

Foreword







Dana Development



The expansion program itself includes the construction of a new dormitory for women, of a new physical education building and gymnasium, of a football field and track, and the improvement and renovation of the campus as a whole. Members of the U.E.L.C., citizens of Blair, people of Danish descent, alumni, and other friends of Dana were asked to contribute to the program. Student and faculty members alike were involved in the work of organizing and soliciting the student body, faculty, and staff, with the hope that the "Greater Dana" program may be completed by 1960.





Board Of Trustees



The Hermes



The Dana gridders of 1957, under new head football coach Bruce Rolloff, completed a successful season by bringing home the Central Church College Conference championship and placing five members on the all-conference team. Three other team members received honorable mention. Receiving all-conference honors were Ed Ellis, end; Marv Olson, tackle; Jim Heiser, guard; Jack Linahan, center; and Les Pederson, back. Honorable mention honors went to Jan Philby and Jerry McCallum, backs, and Ray Killion, tackle. The Vikings thus make a successful exit from the CCCC into the larger and stronger Nebraska College Conference.

Les Pederson led the '57 Vikings in scoring with 24 points. Ed Ellis and Jerry McCallum each had twelve, Jack Madsen, Tom Leehy, and Bill Chrisman each had six, and Hack Philby scored four. Dana scored 70 points to her opponents 80. In total offense, Dana outgained the opposition 1688 yards to 1498 yards.

In rushing, Les Pederson led with a 6.3 yds.-per-try by gaining 537 yards in 85 carries. Jerry McCallum caught seven passes for 175 yards and one touchdown, while Ed Ellis snagged twelve for 174 yards and two TD's.

Congratulations for a job well done to the team of 1957 and to their coaches, Bruce Rolloff and Paul Peterson!

And so Dana leaves the CCC Conference as undisputed champions. We sincerely believe that the Vikings can and will prove themselves equal to the occasion in the rougher and tougher competition of the NCC. Good luck, Dana Vikings of 1958!


Three candidates completed the season and earned their letters. They were Bill Cornwell, Luther Kloth, and Lyle Rasmussen.

The Vikings, entering the Nebraska College Conference for the first time, found that the caliber of basketball being played was high, and that the going was rough. The loop consists of Chadron, Kearney, Hastings, Wayne, Doane, Concordia, Peru, Nebraska Wesleyan, Midland, and Dana.

Led by captain Bill Davis the Dana squad opened their season on a bright note with a 62-53 non-conference win over Tarkio, Missouri. The honeymoon was short-lived, however, as they went into conference play and suffered successive losses to Wayne, Concordia, Hastings, Peru, and Nebraska Wesleyan. The Vikings refused to let these losses dampen their spirit, and consequently, on January 18 they clipped a respected Doane College five for their first N.C.C. win of the year. The score was 65-60.

The sledding again became rough and the Vikings dropped a slow game to Concordia, followed by "double-header" losses to Chadron Teachers in the western Nebraska city, However, they found the home court friendlier and the non-conference competition easier by returning home to whip Westmar, 77-71 in a thrilling overtime battle.

With the addition of Mark Thompson, a second semester enrollee, Dana appeared to have new life and scored a repeat win over Doane, 75-72. A strong Peru team again set them back on their heels, however. This was soon forgotten, though, when the team, putting together a terrific effort, rolled over arch-rival Midland to the tune of 81 to 64. This, however, was to be the last time the Vikings were to taste victory for the season. Although putting out some good efforts, they could not pull out another win.

There were two seniors on Dana's squad: Bob Larson and Bill Davis. Davis scored 1208 points in his college career to break the previous four-year record of 1091 points held by Bob Jensen.








Ron Huston goes in for a lay-up as an unidentified Midland player attempts to block it. The Vikings won 81-64.

Sports being sponsored this year were football and basketball for boys and bowling and softball for both boys






