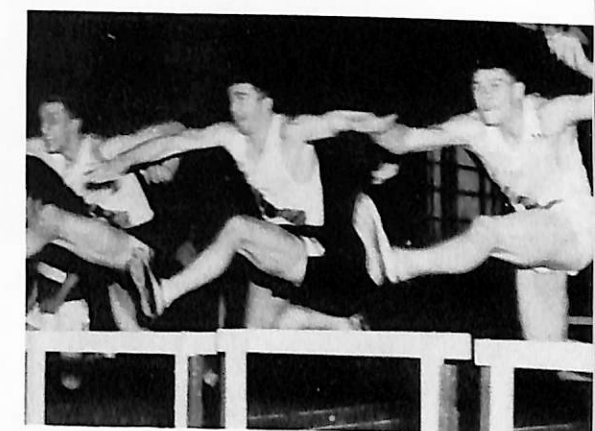

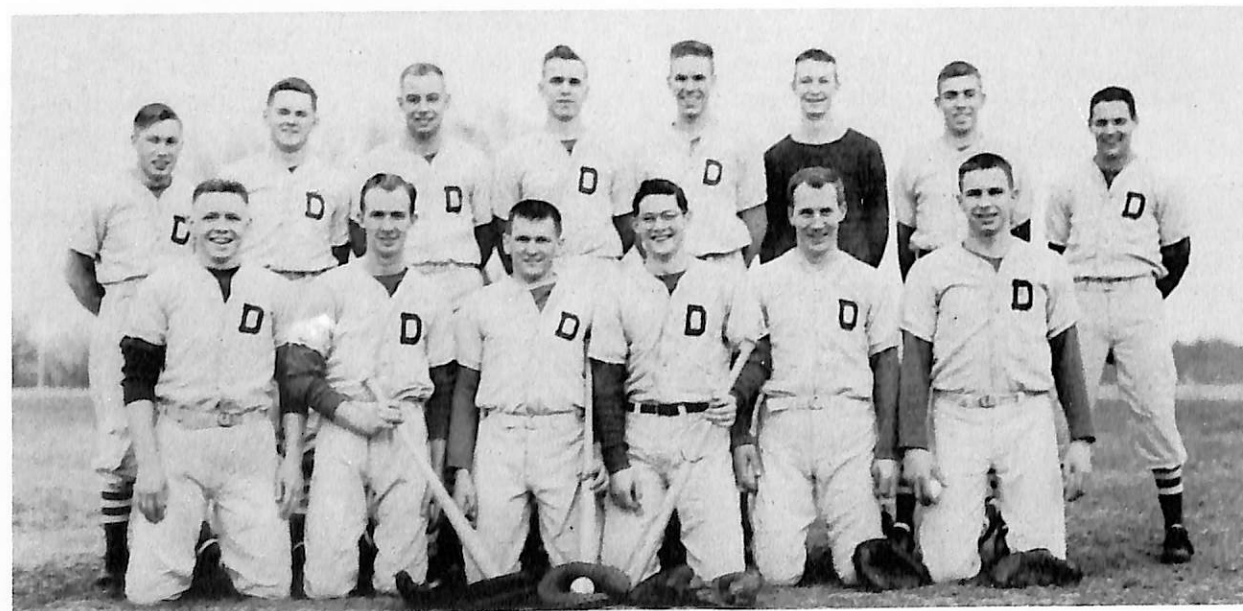

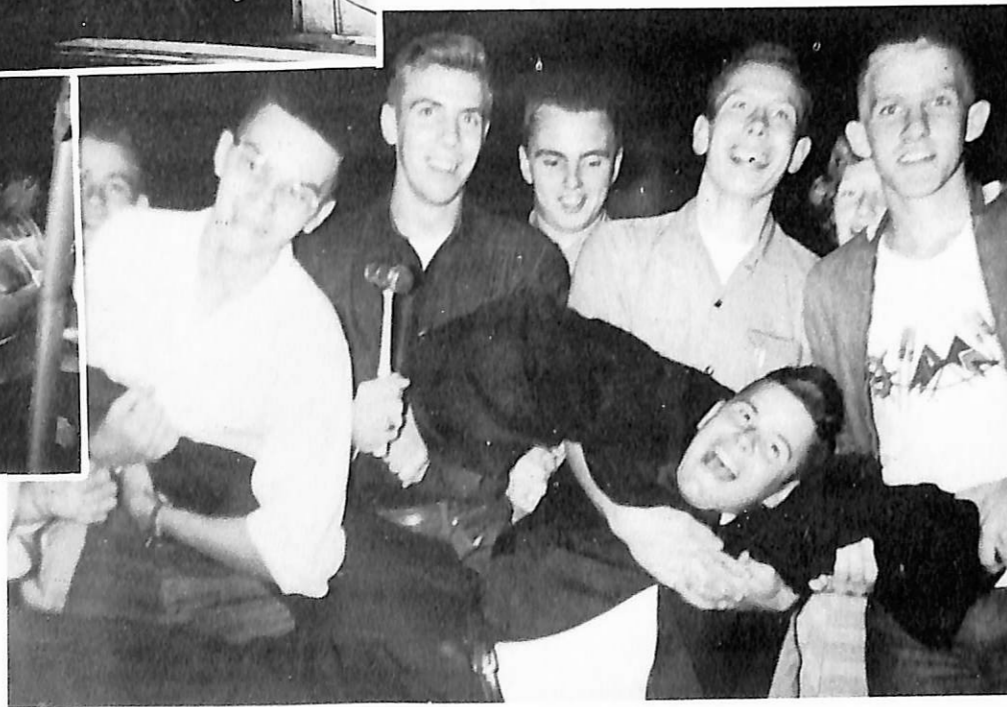

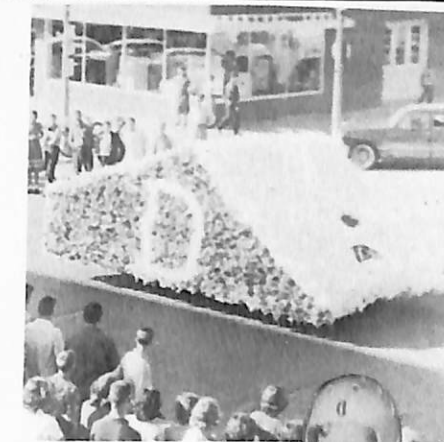

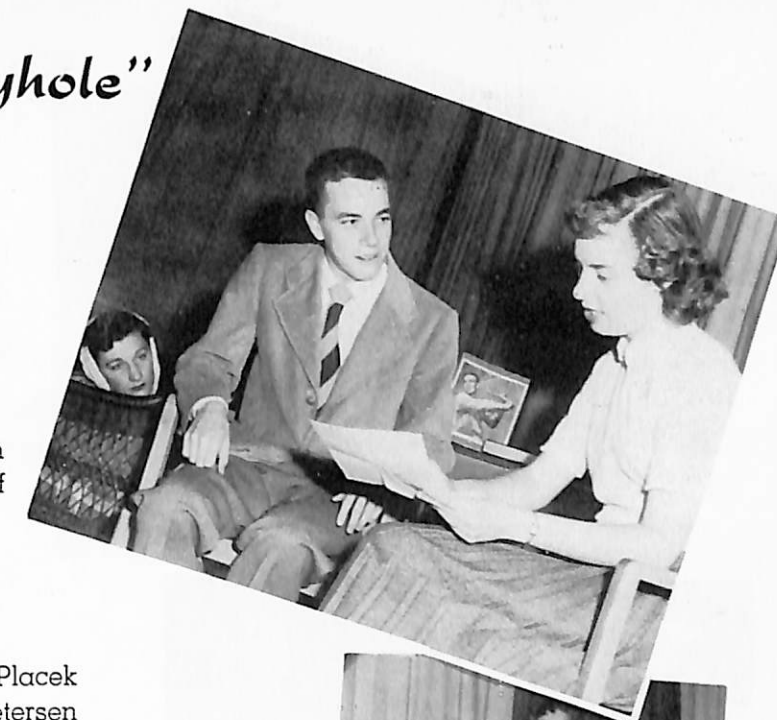

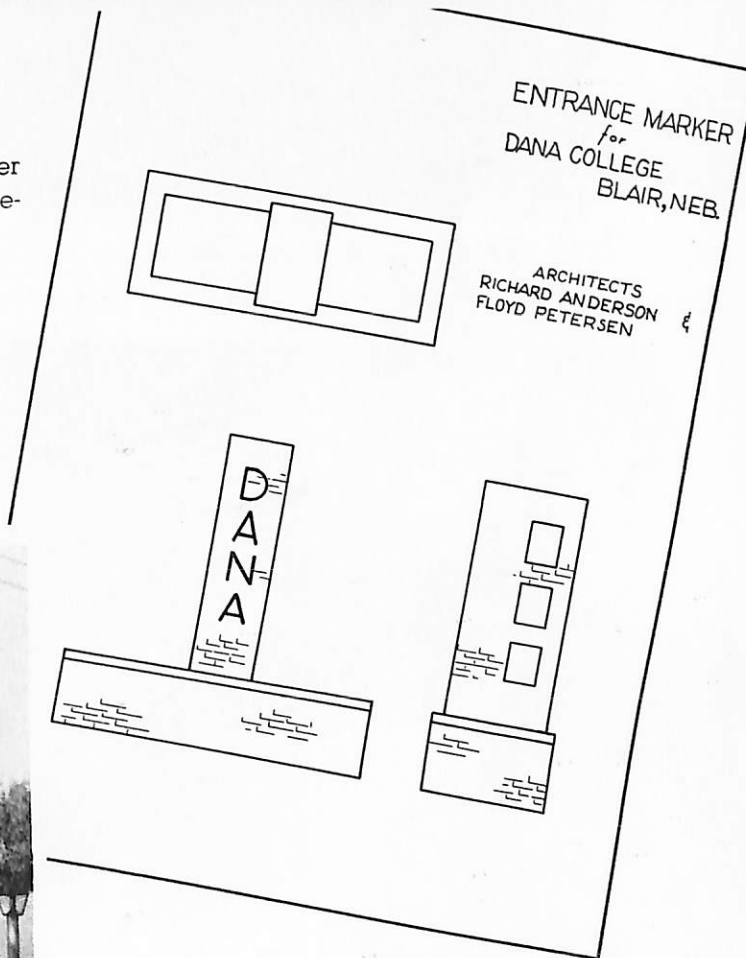

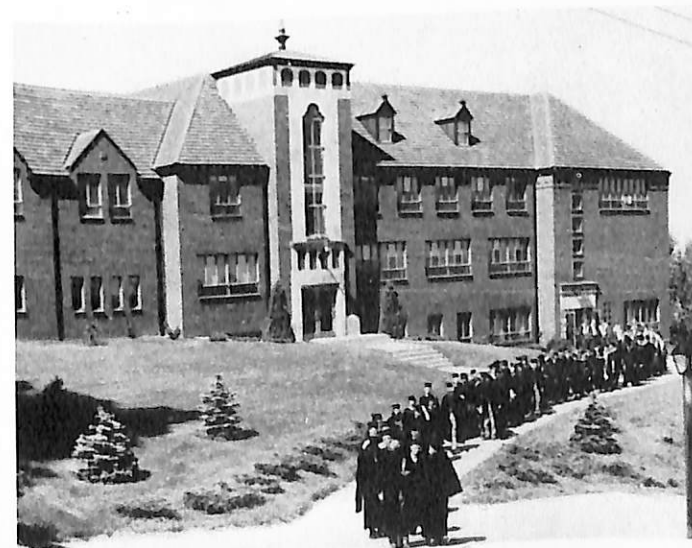

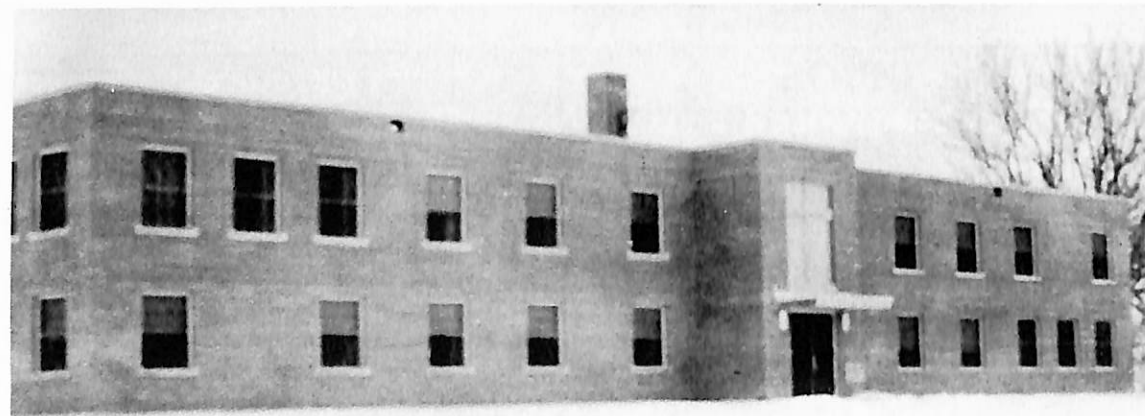
