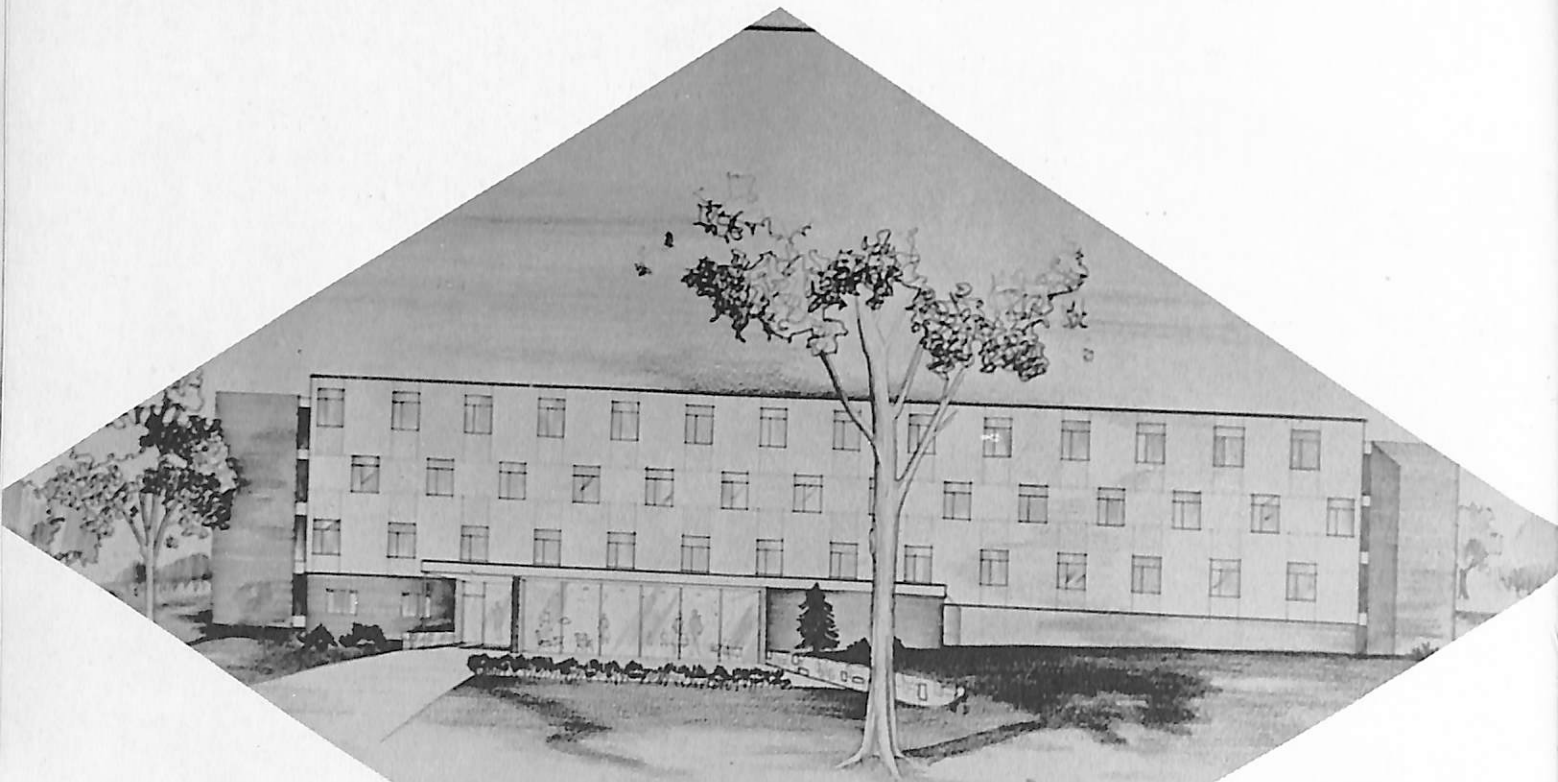

Whatever your tie may be, may this Danian serve to replenish and refresh your most treasured memories of this past year on College Hill.

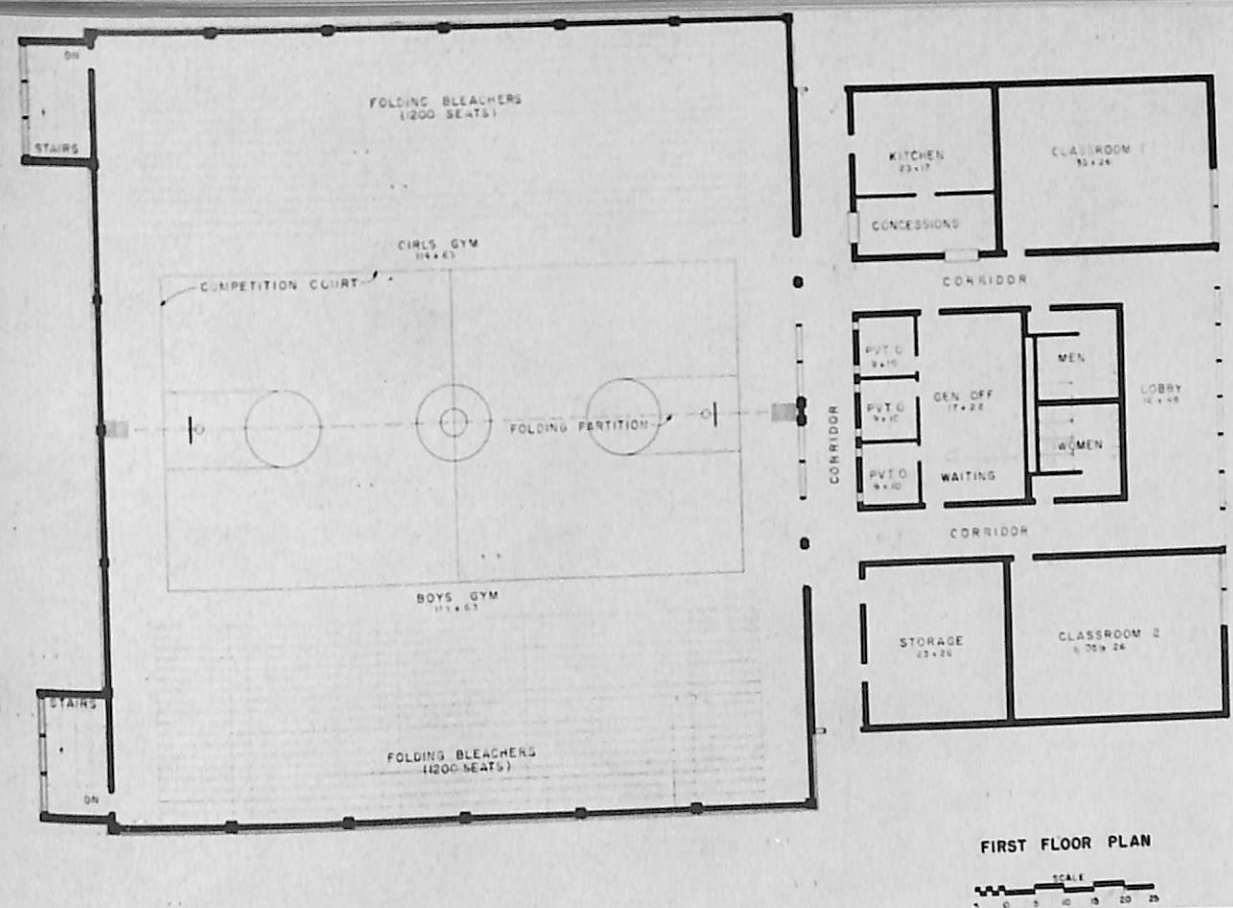




PROPOSED WOMENS DORMITORY

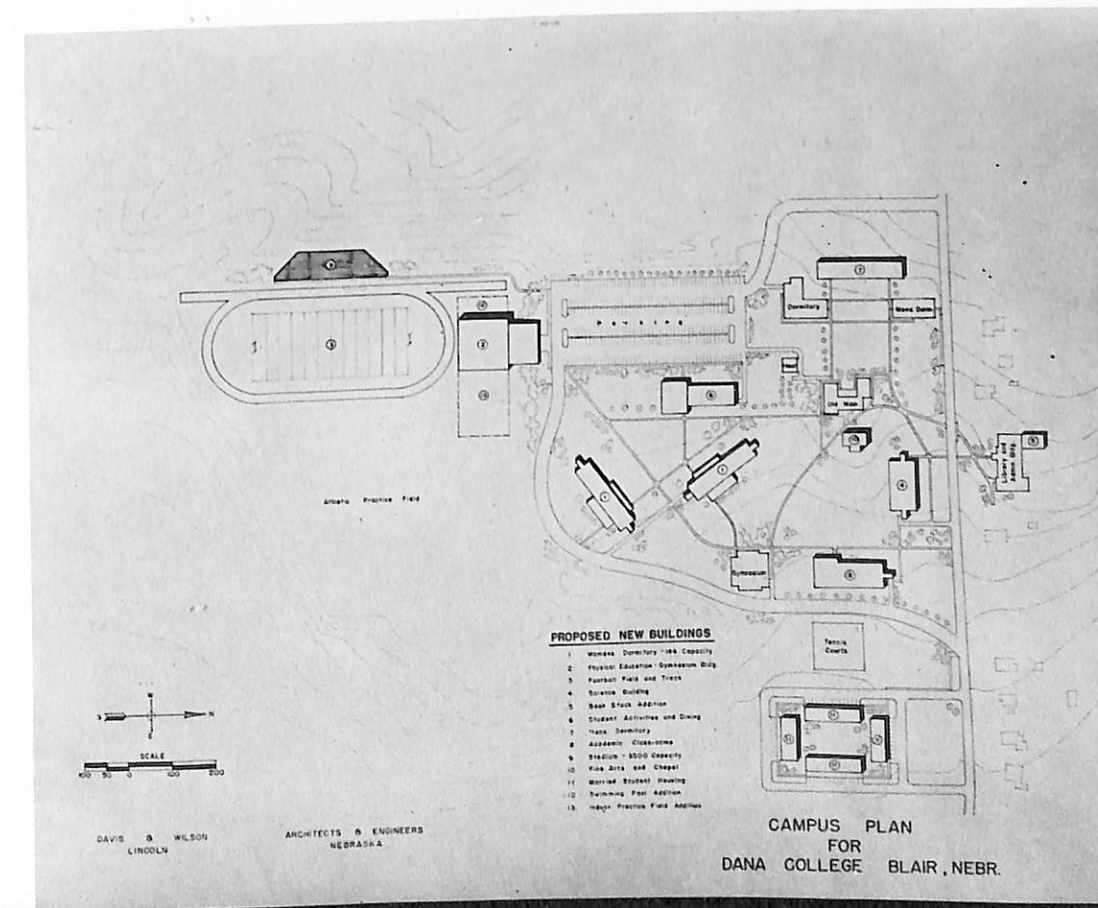
DANA'S DIAMOND JUBILEE

The long-range plans for Dana's campus.



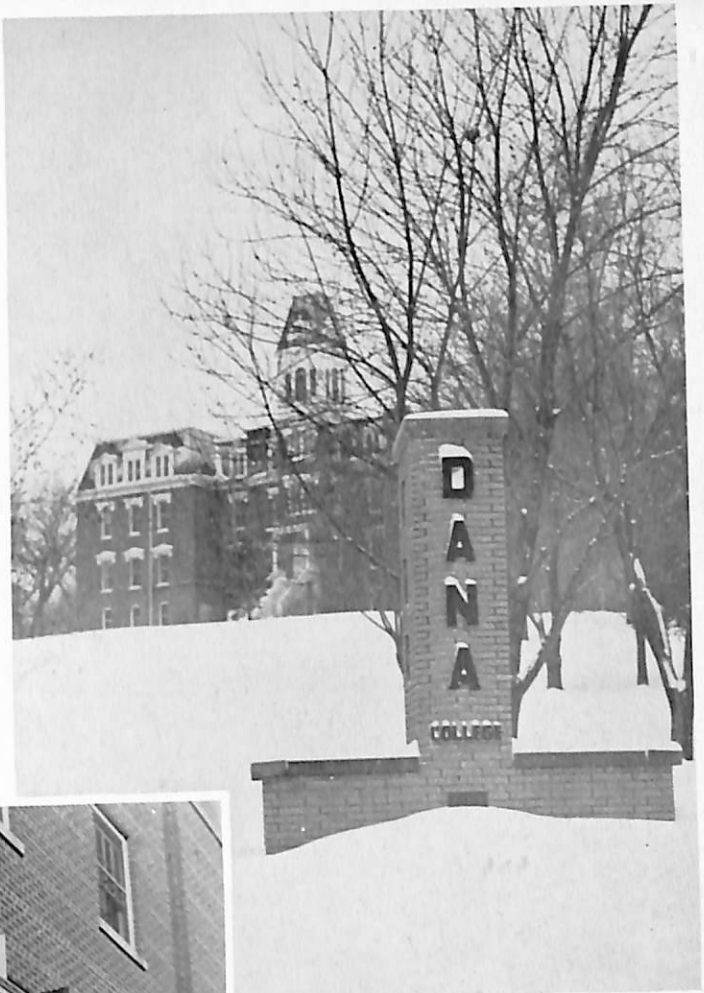


THE OLD QUADRANGLE ELM

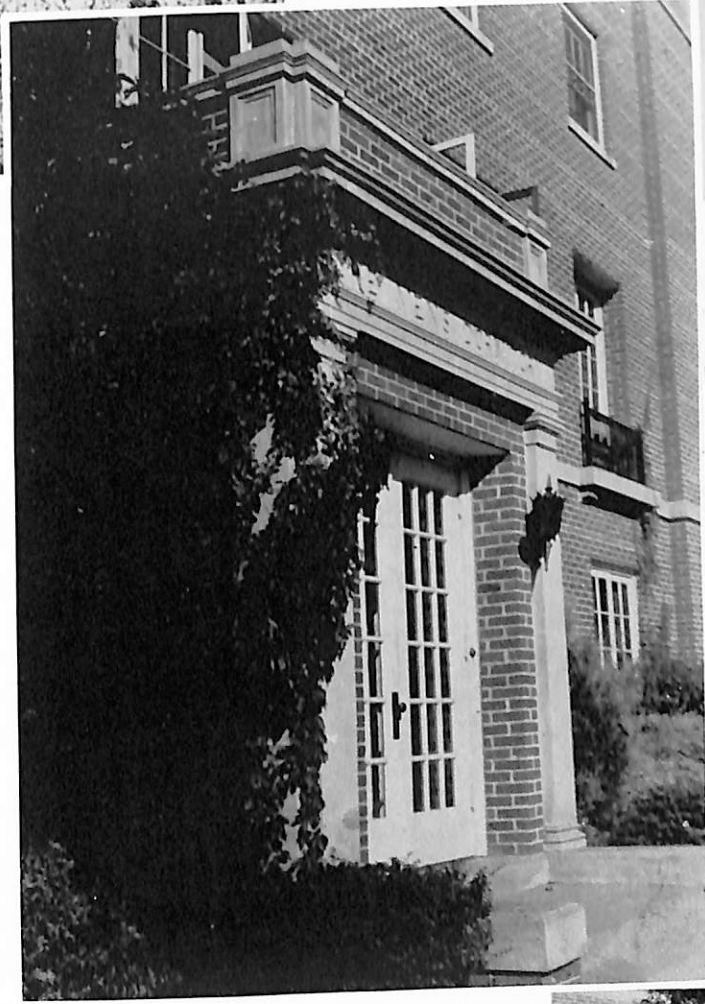

BASKETBALL

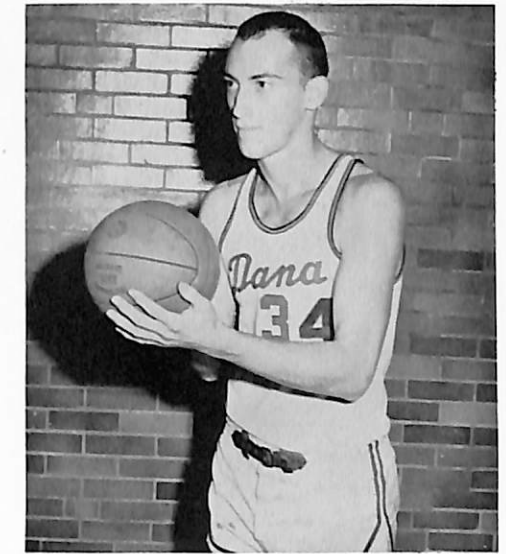

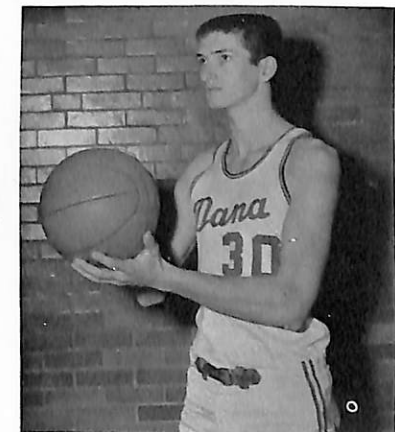
Junior, DON JOERN — Was a fine team player and a good rebounder. His speed and good defensive play were strong attributes in this 6'2" Junior's ability.

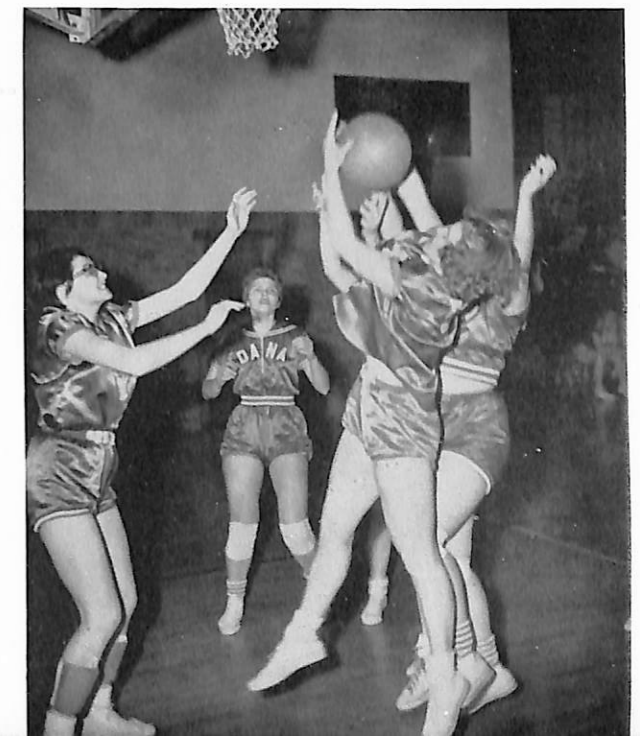
GIRLS' BASKETBALL

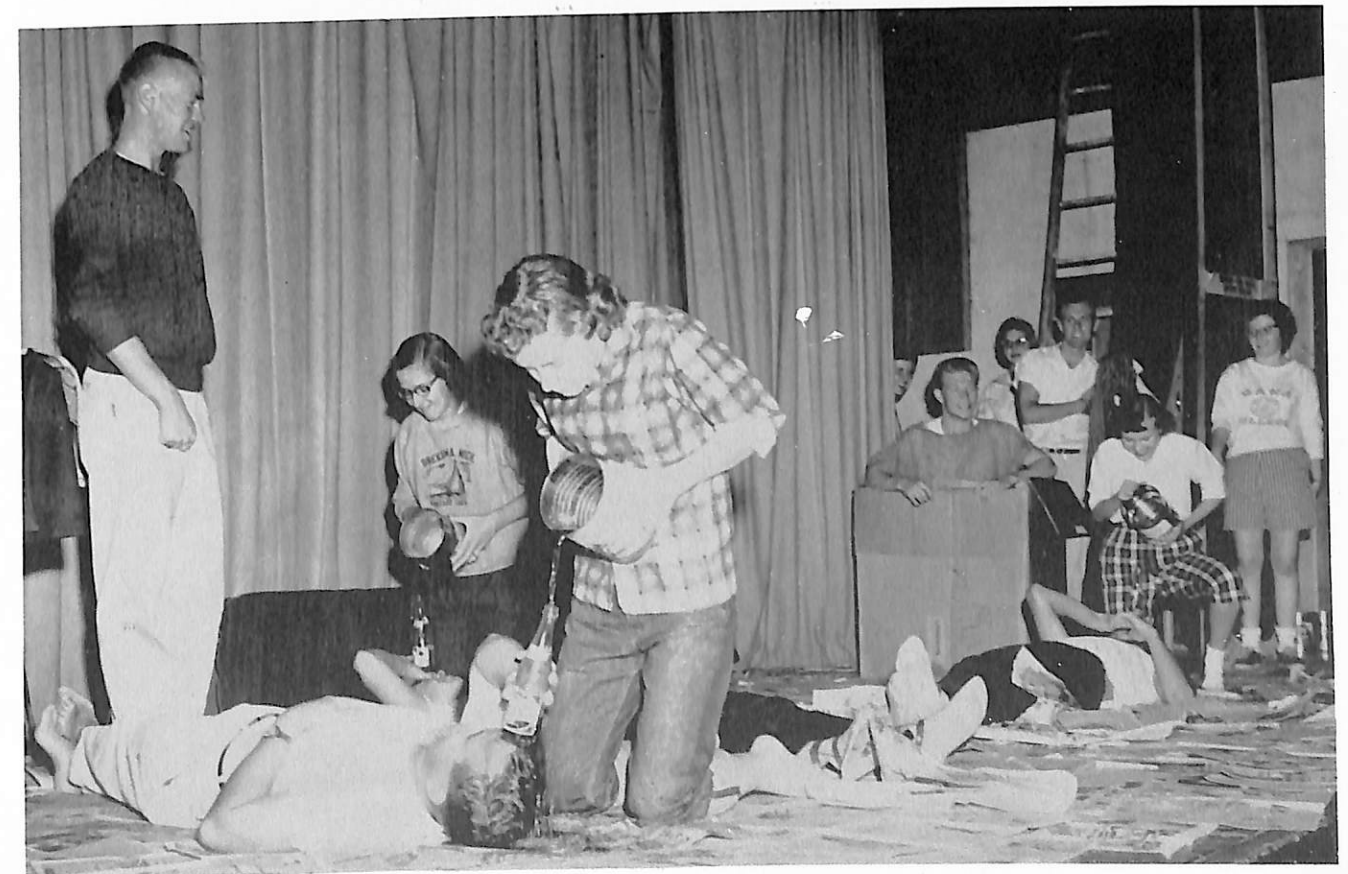

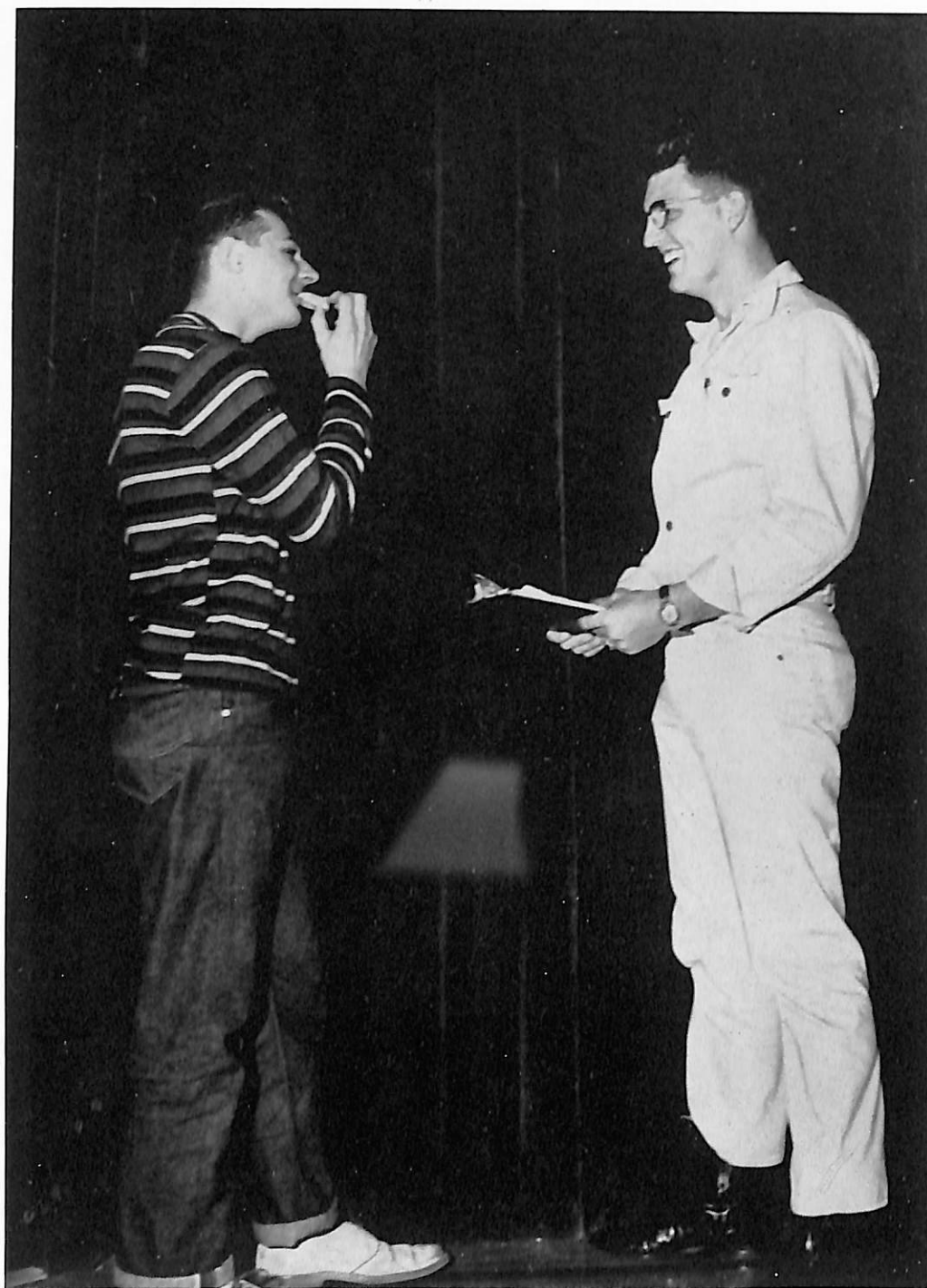

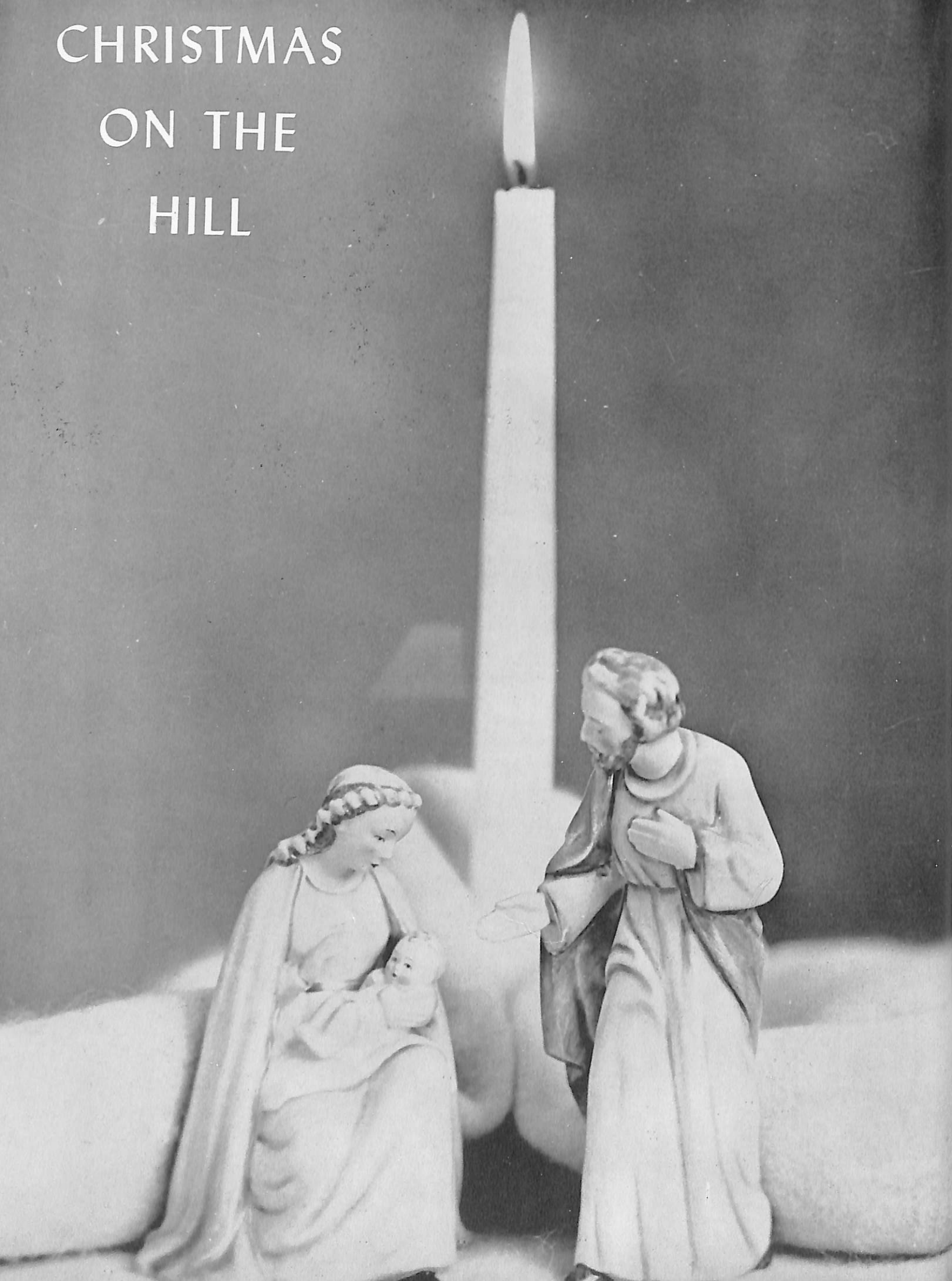
